U.S. SENATE **VOTING RECORD – 115TH CONGRESS, SECOND SESSION (2018)**

Senate Vote 1 - HR 6157: Fiscal Year 2019 Defense, Labor-HHS-Education Appropriations - Passage

August 23, 2018 - Passage of the bill that would provide \$856.9 billion in discretionary funding for Fiscal Year 2019 to various departments and agencies, including \$179.3 billion for the Labor, Health and Human Services and Education departments. Of this, \$90.1 billion would be in discretionary spending for HHS. Eventual enactment of this bill saved most of HHS from the December – January government shutdown (FDA is funded in a separate bill). The bill also included a Continuing Resolution through December 7, 2018, for agencies that had not yet been funded for FY 2019.

Passed 85-7. **NTEU Position: YES**

Senate Vote 2 - HR 6157: Fiscal Year 2019 Defense, Labor-HHS-Education Appropriations - Motion to Waive

August 23, 2018 - Leahy (D-VT) motion to waive all applicable sections of the Congressional Budget Act to allow the Fiscal Year 2019 Defense and Labor-HHS-Education appropriations package to include funding above what was allowed by the budget resolution for fiscal 2018. This enabled passage of the bill, which included funding for most of HHS. Motion agreed to 68-24. **NTEU Position: YES**

Note: A three-fifths majority vote (60) of the total Senate is required to waive the Budget Act.

Senate Vote 3 - HR 6147: Fiscal Year 2019 Interior-Environment, Financial Services, Agriculture, Transportation-HUD Appropriations - Passage

August 1, 2018 - Passage of the bill, as amended, that would provide \$154.2 billion in discretionary funding for Fiscal Year 2019 to various departments and agencies, including \$35.9 billion for the Interior Department, the EPA and related agencies; \$23.7 for the Treasury Department, the Office of Personnel Management and other agencies; and \$23.2 for the Agriculture Department, FDA and related agencies. The legislation also included a 1.9% pay raise for federal employees.

Passed 92-6. **NTEU Position: YES**

Senate Vote 4 - HR 6147: Fiscal Year 2019 Interior-Environment, Financial Services, Agriculture, Transportation-HUD Appropriations - Overall Funding Reduction

July 25, 2018 - Paul (R-KY) amendment that would reduce the funds appropriated in the bill by 11.39 percent, including at many NTEU-represented agencies (the Treasury Department, FDA, USDA, EPA, SEC, FCC, FEC, NPS, and CFTC).

Rejected 25-74. **NTEU Position: NO**

Senate Vote 5 - HR 3: Rescission of Appropriations - Motion to Discharge

June 20, 2018 - Lee (R-UT) motion to discharge the Senate Appropriations and Senate Budget Committees from further consideration of the bill that would cut approximately \$14.7 billion in previously approved spending.

Motion rejected 48-50. **NTEU Position: NO**

Senate Vote 6 - S Con Res 36: Alternate Fiscal Year 2019 Budget Resolution - Motion to Proceed

May 17, 2018 - Paul (R-KY) motion to proceed to the resolution that would repeal the current two-year budget agreement, set a new budget for Fiscal Year 2019 and set new broad spending and revenue targets for the next 10 years. This would significantly reduce agency spending, leading to significant RIFs and furloughs. Motion rejected 21-76. **NTEU Position: NO**

Senate Vote 7 - HR 1625: Fiscal Year 2018 Omnibus Appropriations - Motion to Concur

March 23, 2018 – McConnell (R-KY) motion to concur with the final passage of the bill that would provide roughly \$1.3 trillion in funding for federal government operations and services through Sept. 30, 2018. This measure funded many NTEU-represented agencies and prevented a government shutdown.

Motion agreed to 65-32. **NTEU Position: YES**
