Los Angeles Hospitality Training Academy (HTA)	<a href="http://www.LAHTA.org">www.LAHTA.org</a>	The Hospitality Training Academy (HTA), through its Santa Monica Jobs Initiative Program, operates a job training and placement program out of Virginia Avenue Park for low-income adults age 18 and above who are residents of Santa Monica's Pico Neighborhood and other designated vulnerable areas of the City, with a focus on those living within the 90404 and 90405 zip codes. Program services, provided at no cost, are designed to pipeline participants into entry-level employment leading to union jobs at hotels, restaurants, and airport concession companies. Services include: resume writing, mock interviewing, work readiness and skills building, job training/coaching, job search and identification, and job placement and retention services. Training workshops offered include, customer service; ServSafe food handlers certification; TiPS safe alcohol service certification; and barista, server, culinary, and room attendant training.
