General Information

Share what your organization has accomplished over the last year with an educational exhibit. Exhibits are to be entered in the Vegetable Barn; some may be placed in the gym if space does not allow. Exhibits should be no wider than 48 inches, or the size of a standard tri-board. Additional props (flyers, handouts, examples of project work, etc.) are welcome as part of the exhibit as long as they are contained within the size limits. Exhibits should be informational; observers should learn something from your display. Exhibits judged on Danish System of Blue, Red and White awards.

Class:

1. Educational Exhibits by 4-H or FFA sponsored Youth Organizations in Highland County (4-H Community Clubs, In-School 4-H, 4-H Enrichment, 4-H Camping, FFA Chapters, FFA Contests/Winners etc.)
2. Educational Exhibits by non-4-H/FFA sponsored Youth Organizations in Highland County (Girl Scouts, Boy Scouts, Radio Club, Youth Philanthropy Council, etc.)
3. Educational Exhibits by Churches and Church Groups in Highland County (outreach, youth groups, church mission, food pantries, vacation bible school, etc.)
4. Educational Exhibits by any other club, school class, or organization in Highland County (Homemakers, Garden Club, Quilt Guild, Golden Oldies, Class of 2018, carpentry class projects, science energy demo, etc.)
