Dear Friends,

On Sunday, August 28, during worship we will be inviting all of our children and young people to come forward to God's Holy Altar in order to receive a blessing, as they prepare to begin another year of school. Part of our work in nurturing our children's faith development is to invite them to receive the gifts that God delights in giving them through the Church's ministry. While God will certainly be present for these young people through His Holy Spirit – apart from our prayers and blessing – this special blessing offered at the altar shows the presence of the gifts of God to them in a very personal way. As we prepare for this very important annual observance in the life of our congregation, I invite you to be in prayer for our young people – and for all students who will again enter our nation's schools. It is also an important time to pray for teachers, administrators, and all support staff. Redeemed by Jesus' blood, and freed from our sins, we are free to be concerned for others and to carry before our loving Father the needs of the world. Please take time this Sunday – and each Sunday - to tell our students individually that you will be praying for them. You may be surprised by how important your support is to them.

Beginning on Sunday, September 11, we will be offering Sunday School for all ages again! The adult Bible Class will be held in one of the upstairs classrooms of the school, the grades 6-8 class will meet in the Conference Room, grades first through fifth and their parents/guardians will meet in the Fellowship Hall, and the preschool/kindergarten class with parents/guardians will meet in the nursery. Some families may have children in both the preschool and elementary school classes and so we will be assisting parents/guardians in dividing their time between the two classrooms if they wish. All students preschool through adult will be studying the same Bible lesson in age-appropriate ways. This means that everyone studies the same passage each week. Additionally, each week—with the exception of important church festivals (All Saints', Christmas, Easter, etc.) - I will be preaching on the passage that we will be studying in Sunday School. In the Fall, we will explore Old Testament lessons and in the Winter/Spring we will be studying New Testament lessons. I am convinced that simplicity, focus, and reinforcement are needed if we are to effectively teach the Christian faith in today's world. Everyone should know what we are studying and our learning needs to be reinforced in a variety of ways. Please pray for us as we plan and promote our Sun-

day school program.

I am delighted to report that Bill Cunningham, our Director of Music, and I will be starting a Young Peoples' Choir this Fall. It will be for members and their friends ages 7-14. Rehearsals will be held on Wednesdays, beginning October 5, from 6:00 to 6:45 pm. The choir will offer an anthem during worship on one Sunday per month. I will offer a short devotion at the beginning of each rehearsal and then assist Bill. Participants will receive basic music instruction, learn how to read music, and have the opportunity to present music for friends and family. The students will begin with Thanksgiving and Christmas selections and then learn other seasonal music throughout the school year. We are both very excited about working with our young people here at St. John's. For more information, please speak with either Bill or me. One does not need to be a member of St. John's in order to participate, and so please invite your friends to attend!

#### Faithful to the End

The world is watching with excitement the 2016 Olympic Games. In the 1968 Olympic Games in Mexico, John Stephen Ahkwari of Tanzania was excited. He was about to run the marathon with runners from around the world. The starter's pistol fired and the race began. A little over 2 hours later, the first runner crossed the finish line. Other runners finished the race shortly afterwards, but John was not among them. Over an hour after the winner had crossed the finish line, with only a few spectators remaining in the stands, John Stephen Ahkwari finally entered the stadium. At the 19 km point of the 42 km race, he had been bumped by another runner and had fallen hard on the pavement - badly wounding his knee and dislocating his knee and shoulder. Bandaged and bloody, John finally crossed the finish line. Bud Greenspan, the renowned sports reporter, asked John why he didn't just quit. He answered, "My country did not send me 5000 miles to Mexico City to start the race. They sent me 5000 miles to finish the race." John Stephen Ahkwari did not receive a prize or a medal, but he did endure. He didn't just start the race, he finished it. God did not call us just to start the Christian race; he called us to finish it!

#### **Checking Our Presets**

I was thinking about all the tiffs between people that, seemingly, have no end. Sometimes even finding the origin of the dispute is an exercise in futility. What happens at the human micro-level, of course, plays out between groups of people and extends even to the hostilities shared between nations. It reminds me of a bit of dialogue fashioned a while back by that American master, Samuel Langhorne Clemens, aka Mark Twain. In it he relays a bit of homespun conversation between Huck Finn and Buck Grangerford in his timeless classic, The Adventures of Huckleberry Finn. The gist of it is Huck trying to ascertain how the long-running blood feud between the Grangerfords and the Sheperdsons all started -- and why it keeps going.

Huck begins the conversation: "Did you want to kill him, Buck?" "Well, I bet I did." "What did he do to you?" "Him? He never done nothing to me." "Well, then, what did you want to kill him for?"

"Why, nothing -- only it's on account of the feud." "What's a feud?" "Why, where was you raised? Don't you know what a feud is?" "Never heard of it before -- tell me about it." "Well," says Buck, "a feud is this way: A man has a quarrel with another man, and kills him; then that other man's brother kills him; then the other brothers, on both sides, goes for one another; then the cousins chip in -- and by and by everybody's killed off, and there ain't no more feud. But it's kind of slow, and takes a long time." "Has this one been going on long, Buck?" "Well, I should reckon! It started thirty year ago, or som'ers along there. There was trouble 'bout something, and then a lawsuit to settle it; and the suit went agin one of the men, and so he up and shot the man that won the suit -- which he would naturally do, of course. Anybody would." "What was the trouble about, Buck? -- land?" "I reckon maybe -- I don't know." "Well, who done the shooting? Was it a Grangerford or a Shepherdson?" "Laws, how do I know? It was so long ago." "Don't anybody know?" "Oh, yes, pa knows, I reckon, and some of the other old people; but they don't know now what the row was about in the first place." Hmmm.

While our mental defaults might not be as entrenched -- or trigger-happy -- as that of Buck Grangerford, it's still easy to go through life with a preset frame of mind. As you consider your own positions on various issues, is there anything you can say you inherited from your forebears -- good or bad?
