Missouri stopped No. 17 LSU at the goal line in the final seconds to preserve the 45-41 upset win last Saturday. The Tigers (from Missouri) were 14-point underdogs and were +450 on the money line.

Marshall is 3-0 ATS this year covering by an average of 22 ppg.
Kansas is 0-3 ATS this year failing to cover by an average of 18 ppg.
WKU is 0-4 ATS this year failing to cover by an average of 11 ppg.
Texas games are 4-0 to the OVER this year by an average of 20 ppg.
Alabama games are 3-0 to the OVER this year by an average of 20 ppg.
Army, Texas St, UL-Monroe and UTEP games are all 4-1 to the UNDER this year.

Misleading Finals

Houston (-6.5) dominated Tulane more than the 49-31 final with 22-16 first down and 476-211 yard edges. Tulane got two defensive TD's. Favorites were 1-90 ATS when having a -5 TO deficit!

Georgia Tech (+4.5) upset Louisville 46-27. However, Louisville had 24-19 first down and 471-450 yard edges but were -3 in TO's. Those 3 TO's all led to GT TD's. Louisville blew a 21-7 late 2Q lead and GT outscored Louisville 20-0 in the 4Q.

Kentucky (-3) beat Mississippi State 24-2. However, Miss St had 18-10 first down and 295-157 yard edges but were -5 in TO's. Miss St QB's KJ Costello and Will Rogers were a combined 45 of 70 for 275 yards, 0 TD's and 6 INT's. The six INT's

featured basically two "Pick 6's" as one was returned 76 yards to the 2-yard line and also two INT's in the Kentucky end zone.

Duke (-2.5) beat Syracuse 38-24. However, Duke dominated way more than the final indicated with 36-11 first down and 645-286 yard edges including 363-28 on the ground. Duke won despite being -4 in TO's.

NC State (+7) upset Virginia 38-21. However, UVA had 26-17 first down and 405-363 yard edges but had 4 TO's.

Marshall (-6.5) beat Western Kentucky 38-14. However, Marshall wasn't as dominant as the final with only 17-15 first down and 343-294 yard edges. The Thundering Herd were +3 in TO's and all 3 led to Marshall TD's.

Bad Beats

The total in the **Oklahoma/Texas** game was 74. UNDER bettors were looking great as OU led Texas 31-17 with under 5 minutes left in the 4Q until Texas rallied to force OT. Overtime is never a friend for UNDER bettors. As Southpoint Sports Book director Chris Andrews always says "It's never UNDER until its OVER."

The **Miami/Clemson** first half total was 30. With Clemson leading 21-3, the Tigers were lining up for a 61-yard FG on the final to make it 24-3. The FG was blocked and returned for a TD making the total go OVER by 1 point (Clemson 21-10). At the end of the game the full game total (60.5) was in doubt. The Tigers, up 42-17, were running tempo and tried to score on the final play but came up a yard short.

The first half total in the **Central Arkansas/Arkansas State** game was 30.5. It was 6-2 with about 5 minutes left when Arkansas St scored a TD on fourth and goal. Arkansas St then got a "Pick 6" to make it 16-6. Central Arkansas punted with under 3 minutes left and it still looked like an easy cover for UNDER backers. However, Arkansas St fumbled in their own territory. Central Arkansas scored a TD (now 16-13) and then Arkansas St went down the field and scored a TD with under :30 left to put it OVER! All while being played in a driving rain-storm!

Injuries/COVID Cases

The **FAU/Southern Miss** game was postponed due to positive cases at FAU.

Vanderbilt only had 56 scholarship players available for the South Carolina game, just three above the limit set by the SEC for a team to play a game. The Commodores already had six players opt out of this season. This week's game at Missouri has been postponed.

Kansas QB Miles Kendrick has been named the starter vs West Virginia this week. Thomas MacVittie is doubtful and Jalon Daniels is questionable.

Kansas St QB Skylar Thompson (shoulder) is out for the season.

Pitt QB Kenny Pickett (ankle) is probable vs Miami, FL on Saturday.

SMU RB TJ McDaniel and WR Reggie Roberson are out for the season.

Syracuse QB Tommy Devito (ankle) is out for the season.

Virginia QB Brennan Armstrong (concussion) is questionable for this week's game vs Wake Forest.
Virginia Tech QB Hendon Hooker has been named the starter vs Boston College.

Recapping Week Five Best Bets

We had a solid 4-2 week and now easily lead the newsletter contest (see below). Games in Rotation Order

Wednesday, October 14th

UL-LAFAYETTE 33 Coastal Carolina 27. This game was moved here due to Hurricane Delta last week. We'll say it again, we identified Coastal as a team to play on this year as they were experienced, upgraded at QB and had all of their spring practices. So far so good at 3-0 with two easy outright upset winners on these pages including a 52-23 destruction of Arkansas State as 3.5-point home underdogs. QB Grayson McCall continues to impress with a 9-1 ratio. They're taking on a 3-0 ULL team that is only +20 ypg this season (for comparison Coastal is +76 ypg) and were fortunate to beat Georgia Southern in their last game. We lean with the dog here.

