It has been a great moment to celebrate memorial Masses for the departed souls gone before us in the course of last year and this year. I also concelebrated in the memorial Mass of the late Archbishop of Kampala Cyprian Kizito Lwanga who was found dead on Holy Saturday morning. Thanks for your prayers as I had a safe trip besides the effects of the jetlag. I am so happy to be back among you. May the Lord continue to bless our ministry and to bring forth the desirable fruits of the kingdom.

The Readings of this Sunday are basically about Love. St. John in the Second Reading refers to God as Love. The Gospel Reading of last Sunday, Jesus states "I am the vine, you are the branches. Remain in my love that your joy may be complete." Jesus is a dependable vine and we can draw life and energy from Jesus. Without Jesus, we cannot bear fruit at all.

Love is the driving force for us to have life and bear the fruits of the kingdom.
