Father Hearn will continue to celebrate weekdav Masses privately with intentions from our Mass book (as per the bulletin) and he is available if needed for personal pastoral care of parishioners.

UPDATE ON PARISH FINANCES

The following is a brief update on the Parish Finances effective **J** June 30.

For the first six months of this year we had revenues of \$80,209 with expenditures of \$102,003 resulting in a deficit of \$21,794 as compared to a deficit of \$27,516 in 2021.

Although it looks like we have improved over last year we are actually no better off as we have paid \$5,000 less on our diocesan assessment as compared to last year. We also have been advised by the diocese that we will see a significant increase in our insurance premiums for the next year starting in August.

Even though the Parish has taken some steps to reduce expenditures it is obvious that we have to take further measures in order to maintain our long term viability.

I will provide a more detailed report in September at which time we will have a Parishioners meeting to discuss potential options to cut costs and increased contributions.

The 2021-2022 Living with Christ Sunday Missal is available at the Parish Office for \$5.00 each. The f L Sunday Missal contains complete readings and Mass texts, as well as selected hymns for Sundays and feast days for the entire Church year.

ORDINARY TIME

rdinary Time encompasses that part of the liturgical year that does not fall within the distinctive V seasons of Advent, Christmas, Lent, and Easter. The Catholic Church celebrates two periods of the year as Ordinary Time: the first following the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord and continuing until the Tuesday evening before Ash Wednesday; the second following Pentecost Sunday until the evening before Advent. There are about 33 or 34 Sundays in Ordinary Time, depending on the year. In actuality, however, there are fewer "Sundays in Ordinary Time" because major feasts honouring the Trinity, Corpus Christi, Christ the King, and others replace a particular Sunday in Ordinary Time. It is important to remember that Ordinary Time celebrates "the mystery of Christ in all its aspects". Pope Paul VI, in his Apostolic Letter approving the Roman calendar (February 14, 1969) says, "The reason for the restoration of the liturgical year is to help believers through their faith, hope and love to share more fully in the entire mystery of Christ as it is unfolding throughout the year." The Sundays in Ordinary Time are an important part of this unfolding mystery.

July 20 - Memorial of Saint Apollinaris, Bishop, Martyr: One of the first bishops of the early Church, Apollinaris lived in the first century. During his life he was repeatedly exiled and tortured but continued to evangelize and work miracles until his martyrdom. He was one of the first great martyrs.

July 21 - Memorial of Saint Lawrence of Brindisi, Priest, Doctor: At the age of 16, Lawrence entered the Capuchin Franciscan Order in Verona, Italy. He died in 1619, was canonized in 1881, and named Doctor of the Church in 1959.

July 22—Feast of Saint Mary Magdalene, Disciple of the Lord: A faithful follower of the Lord Jesus, Mary Magdalene brought spices to anoint his body, stood near the cross after his crucifixion, and was the first witness to Christ's resurrection. Mary Magdalene is a patron of the Order of Preachers (the Dominicans).

July 23 - Memorial of Saint Bridget, Religious: Bridget lived happily as a married woman until her husband's death in 1344. After his death, she moved near a Cistercian monastery where she lived a penitential life. She sought papal approval to create a new religious community and founded the Bridgettine Order in 1370. Throughout her life, Saint Bridget received visions and dreams and possessed gifts of prophecy and healing. She died in 1373 and is patroness of Sweden as well as copatroness of Europe.




STAMPS FOR DEVELOPMENT & PEACE