Thursday, October 15th

ARKANSAS STATE 37 Georgia St 33. Georgia St comes in off a bye while Arkansas State just played 5 days ago. The Panthers have played only two games so far but are 2-0 ATS. They dominated East Carolina in their last game as they rolled up 303 yards offense on their way to a 35-13 halftime lead, setting a school record for points in a half. RB Destin Coates has 263 rush yards in two games. On the other side, Arkansas St has played 4 games (3-1 ATS) and last week took care of Central Arkansas in the rain 50-27. The Red Wolves continue to use a 2-QB system as Logan Bonner has 91 pass attempts (64%, 8-3 ratio) while Layne Hatcher has 70 pass attempts (59%, 6-1 ratio). We don't see a ton of value here as Arkansas St has been an up-and-down team and we haven't seen enough of Georgia St yet. Do note that Arkansas St is 44-10 SU and 30-23-1 ATS (57%) at home the last 10 years.

Friday, October 16th

Smu 36 TULANE 30. Note that while SMU comes in a 4-0 SU, the Mustangs suffered a couple of tough losses this week as starting RB TJ McDaniel and leading WR Reggie Roberson were out for the season. The Mustang offense has been great averaging 44 ppg and 559 ypg. They're taking on a Tulane team that has been "Jekyll and Hyde" all year long. The Green Wave have rallied from double-digit deficits to beat South Alabama and Southern Miss but have also blown two big leads vs Navy and Houston. Last week Tulane lost 49-31 at Houston despite being +5 in TO's and scoring 2 defensive TD's. Prior to that game, underdogs were on a 90-1 ATS run when they were +5 or more in TO's. That's not a typo. With that being said, we're going to sit this one out and see how SMU adjusts without two key weapons.

Byu 34 HOUSTON 29. While it won't get the national recognition like other games, this is one of the better match-ups of the entire week. BYU comes in at 4-0 SU but last week failed to cover for the first time as they struggled with UTSA as 5-TD favorites. Maybe they were reading their press clippings, maybe they were looking ahead to this one. Meanwhile, despite a very sloppy performance, Houston won their season opener vs Tulane 49-31. The Cougars covered despite being -5 in TO's, which is remarkable considering favorites who were -5 in TO's were on a 1-90 ATS run! We've seen BYU struggle with team speed and they will be facing by far their most talented opponent so far. We wanted to bet Houston here but were expecting the line to come at least BYU -7.

Saturday, October 17th

VIRGINIA TECH 36 Boston College 25. To the surprise of no one, Virginia Tech is going to start Hendon Hooker here at QB. Hooker missed the first two games and then came on to give the offense a spark last week. It was a little too late as the Hokies defense really struggled allowing 656 yards and 56 points. Still, VT continues to get more players back from COVID quarantines as they should be closer to a full roster here than the first 3 games. Meanwhile, BC has been impressive so far this season at 3-1 SU/ATS. Last week they upset Pitt at home in OT. QB Phil Jurkovec is completing 65% of his passes with a 8-2 ratio and they have two legit weapons in WR Zay Flowers (19.3 ypc) and TE Hunter Long. Still, the Eagles can't run the ball (60 rush ypg, 1.9 ypc) and they are -15 ypg on the season. We want to fade the Eagles this year but this line came a little too high.

MIAMI 28 Pittsburgh 20. The Panthers come in off back-to-back losses as a favorite although both were by a single point. Two weeks ago a late TD did them in vs NC State and last week a missed extra point in OT vs Boston College. Pitt is still +146 ypg on the season and are only allowing 52 rush ypg (1.7 ypc). Meanwhile, they take on a Miami team that was humbled last week at Clemson. The game wasn't as close as the 42-17 final as Miami blocked 3 FG's and returned one for a TD. Clemson had a dominating 550-210 yard edge. This is the first underdog role for Pitt this season and we prefer head coach Pat Narduzzi in that role. We want to back Pitt here but the health status of QB Kenny Pickett (ankle) has us pushing the pause button.

TEMPLE 33 South Florida 21. We finally got our first look at Temple last week as the Owls were upset at Navy 31-29 as 4-point favorites. Temple had 25-18 first down and 407-299 yard edges but threw an INT in Navy's red zone and also missed on two 2-point conversions. Meanwhile, USF is in full rebuild mode under 1st-year coach Jeff Scott as they are 1-3 SU. Last week they were upset at home by East Carolina 44-24 as 5.5-point favorites. However, USF finally got some stable QB play as Jordan McCloud was 26 of 35 for 298 yards and 0 INT's. We haven't seen enough of Temple yet to warrant laying doubles here, but the old adage of "you make your biggest improvement from week one to week two" could be in play here.

