




I view my life in 3 acts. Emily Kaufman was the girl growing up in Manhattan in the fifties and sixties. She went to Clark University in Worcester, Mass and lived in San Francisco, Santa Barbara, Los Angeles and Seattle doing the hippie/peace/love/protest thing in the sixties and seventies. Emily Saur lived in Northampton, Mass. and Davis, CA and was the more conventional wife, mother of two, and elementary school teacher in the eighties, nineties and early 2000s. Emily Gallo married David who is a professor emeritus of economics, moved to Chico, CA, and retired from teaching in 2006. I started writing screenplays and television and moved into novels. 
OPEN MIC NIGHT



BOOK EXPO NEW TITLE SHOWCASE

The CWC has arranged for an exciting member discount, approved by the Central Board at its January meeting:

CWC has arranged for its members a discount of more than 50% for the BookExpo New Title Showcase exhibit, June 1-4 at the Javits Convention Center in NYC.

The New Title Showcase is an official exhibit of BookExpo. We are working with the Combined Book Exhibit who manages the New Title Showcase for BookExpo which is the major book industry event in the US. We are now able to offer CWC members a significant discount to display their books at this major event with either a print book, ebook or both. A print display will cost \$150 (published rate \$315); an ebook display at \$150 (published rate \$315); or a combo rate of \$210 (published rate \$525). The cost includes the physical display of your book with full cover showing, a fully searchable online catalog and database, and listing in the New Title Showcase print catalog and/or ebook electronic display. The deadline for registration is May 13. CWC will not be involved in the transactions.

EXCITING CWC MEMBER BENEFIT AT THE BAY AREA BOOK FESTIVAL 2017

The California Writers Club-NorCal Group takes great pleasure in announcing an exciting opportunity *just* for you, our members. CWC-NorCal Group has once again reserved a booth at the third annual Bay Area Book Festival, and is offering the opportunity for CWC members to sell their books at the booth—at no cost!

The Bay Area Book Festival takes place Saturday and Sunday, June 3 and 4, in downtown Berkeley in and around Civic Center Park. Hours are 10 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. both days. Each year, this free event draws some 50,000 people, 300 author/speakers, and 160 vendors. This year, CWC will be one of the exhibitors.

Details are still being worked out, but here is what we can tell you:

- CWC members are invited to sell their books and/or promote their writing-related business at our booth at no cost to the member. Your brochures and books on the table will suffice; no large promo posters. (We are at the booth to mainly promote CWC.)
- You must have a current seller's permit from the State Board of Equalization if you plan to actually sell anything.
- You must be present in the booth and handle all details of making the sale. No dropping off books and expecting others to sell them for you!
- Shifts will be set up at two-hour intervals. You must remove yourself, your books, and all other promotional materials at the end of your two-hour shift.
- Shift assignments will be made either on a first-come, first-served basis or by lottery, depending on demand.
 You may not sign up for more than one shift unless and until all other interested CWC members are accommodated.
- You may use your shift to promote a writing-related business (editing, book design, PR, etc.) in lieu of selling books.
- This opportunity is available *only* to current members of CWC.
