Many thanks to all who participated in recognition of our Italian Heritage this past October. After we laid a wreath at the foot of the Columbus Statue, those attending withdrew into the Center for presentations and lunch. I'd like to thank John Mazzetti for speaking about how the Columbus statue came to be. John described how he participated on a committee to celebrate the 500th Anniversary of Christopher Columbus which undertook the building and dedicating of our landmark statue in Columbus' honor. It was interesting to learn, that this committee which was chaired by Dom Letterii also included Lenny Spinelli, Berto Vecchiarelli and John Mazzetti all long-term active current members. Notable is that although the 10-foot statue cost \$42,000 to build, the committee raised over \$70,000 to construct the statue and landscape the surrounding area.

We were honored to receive the Proclamation declaring October 2019 as Italian Heritage Month from both the Dutchess County Executive Marc Molinaro and City of Poughkeepsie Mayor Rollison. In effect, these Proclamations recognize the contributions that Italian Americans have made to America and that the Italian Center is dedicated to promoting, preserving and celebrating our Italian culture and traditions in our community.

Italian Heritage Ceremony - October 5th

Prior to the ceremony the audience gathered in the lounge of the Italian Center on the morning of Saturday, October 5th. When all the honored guest arrived Toni Perry, President of the Ladies Auxiliary asked the guests to proceed to the Columbus Statue in the front of the Italian Center.

The chairperson for the event Rosemarie Calista thanked everyone for coming to the ceremony and turned the program over to Toni Perry who along with Franco Giangrasso, President of the Italian Center placed a commemorative wreath on the base of the statue.

Franco welcomed the guests and dignitaries in attendance. He then introduced the Mayor of the City of Poughkeepsie, the Honorable Robert G. Rolison. Prior to presenting his Proclamation for the City in honor of "Italian Heritage Month" Mayor Rolison made some warm and memorable remarks about the history of our Italian community and how the Italian Center has added stability to the downtown area of the city.

Mayor Rolison then read the Proclamation from the City of Poughkeepsie.



Following the reading of the Proclamation and the remarks made by the Mayor, Franco Giangrasso introduced County Legislator Joseph Incoranato, representing County Executive Molinaro who read the following proclamation signed by the Dutchess County Executive.

County Legislator Incoranato then made the following remarks:

County Executive Molinaro's Proclamation certainly reminds us and reaffirms that this is a special time for our nation to honor and recall the achievements, contributions and culture of Italian immigrants and their descendants.

Both of the Proclamations can be viewed in the Proclamations section of this newsletter.

His special message not only acknowledges the great Genoese navigator's fantastic accomplishments, but also commemorates the immigration of more than 5 million Sicilian and other southern Italians during the half-century from 1880 through 1930.

My own parents immigrated from the Naples area in the 1920's, settling on Manhattan's East Harlem neighborhood. Where like some of you and our relatives, they hoped, labored and struggled to achieve the American Dream for themselves and the next generation.

Many first-generation Italian-Americans fought and served with honor and distinction in America's armed forces during World War II. In fact, we represented the largest ethnic group opposing our enemies at the time. We also take great pride in the fact that we of Italian ancestry are well represented as leaders in our communities, as entrepreneurs, in finance, in entertainment, as pioneers of industry....and especially in the arts.

For example, a little-known historical fact is that the chief carver directing the incredibly complex Mount Rushmore project was an Italian immigrant Luigi Del Bianco.

Between 1927 to 1941, he directed some 400 workers who were building an amazing presidential memorial that people from across the nation and around the world would come to see and admire.

Those who attended the Columbus Day luncheon two years ago may recall that his grandson, Lou Del Bianco was our invited guest. After lunch, he told us the absorbing story of his grandfather's vital role in overseeing and personally sculpting the intricate carving to the four presidents.

Indeed, this holiday should especially remind those of Italian ancestry to be justifiably proud of our heritage and its significant contributions to the vitality, progress and leadership of our nation.

As President Reagan remarked in one of his speeches, Columbus Day has become a day, "to celebrate not only a fearless searcher, but the dreams and opportunities that brought so many here after him".

And so today, we join the rest of our nation in continuing to recognize and honor this explorer's magnificent accomplishment now –and for centuries yet to come.

Franco Giangrasso the President of the Italian Center and Toni Ann Perry, president of the Ladies Auxiliary thanked both Mayor Rolison and County Legislator Incoranato for participating in the ceremony. They then invited everyone in attendance to join them in

a complementary luncheon and program, hosted by the Italian Center in honor of Italian Heritage Month.

The speaker for the event Mr. Lou Gallo who is a professor of History and a member of the Sons and Daughters of Italy Grand Lodge of New York, Commission of Social Justice. Mr. Gallo was dressed in 15th Century clothing and spoke in the "1st person" as if he was Columbus dispelling the myths that have been spread about Christopher Columbus throughout the years.



Lou's presentation was simply outstanding, most informative and dispelled many of the untruths about Christopher Columbus his explorations, discoveries, him committing genocide and being a racist.

2019 Bacile Scholarship Awards



Want a Bit of Good Italian Style Serious Silliness - Gianni Rodari (Submitted by Tony Daniele)

Giovanni "Gianni" Rodari (23 October 1920 – 14 April 1980) was born in born in Omegna, a small town on Lake Orta in the province of Novara in northern Italy. His father died when he was young and his mother raised him in a small Varese village (her home before marriage). Maybe some of you know the area?

A smart boy he went into the seminary to get a proper education (wasn't that the way – I know it was for my family). He didn't come out a cleric (not the first to take the education and run) but did develop into an award winning Italian writer and journalist. Not Sicilian by long shot but I don't hold that against him (3).

He wrote what can be called children's books but like Lewis Carroll he was making adult social commentary through them. His <u>Il romanzo di Cipollino</u> a prime example. For his lasting contribution as a children's writer he received the biennial <u>Hans Christian Andersen Medal</u> in 1970 and many consider him Italy's most important twentieth-century children's author.

He has given me many giggles and a few profound thoughts through the years. I've only read him in Italian and if my wife and kids are any judge his stories may, as my nonna used to say, "lose in the translation". But probably that's my failing as a translating storyteller and I am sure his works properly translated into English work well because his books have been translated into many languages with much success. Sadly, few have been published in English. My GUESS is that his works being very successful in Soviet Union made them somewhat untouchable in USA/England at the time (mid-1900s).

Bottom line: if you cannot read him in Italian (preferred) get his work in English because they are amusing windows into the Italian mindset and culture of mid-20th Century.

I close offering a couple Rodari works I thought were genius that are easy reads: <u>Novelle fatte a macchina</u> and <u>Favole al telefono</u>. You know you are into satira italiana pieno d'umorismo when you read a story that starts with "Un coccodrillo si presenta alla sede della RAI-TV, viale Mazzini 14, Roma, e chiede di essere ricevuto dal direttore del programma <u>Rischiatutto</u> [condotto da <u>Mike Bongiorno</u>] .." Impossibile a non ridere - almeno un po' – provateci! I believe <u>Telephone Tales</u> (a good start) in English will be out in December 2019 and <u>Amazon</u> is taking orders.


