*Tidings from Timothy*

What makes for a good leader is very different from what the world thinks. When it comes to political leaders they look for a great speaker, but Paul was not a great speaker. When it comes to military men they look for a "take charge" guy, but Jesus emphasized service. This morning I hope for us to see what it takes in the Lord's eyes to be a leader of people. Maybe one day your children can remember this lesson and it will help them develop into the kind of Elder, elder's wife, or deacon that will lead the church into the next generation.

We are a Bible centered, mission minded, and family oriented church. Thank you for coming, and please return at every opportunity.

There was one time we were lost and without hope. With the sacrifice of Christ coming into play, the hope of an eternal home is restored. With this in mind, we are made alive by several elements which are only possible by the Christ’s putting on flesh and dwelling in the world (John 1:14). Let us now examine some more reasons why we are made alive with Him.

The first for our consideration is the nailing of the handwriting of ordinances to Christ’s cross. It was not until the death of the Christ that the law of Moses was taken out of the way. There was a new will waiting in the pipeline, if you will, and that was the law of Christ. There are some who possess the misconception that the law of Moses was the issue. The law of Moses was a good, just and holy law (Rom. 7:12). The law was not designed to bring forth justification as the law of Christ does. It was not designed for that (Heb. 10:1). It was designed to bring us to the point where the law of Christ came into effect (Heb. 8:6-7; 9:15-17).

Next, He spoiled principalities and powers. The previous element as well as this one bear reference to our Master’s final few days on the earth. It was the plan of the powers that were that Jesus would be crucified. Everything about this trial was palpably false, for the rigging of witnesses against Jesus was clearly manifested. The officials of that day were not above political corruption, so what makes us think something different could come today? However, their plan was really in God’s plan all along. It was Wayne Jackson who rightly observed “the Jewish rulers imagine they have been in control and have eliminated this ‘messianic imposter,’ but they are self-deceived instruments in the sovereign, providential hand of the Almighty” (Jackson 168-69).

Finally, He triumphed over them. This bears reference to His resurrection from the dead. The final enemy Jesus was to destroy was that of death. Death was finally conquered (Mat. 28:1-6). He showed Himself to be alive for forty days before He ascended back into heaven (Acts 1:3). He conquered death and now we have that same hope one day after a while. We will go to be with the Lord for eternity (1 The. 4:13-18). Notice that Paul says we will be with the Lord in the air forever. This old world will be destroyed (2 Pet. 3:10-13) and after it is destroyed we will be in the presence of Almighty God for all of eternity. Let us continue to press forth and work toward that end with great diligence!
