Sermon of the Month

Mrs. E. A. Greever

In the last day, that great day of the feast (Jew's feast of tabernacles) Jesus stood and cried, saying, "If any man thrist let him come unto me and drink. He that believeth on me as the scripture hath said, out of his belly shall flow rivers of living water. But this spake he of the Spirit which they that believe on him should receive: for the Holy Ghost was not yet given: because that Jesus was not yet glorified." St. John 7:37-39.

St. Luke 3:16 "John answered saying unto them all, I indeed baptise you with water but one mightier than I cometh the latchet of whose shoes I am not worthy to unloose, he shall baptise you with the Holy Ghost and with fire."

St. Mark 16:17, "And these signs shall follow them that believeth. In my name shall they cast out devils, they shall speak with new tongues."

St. John 14:15-18. "If ye love me keep my commandments and I will pray the Father and he shall give you another comforter that he may abide with you forever: Even the Spirit of truth whom the world cannot receive because it seeth him not, neither knoweth him but ye know him for he dwelleth with you and shall be in you. I will not leave you comfortless I will come to you."

In St. John 15:26 Jesus told them when they received the comforter he would testify of him.

St. John 16:13-14, "When he the Spirit of truth is come he will guide you into all truth. He shall glorify me."

St. John 20th chapter, 19 through the 22nd verse we read the disciples were assembled in a room with the door shut for fear of the Jews when Jesus came and stood in the midst. Hear his words, "Peace be unto you." When they saw his hands and side they were so glad to see the Lord. Again he spoke, "Peace be unto you, as my Father hath sent me, even so I send you." Breathing on them he said, "Receive ye the Holy Ghost."

In St. Luke 24:49 we find it written Jesus speaking, "And behold I send the promise of my Father upon you but tarry ye in the city of Jesusalem until ye be endued with power from on high."

Acts Chapter 1:1-11 tells us the disciples were commanded to stay in Jerusalem waiting for the promise of the father and after receiving the Holy Ghost which was the promise they would have power to witness for him in Jesusalem, all Judaea, Samaria and unto the uttermost part of the world, he then was taken into heaven and word was given he would return. The word tells us they returned from Mt. Olive and were continually in the temple praising and blessing God.

Acts 2nd chapter tells us when the day of Pentecost was fully come (fifteenth day after the passover) they were all of one accord in one place and were all filled with the Holy Ghost and spake with other tongues as the Spirit gave utterance.

Here were Jews, devout men out of every nation under heaven, who were amazed saying are not all of these Galilaeans? We do hear them speaking in the tongue wherein we were born.

Dear friends, the experiences we receive from God cannot be substituted by any wisdom or knowledge of man. In Cor. chapters 1 and 2 Paul tells us God made foolish the wisdom of this world. The foolishness of God is wiser than men and the weakness of God is stronger than men.

You see your calling brethern, how that not many wise men after the flesh, not many mighty, not many noble are called. But God hath chosen the foolish things of the world to confound the wist and God hath chosen the weak things of the world to confound the things which are mighty. And base things of the world and things which are despised hath God chosen yea and things which are not to bring to nought things that are that no flesh should glory in his presence.

The common people heard him gladly. Mark 12:37.

Paul says, "and I brethern when I came to you came not with excellency of speech or of wisdom declaring unto the testimony of God. I was with you in weakness and in fear and in much trembling. And my speech and my preaching was not with enticing words of man's wisdom but in demonstration of the spirit and of power that your faith should not stand in the wisdom of man but in the power of God."

But the wisdom and power he had, he spoke among them that were perfect. The wisdom of God is a mystery. He certainly by the record given, was a power for God and the same is said of all who have received the power (Holy Ghost).

In 2nd Peter 20, 21 we read, "Knowing this first that no prophecy of the scripture is of any private interpretation for the prophecy came not in old time by the will of man but holy men of God spake as they were moved by the Holy Ghost."

Peter among many others obeyed the Lord and tarried for the Holy Ghost. In Acts chapter 2 we read when they were accused of being drunk, with boldness he stood saying, "Men and brethern they are not drunken as ye suppose, This is that that was spoken by the prophet Joel (chap. 2, verses 28,29) And it shall come to pass in the last days saith God I will pour out of my Spirit upon all flesh and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy and your young men shall see visions and your old men dream dreams. And on my servants and on my handmaidens I will pour out in those days of my Spirit and they shall prophesy." (tell of past, present and that that is to come.)

People have felt through the years to prepare for the ministry or other work of the Lord they must go to a seminary which means a school college and etc. We read in Gal. 1:11-12, "But I certify you brethern that the gospel which was preached of me is not after man. For I neither received it of man neither was I taught it by the revelation of Jesus Christ."