Navy 32 EAST CAROLINA 31. Both team got confident boosting wins last week. First, despite getting outgained 407-299, Navy upset Temple as 4-point home underdogs. While 2-2 SU/ATS on the year, the Mids are getting outscored by 20 ppg and outgained by 183 ypg. On the other side, ECU got their first win of the season beating USF 44-24. The Pirates are -111 ypg on the season. Navy has had success vs ECU averaging 419 rush ypg in their last 7 meetings. We like the OVER here.

1★ OVER 59.5. NC STATE 35 Duke 31. We think both teams will be "buy" teams during the next month. Duke got their first win of the season last week at Syracuse 38-24 as we easily cashed the OVER on these pages. Duke dominated way more than the final indicated with 36-11 first down and 645-286 yard edges including 363-28 on the ground. The Blue Devils won despite being -4 in TO's as they are now -11 on the season already. Still, their 645 yards of total offense is a high under Cutcliffe who has been here since 2008. On the other side, NC State pulled the outright upset at Virginia winning 38-21. However, UVA had 26-17 first down and 405-363 yard edges but the Wolf pack benefited from 4 Cavalier TO's including a "Pick 6". Despite their 3-1 record, this is the first favorite role of the season for NC State! We like the OVER here which has cashed in 3 straight Duke games and is a perfect 4-0 in NC STATE games this season.

WAKE FOREST 31 Virginia 30. Last week, Virginia lost outright as a 7-point favorite to NC State. UVA had 26-17 first down and 405-363 yard edges but had 4 TO's. Virginia also lost quarterback Brennan Armstrong to an apparent concussion late in the first half and turned to seldom-used senior Lindell Stone, who finished 30 of 53 for 240 yards and 3 TD's. Armstrong's status for this game is questionable as of press time. On the other side, Wake Forest comes in off a bye after crushing FCS Campbell. They've had two weeks to work on an offensive line that allowed 12 sacks the first two weeks and also tweak a defense that has a new D.C. We lean with the dog as this current line of Virginia -3, doesn't reflect his questionable status.

2★ SOUTH CAROLINA 27 Auburn 24. We think Auburn is an overrated team this year. In the opener, they were +3 in TO's vs Kentucky, then the Tigers were crushed more than the 27-6 final vs Georgia. Last week, they were extremely fortunate to beat Arkansas 30-28 benefiting from a controversial call late in the game. Arkansas also missed an extra point early and then failed on two 2-point conversions playing catch-up. Auburn was without a number of key players with injuries, including LB K.J. Britt (out indefinitely), RB Shaun Shivers, DE Big Kat Bryant, OT Austin Troxell and WR Eli Stove. Most are questionable again this week. The Tigers are -92 ypg on the season despite their 2-1 record! Meanwhile, South Carolina could've beat Tennessee, were competitive at Florida and last week did what they were supposed to do in crushing Vanderbilt. The Gamecocks are +58 ypg on the season and are only allowing 96 rush ypg. We like the home dog outright which is Muschamp's preferred role (65% the last 4 years).

North Carolina 38 FLORIDA STATE 24. Last week we cashed on these pages with Florida State (+21) over Notre Dame. The Noles are much improved at QB with Jordan Travis as he was 13 of 24 for 204 yards while leading the Noles with 96 rushing yards and a TD. Please note that he did injure his hand late in the game but looks like he will play here. Meanwhile, NC had 31-25 first down and 656-495 yard edges including 399 yards rushing in their win over Virginia Tech. RB's Michael Carter (214) and Javonte Williams (169) each topped 150 yards! The 399 rushing yards was their best output since 1993! They should have success vs a FSU defense that just allowed 353 rush yards to Notre Dame. We bet North Carolina -9 in the Sunday world openers (see page 2) but this line has gotten away from us.

WEST VIRGINIA 38 Kansas 15. Both teams come in off a bye. Kansas is 0-3 ATS this year failing to cover by an average of 18 ppg. Head coach Les Miles is out for this game (COVID) and QB Miles Kendrick has been named the starter as Jalon Daniels is questionable. In their last game, they were incredibly outgained by 400 yards to Oklahoma St. That's the same Oklahoma St team West Virginia was +11 yards against. On the other side, we cashed on these pages with West Virginia two weeks ago in their OT win over Baylor as a 3-point home underdog. The Mountaineers were sloppy with 4 TO's. We don't see much value as WVU's offense hasn't been consistent enough to lay the big number here.

Liberty 28 SYRACUSE 27. Syracuse beat Liberty 24-0 in last year's season opener where Liberty head coach Hugh Freeze famously coached from a hospital bed in the press box. Liberty, in its third FBS season, is 4-0 (+183 ypg) for the first time since 2008 and are out-gaining their opponents by 183 ypg. Last week Liberty had 20-10 first down and 400-198 yard edges in a blowout win over UL-Monroe. Please note that Liberty got a fumble recovery TD in the end zone after the ULM punter dropped the snap, they also got a blocked punt return TD and a 73-yard punt return TD. They're taking on a Syracuse team that was dominated by Duke way more than the 38-24 final indicated with 36-11 first down and 645-286 yard deficits including 363-28 on the ground. Duke won despite being -4 in TO's! On top of it, the Orange lost QB Tommy Devito for the season. Despite being only -9 ppg, the Orange are -222 ypg as they are +10 in TO's. Did Liberty learn its lesson after being favored at Big Ten Rutgers and losing outright last year? We lean dog and OVER.

