

Haiti the poorest country in the western hemisphere was ravaged by a massive earthquake on January 12, 2010, killing 300,000 and leaving 1 Million homeless.

The pre-existing conditions in Haiti made dealing with the effects of the earthquake even more difficult...

- 70% lived on less than \$2 dollars a day.
- 4 million suffer the effects of malnutrition.
- Chronic malnutrition kills 1 in 5 children under age 5.
- Over half the adult population is illiterate.
- 70% of the population is un-employed.
- The average life expectancy is 49 years.
- 80% live in extreme poverty.
- 1 out of every 10 children is a "Restavek" which in Creole means "to stay with" but in reality they are "child slaves".

Helping Haiti Arise since 2005

Elisa Humphreys, founder and director of Clothing for a Cause began sponsoring students thru Haiti Arise Ministries in 2005. After the earthquake of 2010 she knew she had to do more. Since then Clothing for a Cause has continued to increase their annual commitment to Haiti Arise. Now in 2015/2016 contributions are over \$100,000 in both student sponsorships and general operating funds. However with the opening of the new Legal Aid Clinic, funded entirely by Clothing for a Cause, it has become even more crucial to increase the number of bin locations in order to be able to sustain this commitment to Haiti Arise Ministries.

Due to the arrest of one of our students a few years ago our eyes were opened to the Prison conditions in Haiti. Since then we have learned that Haiti's legal system is in disarray. There are no public defenders, so those who are arrested for petty crimes or even due to a misunderstanding, waste away in pre-trial holdings, with no chance of having their cases heard before a judge. Only those who can afford a lawyer ever have a chance of knowing the length of their sentence, and when they would be released. May 2014 we toured some of the prisons in Haiti, gathering information for the purpose of implementing a legal aid clinic in Petit-Goave, Haiti to be opened early 2016.



In Haiti 10 million people struggle to exist on just one-third of the island of Hispaniola. Once considered the jewel of the Caribbean, Haiti has suffered centuries of debilitating political upheaval and chaos. For far too long Haiti has been a country suffering for a lack of leadership. Through their Technical Institute Haiti ARISE is raising up Leaders in Haiti!