CALEB

"But my servant Caleb, because he has another spirit with him, and hath followed me fully. . ." Numbers 14:24.

God's testimony concerning Caleb was that he had another spirit. He had not the spirit of the other spies. Caleb came back with the report that the children of Isreal were more than able to go in and posses the land. Yet the ten spies came back and told the people that there were giants in the land. . .the cities were walled.

This report was discouraging to the people. They wanted to select a leader and turn back. The ten spies had planted discouragement among the people. Fear had gripped their lives. Fear destroys faith and faith lost, destroys man.

In Matthew 5:9, "Blessed are the peacemakers for they shall be called the children of God." Caleb spake peace to the people. He worked to pull them together. The Bible has a reward for the peacemaker. He shall be called a child of God. We are to mark those who cause division among us.

Jesus brought about peace. He was interested in peace. The world is searching for peace. There is no peace outside of Christ. With Christ in the heart, there is true peace.

There was a "prompt spirit" in Caleb. Numbers 13:30 "... Let us go up at once and possess it...." There was an urgency. Jesus said, "Today is the day of salvation." The land was theirs. 

WHY JOSE' HAD TO MOVE

Jose' and his brother and sister live with their mother and father in another country. Their country is not like ours. Here we may worship God and tell other people about Jesus: but in the country where Jose' lives, the people become very angry when anyone tells them about Jesus. Sometimes they turn away and will not listen. Sometimes they spit at the person who is talking to him about Jesus. Sometimes they try to hurt the Christians.

Jose's father and mother and his brother and sister wished that people wouldn't act like that; but they remembered the words of the Lord Jesus when He said, "Blessed are those who are persecuted for righteousness sake." This means, Jose' father explained, that God will be especially good to those who are hurt because they love Jesus. They didn't like to be hurt; but they very much liked to please God, and that was far more important.

One night when Jose's father came from work, he looked especially sad. After supper he gathered the family around him and they read from the Bible and prayed. Then Jose's father told them why he was so sad. That day some men had told him that he could no longer work at his job, because he loved Jesus. They told him that if he would forget about Jesus, and not talk anymore about Him, and not love Him anymore, he could keep his job and then his family would have enough to eat.

Teacher's Notebook

TEACHING THE LESSON

CHART

A chart, or diagram, is a sheet picturing information in some methodical form. It is a graphic method of teaching . . . particulary valuble because of its eye appeal.

Prepare your chart or diagram and have it ready to "flash" when you want it. Or you may want to have it exhibited in sight of the class before the lesson starts in order to attract attention. Usually it is unwise to post a chart permanently.

Use colors to indicate emphasis or variation in subject matter. Make use of vivid colors staying away from yellow unless it's on black.

The drawing should express the thought so clearly that few words of explanation are necessary. Don't talk to the chart; use a pointer and talk to the class.

Diorama

A diorama is a scene made in an open box. For the more elaborate ones small figures, grass, and objects may be added. Simple dioramas made in small boxes with pictures for the background can be used for handwork.

Flannelgraph

This is a graphic method of picturization, using adhesive backed pictures, placed on a flannelboard in sequence as the story is told, or as the application of the lesson is developed. Because action is involved, and the story or the lecture is developed picture by picture, interest is kept at a high level. Because we learn mostly by what we see, the story or lesson is remembered.

As in all teaching, make the flan-

nelgraph a means to an end, used only when it is the best method for the purpose. Keep the pictures in the proper order, ready for use. The secret of success is the magical way of making a picture appear on the board with the touch of the hand. Put the picture on quickly, talking as it appears.

Be sure you talk to the class, not the board. It is important that every pupil can see clearly and can hear as the story is given. Don't overuse this method because it is popular. It's important to vary your teaching methods.

Maps

The use of the map or globe is limited to the historical background of the lesson. You can capture the attention at the opening of the class session or during the session by using a map. A large map in sketchy form is easier seen han a small map in color.

Peep-box

Small pictures cut from Sunday-school cards or papers, or tiny objects made from wire, plastic and other material, can be used to construct a miniature scene at the far end of a shoe box, illustrating part of the lesson. The scene is viewed through a small opening at the opposite end. Tissue paper of various colors and an electric light can be used to light the scene attractively.

Object

Almost anything from an abacus to a zither can be used in an object lesson. Books of Bible object lessons are available, with talks fitted to almost any lesson aim, but the best are those devised by the teacher, or by teacher and pupils. A classic object lesson is the use of a twig to show how easily the habit is broken when first started, compared with a heavier stick that has added strength and size as it has grown.