Clemson 44 GEORGIA TECH 17. Both teams come in off their most impressive performances of the season. Clemson beat Miami much worse than the 42-17 final with 34-9 first down and 550-210 yard edges including 258-89 on the ground. Clemson had 3 FG's blocked including one that was returned for a TD on the final play of the first half. Clemson QB Trevor Lawrence was 29 of 41 for 292 yards and 3 TD's while RB Travis Etienne ran for 149 yards and 2 TD's. Lawrence continued his run of interception-free football, now up to 355 attempts between throwing a pick. On the other side, Georgia Tech upset Louisville 46-27. However, Louisville had 24-19 first down and 471-450 yard edges but were -3 in TO's. Those 3 TO's all led to GT TD's GT was the more explosive team with a 11.7-6.9 yards per pass advantage. QB Jeff Sims finally played a clean game with 249 pass yards and 2 TD's. Clemson has now won 24 straight ACC games and are 18-3 ATS in their last 21. Pass.

TENNESSEE 25 Kentucky 21. Last week we won with Kentucky on these pages but we were fortunate to win 24-2 as Miss St had 18-10 first down and 295-157 yard edges but were -5 in TO's. The six interceptions that Miss St QB's threw featured basically two "Pick 6's" as one was returned 76 yards to the 2-yard line and also two INT's in the Kentucky end zone. On the other side, while Tennessee is improving, they still have a long ways to go to challenge for an SEC East title. Last week, Georgia outscored Tennessee 27-0 in the second half in the blowout win. Tennessee is on a 33-2 SU and 26-8-1 ATS run in this series since 1985. They are 7-0-1 ATS the last 8 years despite Kentucky improving as a program under Stoops. That's what prevents us from taking the Wildcats more than a lean here.

Texas St 29 SOUTH ALABAMA 28. South Alabama comes in off a double bye after having some COVID issues. They were crushed in their last game at home to UAB way back on September 24th. Meanwhile, they're taking on a Texas St team that is playing their 6th game of the season already. The Bobcats probably played their worst game of the season last week in a 20-point loss at Troy. This is the 4th straight road game for Texas St and we can't wait to play against them next week when they make their 5th straight road game to the altitude of BYU. With that being said, we lean with them here.

UAB 29 Western Kentucky 17. This line seems pricey but it's probably due to the fact WKU is 0-4 ATS this year failing to cover by an average of 11 ppg. Last week WKU lost by 24 to Marshall. However, Marshall wasn't as dominant as the final with only 17-15 first down and 343-294 yard edges. The Thundering Herd were +3 in TO's and all 3 TO's by WKU led to Marshall TD's. WKU backup QB Kevaris Thomas had a 2-yard touchdown run and 148 yards passing, including a 26-yard touchdown to Dalvin Smith with six seconds left. He might get the start here. On the other side, UAB comes in off a bye and will look to take control of the CUSA West Division. UAB has won 20 straight home games but after going 10-0-1 ATS, they are starting to get priced out at home at 4-4-1 in their last 9. Lean WKU.

Ole Miss 38 ARKANSAS 35. Both teams have exceeded expectations so far under first-year head coaches. Last week Lane Kiffin's offense put up more yards against an Alabama defense than any team ever and scored more points against the Crimson Tide than any unranked team has ever. Ole Miss had two 100-yard rushers in Snoop Conner (128) and Jerrion Ealy (120) and two 100-yard receivers in Kenny Yeboah (181) and Elijah Moore (143). Arkansas missed an extra point early and then failed on two 2-point conversions playing catch-up in their controversial 2-point loss at Auburn. QB Feleipe Franks was outstanding throwing for 318 yards and 4 TD's. Please note that Auburn hit a 39-yard field goal with 7 seconds left. However, Facing third and 1, Auburn QB Bo Nix couldn't handle the snap, picked it up and spiked the ball — appearing slightly behind him — to draw an intentional grounding flag. The play was reviewed and upheld. "We've got a good football team. The times of us going someplace and embarrassing our fans and our football team is over," Pittman said. Our power ratings like Ole Miss here but we usually prefer home dogs with the better defense and that is Arkansas. Yes we know Ole Miss games are averaging 94 total ppg but this total seems a little high.

