Re: Financial Report for the Period Ended 12-31-18

Attached for your review are the bank statements and financial statements for the General Fund and the Impact Fee Fund for the period ended December 31, 2018. The following is a summary of those reports:

General Fund

As of 12-31-18, total General Fund revenue is \$3,228,554, or 76% of budgeted revenue. Last year at this time, total revenue was \$3,026,123 or 64% of budgeted revenue, so this year's receipts are higher than last year at this time.

Total General Fund expenses as of 12-31-18 are \$1,102,364 or 24% of budgeted expenses. Since we are 34% of the way through the fiscal year, expenses remain under budget. Last year at this time,total expenses were \$1,088,560 or 19% of budgeted expenses. Expenses are at a higher percentage this year because of overtime incurred due to the provision of assistance for Hurricane Michael. Staff continues to monitor all expenses very closely.

The breakdown of expenses by category is as follows:

General Fund cash at 12-31-18 totals \$4,021,578.

Impact Fee Fund

As of 12-31-18, Impact Fee Fund revenue totals \$142,872, or 18% of budgeted revenue, which consists October and November impact fees and interest received. Remember the County collects and distributes the impact fees one month in arrears. Note that we have already received more than 100% of budgeted interest income. This is due to the transfer of funds to the Florida FIT program a few months ago. Last year at this time, over \$163,000 or 26% of budgeted revenue had been received.

Impact Fee Fund expenses total \$122,992, or 3% of budgeted expenses, which is the payment made to the County related to the land for Station #32 and some architect fees. Last year at this time, total expenses were \$2,501 or less than 1% of budgeted expenses.

Impact Fee Fund cash at 12-31-18 totals \$5,136,944.

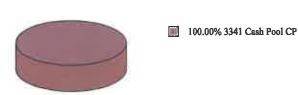

Obtain Board approval of Request for Proposals ("RFP") for architectural and engineering services for the construction of Station 32.

Background Information:

Chapter 287.057, Florida Statutes, provides for the bidding process for the procurement of services related to the construction of a facility, including engineering and architectural services. Pursuant to that statute, a request for proposal must be distributed and the process of obtaining bids and selecting proposals must be done according to statutory requirements.

In order to remain in compliance with those statutory requirements as it relates to services for the construction of Station 32, staff has engaged attorney Laura Donaldson to prepare the RFP so the process can be initiated.

Staff is requesting approval of the RFP so the process can be initiated.

Subject: Request for Board Approval to Establish an Emergency Line of Credit

with Florida Community Bank

Objective:

Obtain Board approval to establish an emergency line of credit with Florida Community Bank.

Background Information:

Over the course of the last several months, the Board has discussed establishing an emergency line of credit in the amount of \$1,000,000 to be used in the event of a declared state of emergency should additional funds be necessary to maintain operations of the District.

Staff met with multiple financial institutions, including but not limited to First Florida Integrity Bank and Florida Community Bank. Only Florida Community Bank would provide a proposal (see Attachment 1) for an uncollateralized emergency line of credit.

Considerations:

Staff at Florida Community Bank has recommended that the District initiate a "non tax-exempt" line of credit because the initiation costs for a non tax exempt product are significantly less than those costs for a tax exempt line of credit. Since the District does not pay any taxes anyway, there is no disadvantage to establishing a line of credit that is subject to taxes. The District simply would avoid the higher costs (approximately \$10,000 more) of a non tax exempt line of credit but would not be subject to any taxes as a local government.

The following is a summary of the components of the line of credit:

- Interest rate is estimated at 3.81% (the interest rate is subject to change based on the date of initiation)
- Interest only payments are due on a monthly basis
- The term of the line of credit is one year
- The line of credit is secured by a pledge of future FEMA reimbursement and other non ad valorem revenues

The actual loan documents will be provided to the Board for review prior to initiation of the line of credit.

Recommendation:

Staff recommends the Board approve the establishment of an emergency line of credit in the amount of \$1,000,000 at Florida Community Bank.

Company

Objective:

Obtain Board approval establish a deferred compensation plan through Primerica/AXA Equitable Life Insurance Company by adoption of Resolution 2019-01.

Background Information:

A deferred compensation plan is a tax deferred retirement savings plan established by an employer for voluntary employee participation. The District provides the plan (with no cost to the District) and individual employees decide if they wish to participate by electing to have a certain amount or percentage of their salary withheld each pay period to be put, pre-tax, into their account. A 457 type deferred compensation plan is for governmental employers. The Internal Revenue Service determines the maximum annual amount of contributions which an employee can make into their deferred compensation plan, and also regulates how the distributions from that plan can be made. The Board approved participation in the Ameritas 457 plan at the April 2018 Board Meeting, and participation in the State of Florida Deferred Compensation Plan Program at the November 2018 meeting.

The District has been approached by Primerica/AXA Equitable Life Insurance Company and would like to make this plan also available to the employees.

Attachment 1 is the information on the plan. Attachment 2 is Resolution 2019-01 establishing the plan.

Considerations:

Most government agencies offer more than one deferred compensation plan to their employees. It is one way to provide a benefit to employees without an associated cost to the District.

A few of our employees already use the Primerica/AXA Plan and staff believes their deferred compensation plan merits offering to the District's employees.

Fiscal Impact:

There is no fiscal to the District in adopting a deferred compensation plan.

Recommendation:

Staff recommends the Board approve the establishment of a deferred compensation plan with the Primerica/AXA Equitable Life Insurance by adoption of Resolution 2019-01.

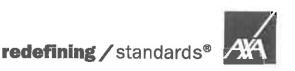

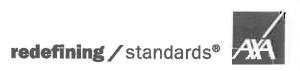

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF FIRE COMMISSIONERS OF THE IMMOKALEE FIRE CONTROL DISTRICT – 457 DEFERRED COMPENSATION PLAN ADOPTION

The undersigned, being all of the Fire Commissioners of the Board of Fire Commissioners of the Immokalee Fire Control District, a governmental entity, by this instrument at a meeting of the Board of Fire Commissioners, hereby consent to the following resolutions:

WHEREAS, the Immokalee Fire Control District desires to establish a governmental 457(b) Deferred Compensation Plan known as the Immokalee Fire Control District 457 Deferred Compensation Plan ("Plan") with Primerica/AXA Equitable Life Insurance Company; and

WHEREAS, Congress in recent years has enacted numerous laws affecting the Plan, the latest of which is the Economic Growth and Tax Relief Reconciliation Act of 2001 (known as "EGTRRA"); and

WHEREAS, the Internal Revenue Service has issued guidance, including final Code Section 457 regulations regarding EGTRRA amendments for 457 plans; and

WHEREAS the Board of Fire Commissioners of the Immokalee Fire Control District, following consideration of the various EGTRRA required and optional provisions, desires to adopt the Plan to maintain an eligible 457 plan.

NOW THEREFORE, IN CONSIDERATION OF THE FOREGOING PREMISES, IT IS:

RESOLVED, that the Immokalee Fire Control District adopts the Plan for EGTRRA and the final Code Section 457 regulations; and it is further

RESOLVED, that the Plan is effective as of February 1, 2019.

RESOLVED, that the Immokalee Fire Control District is directed on behalf of the government entity to timely: (i) execute the adoption of the Plan; (ii) execute any other plan related agreement, form or document; and (iii) take any other action that is deemed necessary or appropriate in connection with the adoption of the Plan and to maintain the Plan's eligible 457 plan status.