Impromptu reference to an object is sometimes effective—a teacher steps to a window, to say that it must be clean and clear to let in the sunshine, and that a Christian's life must be clean to let in the love of God.

After the object is used, unless there arouse interest prior to its use; such as a kite, to illustrate the point that we must be held and guided by a stronger power than ourselves if we are to succeed.

After the object is sued, unless there is some special reason for leaving it

How Others Do it

If you have difficulty in getting your junior high pupils to participate by answering questions, or if one or two children seem to dominate the discussion, try this:

Prepare questions which will develop the lesson, (use as many questions as you have pupils in your class) and write them on slips of paper. At the end of the question, write the reference where they can find the answer. Hand a question to each pupil at the beginning of the class period and give them time to look up the reference and have the answer ready. By giving them time at the beginning, you can assist them in any way they need. Give the longer or more difficult questions to the brighter ones in the class. Use these questions and answers to develop your lesson.

in view, remove it from the sight of the class, lest the pupils keep thinking of it and do not follow the development of the lesson.

Object lessons, like other ways of teaching, can be overused and become ineffective.

Picture (Flat)

A picture in the hand, or on a chart hanging on the wall, is among the oldest methods of helping a pupil learn by impression. Select pictures suited to the age group; simple pictures with big figures for little children; more complicated pictures for older pupils. Use care to get exactly the right pictures that will help you accomplish the lesson aim.

Be careful to avoid un-Scriptural pictures or those which show a negative action, simple arrangement, pleasant colors, happy situation.

For Primary Department children keep the composition simple, childlike content, action, and vivid colors. Juniors will appreciate pictures with more detail, true to life, action, facial expression, and those that tell a story.

Teaching the Lesson

Older pupils will appreciate pictures with more symbolism, such as Christ at the Door, and with more detail. They also want better art.

Be sure the pupils, particularly the children, understand that the picture is only the artist's conception.

Pictures can be used for review . . "What did we say about this picture?"

RECORD PLAYER

A disc record, or recording tape or wire can be used to tell Bible stories, teach songs, relate actual incidents from mission fields or Bible lands, play back remarks or statements or songs by the pupils, and for many other purposes, which require sound effect.

LECTURE

Any explanation, or "telling" method of instruction is a lecture. The pupil participates only as a listener. All teachers use it. It should be interspersed with questions, demonstrations, and use of the blackboard, map or other object.

Make certain it is the best method. Never be guilty of using the lecture method as an easy way to teach. It must be organized.

Keep it short. Who was it said, "If you don't strike oil in ten minutes stop boring?" Interrupt it now and then with a question, an illustration, or other device.

Be pleasing. Keep your pupils "on your side," as you talk. Be sure you are prepared. Know what you are going to say and what points you are going to emphasize. Expect attention and get it. BUT be sure you deserve it. Keep on the track. You have an aim; hold it. Keep it simple. Use words your pupils can understand.

Be alert to pupil interest. If you detect lagging interest, change the tempo, use an illustration, mention someone's name, or employ some other device to regain attention.

Summarize at strategic intervals. Cite examples. Make applications to the experiences of those in your class.

Evaluate as you go along. Ask, "Is that clear," or "Does everyone understand," or "any questions?"

Keep it a Bible lesson . . . concentrate on a few important points and make certain they are understood. Be human. A sense of humor, a smile, a "Let's talk this over together" attitude will help.

Keep the group in a problem-solving state of mind. Unless your listener is thinking, he is not learning.

Stop when time is up. Avoid monotony. A monotone in speech, mannerisms repeated over and over, the use of the same words or terms or illustrations . . . are fatal to interest.

Learn to tell stories well. Don't hesitate to be a bit dramatic now and then. Be sincere. Don't say it, if you don't mean it . . . and practice it yourself.

Timing is vitally important to the successful lecture lesson. The teacher begins without hemming and hawing; follows a clear and easily remembered outline which he has planned carefully in advance; and drives carefully, without seeming to do so, toward a specific objective.

To hold the interest of the class, the lecturer speaks directly to the class, adjusts his rate of speaking to the thought he is expressing, speaks distinctly and clearly so that all can understand easily, uses illustrations, facial expressions and gestures in keeping with what he is saying.

Other teaching aids enabling the pupil to learn by impression are numerous. Stand-up, cut-out figures depicting the lesson; puppets; murals; viewmasters; bulletin boards; the sand table or box; models of the tabernacle, the temple, a palace, a home, an altar or other objects. The resourcefulness of the teachers and publishing houses provides an ever increasing variety of such helps.

Remember . . . that whatever is used, it must be anointed by the Holy Spirit to guide the Word of God into the hearts of the pupils. Prayer is the Key that unlocks the stony hearts to allow God's love to enter and purify.