Texas A&M 32 MISSISSIPPI ST 24. A&M got a FG on the final play last week over Florida notching its first win over a top-five team since a 41-38 victory over No. 3 Auburn in 2014. It was the school's first such victory at home since it toppled No. 1 Oklahoma 30-26 in 2002. A&M had 32-22 first down and 543-402 yard edges including 205-90 on the ground. A&M QB Kellen Mond was 25 of 35 for 338 yards and 3 TD's while RB Isaiah Spiller had 174 rushing yards and 2 TD's. On the other side, we cashed on these pages fading Mississippi St in their 24-2 loss at Kentucky. Miss St had 18-10 first down and 295-157 yard edges but were -5 in TO's. QB's KJ Costello and Will Rogers were a combined 45 of 70 for 275 yards, 0 TD's and 6 INT's. We'd say this would be a good spot to back Mississippi St but Leach's comments have us on A&M. "We're going to have to check some of our group and figure out who really wants to play here," Leach said after the Kentucky loss, "because any malcontents, we're going to have to purge a couple of those." Also lean OVER.

Oklahoma State at Baylor has been postponed due to COVID issues at Baylor. Cincinnati 21 TULSA 20. Both teams come in off a bye. It's tough to have a more impressive 2-game start to the season than Tulsa who nearly pulled the outright upset over a Top 15 Oklahoma State team (Tulsa outscored 13-0 in 4Q) and then did pull the outright upset as 3-TD underdogs at Top 15 UCF. The Golden Hurricane have a chance to take command of the AAC if they pull another upset over Top 10 Cincinnati here. The Bearcats are 3-0 but are playing their toughest opponent of the season here while also making their first road trip. Make sure you are checking the weather. Early forecast has sustained 20 mph winds.

Central Florida 41 MEMPHIS 37. Both teams come in off a bye and both need a win here after already suffering losses in league play. In their last game, Tulsa snapped the Knights' 21-game home winning streak and also ended their playoff hopes. Meanwhile, Memphis has only played twice this season as they are 0-2 ATS under their first-year coach. The offense is averaging 544 ypg but "only" 32 ppg as they looked rusty vs SMU (trailed 24-3) before getting their legs under them. UCF has dominated this series going 13-0 SU (+17 ppg) and 7-4-2 ATS (+8 ppg). They make it 14 in a row here but we don't see a ton of value as far as the point spread goes. Even though the total is high, we lean OVER.

Army 27 UTSA 23. Army comes in at 4-1 on the season already. They are outscoring their opponents by 19 ppg and out-gaining them 310-83 on the ground per game. However, last week the Black Knights nearly lost outright as 30.5-point favorites to the Citadel. Note that 3rd string QB Maurice Bellan came on in relief of Jewel Jones who suffered an injury late in the 4Q. It looks like Army could get back starter Christian Anderson but the decision on the starter will likely come later in the week. On the other side, UTSA also down to a 3rd string QB nearly pulled off a shocker of their own as they only lost to mighty BYU by 7 as 5-TD underdogs! UTSA QB Lowell Narcisse played really well replacing Frank Harris (took a shot to lower body in first half) as Narcisse was 17 of 20 for 229 yards and 2 TD's. UTSA is much improved under first-year coach Jeff Traylor and we lean with them here as they are 3-0 ATS as dogs this year with an average cover of 16 ppg. They also have been respectable vs the run allowing 153 rush ypg (4.2 ypc).

1★ Louisville (plus the points) NOTRE DAME 38 Louisville 24. We're going to fade the Irish again here. First, we feel they are overrated due to a soft schedule where they have played three teams who are a combined 1-10 SU vs FBS teams this year! Second, they're facing a very similar team to FSU last week that could give their defense fits. Louisville is coming in off 3 straight losses but the Cardinals are better than their record as they are +35 ypg. However, they have been done in by a -8 TO margin. Last week's 19-point loss to Georgia Tech was very misleading as Louisville had 24-19 first down and 471-450 yard edges but were again -3 in TO's. Those 3 TO's all led to GT TD's. Louisville blew a 21-7 late 2Q lead and GT outscored Louisville 20-0 in the fourth quarter. We expect Louisville to play like a desperate 0-3 in ACC play team and there's plenty of back-door potential.

FLORIDA 40 Lsu 30. This game is now in question as of press time as Florida shut down football activities after five positive cases. Let's just say head coach Dan Mullen's plea to "pack the Swamp" probably isn't happening here. On the other side, the Tigers are now 1-2 for the first time since 1994 losing outright as a 2-TD favorite not once, but twice. Last week Missouri won despite being -3 in TO's! LSU QB Myles Brennan was 29 of 48 for 430 yards and 4 TD's and WR Terrace Marshall had 235 receiving yards and 3 TD's. However, the defending national champions were 0 for 10 on third down and were stopped at the goal line late. The defense was decimated by a first-time starting QB to the tune of 586 yards and 45 points. They're taking on a Florida team off their first loss of the season (41-38 at Texas A&M as 5.5-point favorites. The Gators have a great pass game led by QB Kyle Trask (72%, 14-1 ratio) and TE Kyle Pitts (7 TD's) but the Gator ground game hasn't topped 100 yards in back-to-back weeks and the defense is allowing 495 ypg. The average totals' line in this series has been 45, with only one above 50. Yet, this one is sitting at 73!!! 2020, folks. We're sitting this one out for now with the Florida uncertainty.

