Our promise and dedication towards completing the Prayer Shrine in honor of Our Lady of Guadalupe and the Mysteries of the Rosary perseveres and each day brings us closer to its completion. We have included an illustration of the Dedication Plaques to give everyone an image of how they look. The plaques will have a significant placement in the Santuario courtyard as you enter. This phase will begin in the spring of 2024.



This is a picture of the completed mission statue of St. Augustine, just received last week. The life-size bronze depiction has temporarily been placed at the church in Antonito and will eventually be placed at the santuario along with six additional mission statues. The process for the next mission statue will begin as entire donations are complete for each figure. We have volunteers actively seeking contributions for the remaining missions of Ortiz, San Rafael, Las Mesitas, San Miguel, and San Antonio.

In addition to the mission statues surrounding the Shrine and the statue of Our Lady Of Guadalupe and St. Juan Diego at the entrance, walkways will lead visitors to various areas of interest. The placement of new trees will also be available to contributors who are interested in dedicating a tree in memory of a family member similar to what now exists on the New Veterans Boulevard entering the Village of Conejos.

MASS READING REFLECTION

FIRST READING Acts 10:34a, 37-43 [Salvation in Christ]

In this speech of Peter, Luke wants to bring out the basic message of the early Church: the Lord's rejection ("they put him to death"); God's vindication ("God raised [him]"); and the apostles' witness to the Christ-event ("he commissioned us to preach"). Referring to the stone rejected and made the headstone of the corner, the Church applies Psalm 118 to the death and resurrection of Christ. In-deed, "this is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad" (Responsorial Psalm).

SECOND READING Col 3:1-4 [Seek Heavenly Things]

The First Reading proclaims the living Christ, his life, death, and resurrection. This Second Reading tells us about the implications of all of this for us. Through baptism you have died to your own sinful and egotistic self and you have been raised up to a new life with Christ. You are a Christian. This life is hidden. In its fullness, it will appear in the life to come.

The lesson is: "Think of what is above, not of what is on earth." This is a strong Semitic saying with the obvious meaning: Do not be so captivated by the tinsel of life or so infected with the commercialism of the day that you lose sight of the things above!

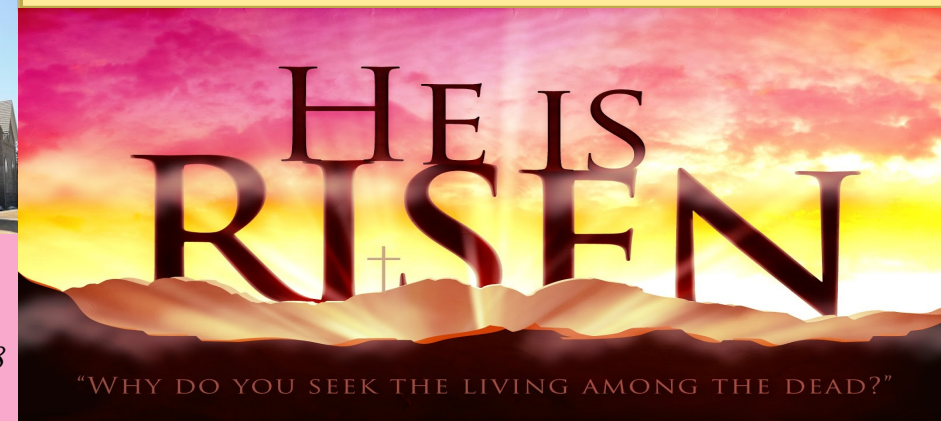

Easter Sunday of the Resurrection of the Lord



Theme: The Lord Has Indeed Risen.

A person who is privileged to visit the tombs of the Pharaohs in Egypt or reads about them in pictorial books is struck by those people's concern about a hereafter. The hieroglyphics for "life everlasting" appear on the murals time and again. People want to live. Easter is the feast of life. "The Lord is truly risen, alleluia" (Entrance Antiphon). "Alleluia Praise the Lord!" marks all prayers and songs of this festival season. It represents the joy of Christians: The Lord's death was not a defeat but a victory! And we share in the Lord's victory over suffering and death, knowing that life everlasting with Christ will be ours. "I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come" (Profession of Faith). People want to know: What is the manner of my existence after death? "How are the dead raised? With what kind of body will they come back?" (1 Cor 15:35). Paul calls this a nonsensical question. And he adds: "What you sow is not brought to life unless it dies. And what you sow is not the body that is to be but a bare kernel of wheat, perhaps, or of some other kind; but God gives it a body as he chooses, and to each of the seeds its own body" (1 Cor 15:36-38). This seems to indicate that our lives now are the kernels from which "earthly human beings" must grow into the persons they will be for all eternity. "That which is corruptible must clothe itself with incorruptibility" (1 Cor 15:53). The words found in 1 Corinthians 15:35-38 offer some insight to the inquisitive reader, but ultimately we must leave the details up to God who promised that our reward will be a hundredfold.