MIDDLE TENNESSEE 38 North Texas 31. It has not been a good start for either team this season but we think Middle Tennessee is trending in the right direction. The Blue Raiders have covered 3 straight and last week got their first win of the season upsetting FIU as 6.5-point underdogs. MT QB Asher O'Hara threw for 268 yards and also ran for 106 yards and 2 TD's. On the other side, North Texas' offense has been fine averaging 550 ypg and 36 ppg. The problem is the defense is allowing 47 ppg and 579 ypg. They have also lost the TO battle in each game. We say this every week but the Mean Green are on a 3-17-2 ATS run failing to cover by 9.3 ppg. Slight lean on the home team.

CHARLOTTE 33 FIU 25. FIU is 0-2 this season and are being outgained by 150 ypg despite losing by a combined 5 points. Last week they were upset as a 6.5-point home favorite to Middle Tennessee. Now they're taking on a 3-0 ATS Charlotte team that got their first win of the season last week. This is Charlotte's first home game of the season after playing their first 3 on the road. We don't see much value in the side here but lean with the OVER as Charlotte games are averaging 55 ppg despite playing two games in the rain while FIU games are averaging 65 ppg.

Marshall 31 LOUISIANA TECH 21. We think Marshall is starting to get pricey in the market due to their gaudy 3-0 ATS record this year covering games by an average of 22 ppg. Note last week Marshall wasn't as dominant as the 38-14 final with only 17-15 first down and 343-294 yard edges over WKU. The Thundering Herd were +3 in TO's and all 3 led to Marshall TD's. On the other side, while La Tech is 3-1 SU on the season, the Bulldogs are -57 ypg and last week their offense was held to only 210 yards vs UTEP in a non-covering win. Again, Skip Holtz is in his preferred underdog role at 17-9-1 ATS (65%, +3.9 ppg) since 2014.

Vanderbilt at Missouri has been postponed due to COVID issues at Vanderbilt. ALABAMA 31 Georgia 25. Remarkable that this is Georgia's first visit to Tuscaloosa since Saban's first year in 2007. No question, this is probably the biggest CFB game of the year at least in the regular season. Head coach Nick Saban improved to 21-0 against his former assistants last week but Lane Kiffin's Mississippi offense put up more yards against an Alabama defense than any team ever! On the positive side, Alabama QB Mac Jones was 28 of 32 for 417 yards and RB Najee Harris ran for 206 yards and 5 TD's. The Tide are averaging 51 ppg and 560 ypg on offense but are allowing 30 ppg and 473 ypg on defense. They're taking on the best defense in the country in Georgia who outscored Tennessee 27-0 in the second half last week! The Bulldogs had a 193(-1) rushing yard edge! UGA is allowing just 12 ppg and 237 ypg so far this season including just 38 rush ypg (1.5). We love defensive underdogs but we're hesitant to pick UGA here. To beat Alabama under Saban, it has taken elite QB play like Tim Tebow, Cam Newton, Johnny Manziel, Deshaun Watson and Joe Burrow. We're not sure Georgia's 5-foot-11 Stetson Bennett fits that mold. Just because it is the game of the week, doesn't mean it offers value. We would lay -4 with Bama and take +7 with Georgia. We're on the sidelines with the current line.

Southern Miss 31 UTEP 24. How about those Miners off to a 3-2 start to the season and last week outgained Louisiana Tech 266-210 on the road. The defense has played very well outside of the Texas game and is allowing just 101 rush ypg (3.4 ypc). On the other side, Southern Miss' game vs FAU last week was postponed due to COVID issues at FAU. The Golden Eagles have been a disappointment being outgained by 89 ypg this season and are allowing 225 rush ypg (5.2 ypc). They are -14.6 ATS ppg but this line looks cheap considering Southern Miss was -7 vs La Tech and the Bulldogs were -14 vs UTEP last week.

TROY 42 Eastern Kentucky 16. Troy comes in off an impressive 37-17 win over Texas State last week. Troy had 26-15 first down and 488-254 yard edges but missed 3 FG's. QB Gunnar Watson was 33 of 46 for 338 yards and 4 TD's in a driving rain storm and the Trojans have exceeded expectations so far. They're taking on a Eastern Kentucky team that is 1-3 SU/ATS on the season. The Colonels have been outscored by 22 ppg and outgained by 219 ypg. More of the same here.

GEORGIA SOUTHERN 45 Massachusetts 17. Welcome to 2020 UMass football! The Minutemen originally weren't going to play this fall but now scheduled this game and hope to schedule a few more. Last year a case could be made that UMass was one of the worst teams in the history of CFB but they should be improved in Year 2 under Walt Bell. Georgia Southern has played in 3 down to the wire games so far and are 2-1 SU but we've downgraded them in our power ratings. The market is fading UMass here but note teams opening up their season this year vs teams that have already played games are 21-5-1 ATS covering by 8.3 ppg. It's better to have game film on your opponent than having already played.

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Week 7 Computer Projected Lines for Every CFB Game

For the past three seasons we have posted computer projected lines for every game. **Games where there was of difference of more than 3 points saw our computer lines actually beat the Vegas line at a 302-252-12 (55%) clip. Last week's plays went 4-3 and now the record for this year is 21-11.** Keep in mind, these computer lines don't take into consideration off-the-field factors like revenge or flat spots. They are basically a power-rating number difference between the two teams that also takes into consideration the home field advantage.

Of the 7 games where our computer is off more than 3 points compared to the Vegas line (highlighted), our favorite team this week to back would be **Texas A&M -6.5**.

The Comp column is the computer projected line and the Diff column is the difference between the Vegas line and the Computer line. "+" numbers in the difference column say back the underdog. "-" numbers in the difference column say back the favorite. Let us know if you have questions.

No Thursday night game in the NFL this week as Buffalo/Kansas City has been moved to Monday night. Just one of several scheduling changes and more to come.

Sunday, October 18th

CAROLINA 23 Chicago 20. Three straight wins and covers for the Carolina Panthers as we cashed on them on these pages last week in their win over Atlanta. They are much improved under first-year head coach Matt Rhule and QB Teddy Bridgewater is as capable as ever. However, now they are laying points for the first time this season. Meanwhile Chicago is also feeling good about themselves at 4-1 and off their best win of the season, an upset over Tampa Bay last Thursday night. Lean UNDER for us.

Detroit 27 JACKSONVILLE 26. Really tough for us to lay more than a FG on the road with this Detroit team. The Lions fired Jim Caldwell for going 9-7 in back-to-back years in 2016 and 2017. Under Matt Patricia, they are now 10-25-1 SU and 15-20-1 ATS. How does he keep his job? They come in off a bye after blowing yet another 2-score lead this time vs New Orleans. Since last year they have had a double-digit lead in 11 games. They are 2-8-1 SU in those games. That's has "rocket scientists" like Patricia scratching their heads. Meanwhile, are the Jags in "Tank for Trevor" mode? We don't believe in tanking but they have now lost 4 straight games and are banged up on defense. Still a lean on the home dog here.

2★ MINNESOTA 31 Atlanta 24. We like Minnesota here. The Vikings are underrated as they have a pair of 1-point losses to unbeaten Tennessee and Seattle even though they had the yardage edge in each game. Meanwhile, the Falcons finally got rid of Dan Quinn this week and are 0-5 for the first time since 1997. QB Matt Ryan hasn't thrown a TD pass in back-to-back games for the first time since his rookie season in 2008. We cashed against them on these pages last week and are going right back to the well here. Note head coach Mike Zimmer is 46-20-3 ATS (70%) vs non-division opponents including 3 straight covers this year.

TENNESSEE 28 Houston 26. The Titans were mighty impressive vs Buffalo on Tuesday night winning 42-16 as 3-point underdogs. Considering they barely practiced in two weeks and were taking on a 4-0 opponents, we think that was their most impressive performance of the season. Although, we should mention, Tennessee was outgained and benefited from +3 in TO's. That's coming off 3 straight close wins. They're taking on a Houston team that found new life without head coach, play-caller, GM "extraordinaire" Bill O'Brien last week. The Texans easily won and covered their first game of the season. QB Deshaun Watson had 359 pass yards and 3 TD's. Not much value but we lean with the dog

N.Y. GIANTS 23 Washington 21. At 0-5, the Giants desperately need a win here for first-year coach Joe Judge. Give them credit, they have easily covered each of their last two games on the road albeit in the large underdog role. Now they are favorites for the first time this season. They're taking on a Washington team that has lost 4 straight and hasn't covered a game since the opener. Last week despite the great moment of Alex Smith returning to action, the Football Team were crushed being outgained 429-108! We want nothing to do with either team here.

PITTSBURGH 28 Cleveland 23. Cleveland is 4-1 for the first time since Bill Belichick and Nick Saban were on the sidelines for them in 1994. Last week we lost an UNDER recommendation in their game vs Indianapolis as two non-offensive TD's are never good for an UNDER. Still, they are playing competent football for the first time in ages thanks to a powerful rush attack. However, the Steelers have also been impressive at 4-0. Shockingly it's their best start since 1979! Last week their rookie WR Chase Claypool became the first Steeler to score 4 TD's in a game since 1968. Pittsburgh has won 16 straight times while hosting the Browns dating back to 2004. The Steelers have won those games by an average of 12.5 ppg and are 10-6 ATS (+4.1 ppg). They are playing at home for the fourth straight game. The only thing preventing this from being a play is the Steelers lack of schedule strength as they've beaten Giants, Broncos, Texans and Eagles who are a combined 3-15-1. Lean Pittsburgh.

Baltimore 28 PHILADELPHIA 20. Last week was not a good look for us on these pages as we faded the Ravens and came up short in their comfortable 27-3 win over Cincinnati. We got the Lamar Jackson won't be as effective handicap right as he was 19 of 37 passing while only running for 3 yards. What we got wrong was Baltimore defense who notched 7 sacks and got a TD. After the loss to the Chiefs on MNF, they're clearly right back on track as the 4-1 start is their best since 2012. Meanwhile, the Eagles are 1-3-1 but still in the mix in the dreadful NFC East. Baltimore is on a 17-4-1 ATS run on the road the last 3 years with an average cover of 9.2 ppg.

INDIANAPOLIS 27 Cincinnati 18. Last week we lost picks involving both of these teams. First, Cincinnati's offense was dominated by Baltimore as the Bengals only managed 3 points, 12 first downs and 205 yards. Now they take on the NFL's No. 1 defense as far as total yards. However, Indianapolis couldn't slow down Cleveland (we had UNDER). The bigger issue is at QB as Philip Rivers threw 2 more INT's. Even though the Colts are banged up on defense, this line seems a bit cheap.

N.Y. Jets at L.A. Chargers was re-scheduled for November 22nd.

Miami at Denver was re-scheduled for November 22nd.

TAMPA BAY 27 Green Bay 26. Maybe the last time we get to see Rodgers vs Brady. The Packers are 4-0 SU and 4-0 ATS and coming off a bye. They have scored at least 30 points in four straight games for the first time in franchise history. QB Rodgers now has a 13-to-0 TD-to-INT ratio this year and they are 17-3 in the regular season under head coach LaFleur. Meanwhile, the Bucs are banged up (just lost important DT Vita Vea) and coming off a Thursday Night upset loss at Chicago. Still, Brady is 13-1 ATS as an underdog coming off a loss (per Marc Lawrence's Playbook). Also we see value considering the Bucs were -2.5 in the look ahead line.

1★ San Francisco (plus the points) L.A. Rams 26 SAN FRANCISCO 25. The Super Bowl loser complex is alive and well! The 49ers are now a lowly 2-3 on the season as they have remarkably lost outright 3 times this year as a 6.5-point or more favorite. Last week's blowout loss at home to Miami saw Shanahan bench Jimmy G. It doesn't get any easier for the 49ers considering in their next 7 games they play the Rams here, at New England, at Seattle, host Green Bay, at New Orleans, at L.A. Rams and host Buffalo They will most likely be an underdog in all 7 of those which means they aren't going to the playoffs this year. On the other side, the Rams are off a blowout win over Washington and sit at 4-1 on the season. However, this is their 2nd road game, while it's the 49ers 3rd straight home game. This is the first underdog role for San Francisco all year. Also note teams failing to cover the spread by 28 or more points are 57% ATS since 1990 the next week and that number jumps to 61% since 2002. We don't mind taking the hook here especially considering the 49ers were -3 in the look-ahead lines!

MIAMI 27 N.Y. Jets 18. If this line holds at Miami -10, it will be the first time since 2009 that the Dolphins are double-digit favorites. We normally would love to play against that big of a market outlier but the Jets are that bad at 0-5 SU and 0-5 ATS. They are getting outscored by 17 ppg and are failing to cover the spread by 10 ppg. They're taking on a Miami team that crushed the 49ers last week 43-17 as QB Fitzpatrick threw for 350 yards and 3 TD's. Still this is their first favorite role of the season and even with Flacco at QB for New York, we can't lay this many points.

NEW ENGLAND 28 Denver 17. This game was originally supposed to take place last weekend. We think the Patriots are underrated. They lost at the goal-line on the final play on the road in Seattle and then lost at Kansas City with two back-up QB's turning the football over multiple times. Now they most likely get Cam Newton back for this one. They're taking on a Denver team that is off their first win of the season but it came against the lowly N.Y. Jets. QB Brett Rypien threw 3 INT's in his first start including a "Pick 6" and as of press time, they haven't committed to who will get the start here. Too many question marks to get involved here.

Monday, October 19th

1★ DALLAS 27 Arizona 26. Certainly a sad scene last week seeing Dallas QB Dak Prescott go down to a season-ending injury. Still, this is an unforgiving sport and industry and there is money to be made. As great as Dak's numbers were this season, the most important one for our purposes is that the Cowboys were 0-5 ATS with him. The look ahead line was Dallas -3 here. Andy Dalton is not a 5.5-point downgrade from Dak Prescott in our opinion. Yes, Arizona is off a blowout win over the Jets but this is their third straight long road trip and they haven't really played anyone yet. Cowboys outright!

Kansas City 30 BUFFALO 26. This would've been a great spot to back Buffalo as the Chiefs were scheduled to play 3 games in 11 days. However, it was moved here from Thursday after the Bills/Titans game couldn't be played on Sunday. Got all that? Certainly, this match-up has lost a bit of luster since both teams lost their first games of the season last week. First, the Chiefs 13-game win streak dating back to last season was shockingly snapped by the Raiders. KC was a double-digit favorite and it was the most lopsided loss under QB Mahomes. Then on Tuesday night, the Bills were crushed by the Titans 42-16. Despite the lopsided final, Buffalo had the yardage edge but were -3 in TO's. Currently, we don't see much value.
