







Let's Get Radical

THE ARMOR OF GOD

EPHESIANS 6:10-18



Epiphany or The Season After Epiphany (4-9 Sundays) is a time for remembering the various times and ways Jesus was revealed to humans, particularly to the Gentiles (non-Jews) through the Magi (Wise Men) who represented other nationalities. It is a reminder of the universality of Jesus, the Savior of persons in every land. The first Sunday after Epiphany Day (January 6) is known as Baptism of the Lord referring to 3:13-17, Mark 1:9-11, Luke 3:21-22, and John 1:29-34. This is an excellent time for baptism and renewal of the baptismal covenant. Appropriate symbols are water, the baptismal shell or font, a descending dove, and a cross standing in water. The emphasis for the remainder of the season is on the beginning of Jesus' ministry, the miracles performed, and Jesus' works and teachings.

Color: Green is symbolic of the freshness of nature, hope, life, and growth.

A Long-Anticipated Celebration

Devotional Reading:
 Deuteronomy 31:7-13

Scripture: 1 Kings 8:1-13

EXALT!

¹ Then Solomon assembled the elders of Israel and all the heads of the tribes, the leaders of the ancestral houses of the Israelites, before King Solomon in Jerusalem, to bring up the ark of the covenant of the Lord out of the city of David, which is Zion. ² All the people of Israel assembled to King Solomon at the festival in the month Ethanim, which is the seventh month. ³ And all the elders of Israel came, and the priests carried the ark. ⁴ So they brought up the ark of the Lord, the tent of meeting, and all the holy vessels that were in the tent; the priests and the Levites brought them up. ⁵ King Solomon and all the congregation of Israel, who had assemble before him, were with him before the ark, sacrificing so many sheep and oxen that they could not be counted or numbered. ⁶ Then the priests brought the ark of the covenant of the Lord to its place, in the inner sanctuary of the house, in the most holy place, underneath the wings of the cherubim. ⁷ For the cherubim spread out their wings over the place of the ark, so that the cherubim made a covering above the ark and its poles. ⁸ The pole were so long that the ends of the poles were

seen from the holy place in front of the inner sanctuary; but they could not be seen from outside; they are there to this day. ⁹ *There was nothing in the ark except the two tablets of stone that Moses had placed there at Horeb, where the Lord made a covenant with the Israelites, when they came out of the land of Egypt.* ¹⁰ *And when the priests came out of the holy place, a cloud filled the house of the Lord,* ¹¹ *so that the priests could not stand to minister because of the cloud; for the glory of the Lord filled the house of the Lord.*

¹² *Then Solomon said, "The Lord has said that he would dwell in thick darkness. ¹³ I have built you an exalted house, a place for you to dwell in forever."*

Affirmation: "We celebrate God's presence among those who gather in God's name today."

ENGAGE

Unit II, "Dedicating the Temple of God," has four sessions that explore Solomon's dedication of the Temple in 1 Kings. Solomon honors God by providing a place for the ark, by offering blessings to God for fulfilling the promise to David, by praying that God would hear prayers offered in the Temple, by calling the people to keep God's commandments, and by offering sacrifices to God.

People have dedication ceremonies or grand openings for

many different occasion. How are these ceremonies or grand openings celebrated? When King Solomon called an assembly to celebrate the dedication of the Temple, the glory of the Lord filled the house of God. God was pleased with the work achieved, the way in which it was achieved, and blessed it with the divine presence. How do we know God is pleased with our work or service? What are the means by which we perform God-given tasks that show divine approval? Do we seek God through meditation and prayer in order to be aware of the tasks God has for us to preform and how these tasks may be preform and how these tasks may be performed so that God is pleased with the work? How do we discern God's presence in the church's corporate worship and work?

Respond to the following question and suggestions using one sticky note for each:

1. Recall how you felt in the fulfillment of a long-awaited accomplishment. Was there a celebration of the achievement? How was it acknowledged properly? To whom was appreciation and thanks given?
2. Use awe-inspiring photographs or movie scenes to initiate a discussion of how it would have felt to be in the presence of God's glory.
3. Share experiences you may have had with elaborate church structures. Discuss feelings and emotions these structures

4. How would you plan and implement a classroom worship service that focuses on celebrating the presence of God?

EDUCATE

The history of the building of God's temple is a fascinating one, especially dating back to King David, Solomon's father, who dearly desired to build a house for God but was not permitted to do so. God designated that noble task to his son, King Solomon. After David's death and Solomon's rise to the throne (1 Kings 2:12), he solemnly went about the sacred mission given him to build the temple, although David had "streamlined the process by stockpiling materials Solomon's builders used for the awe-inspiring structure (1 Chronicles 22:2-6)" (Standard Lesson Commentary, Large Print Edition, 2019-2020, Ronald L. Nickelson, Senior Editor, p. 162). The fabulous structure was completed by skilled builders and artisans over a period of 7 years and most elaborate. It was a time to celebrate!

1 Kings 8:1-3: The festival celebrated in the seventh month (v. 2) was appropriately the Feast of Booths/Tabernacles (Leviticus 23:33-43), a traditional weeklong celebration remembering the Israelites' journey from Egypt to a permanent home in Canaan. The ark had long been a great symbol of God's presence with the Israelites. The moving of it here represented the long-awaited provision of a permanent residence for God among God's people. God had provided very specific instructions for moving of the ark, (Exodus 25:12-14) and they took them very seriously, as evidenced by the story of Uzzah in 2 Samuel 6.

1 Kings 8:4-8: Solomon had prepared new and fresh furnishings for the temple, not using any of the original tabernacle ones except the ark, which was of necessity, of course, as it was a symbol of God's

throne. "Having arrived at the temple grounds, the people gather around the King," positioning themselves around him, signifying their status as God's subjects, who is their real king, Solomon being only God's representative (Ibid., p. 164). "The priests place the ark in the inner sanctuary of the temple as it had been in the tabernacle (Exodus 26:33, 2 Samuel 6:17). Because the ark is the symbol of God's presence, the temple could not be considered God's dwelling until the ark was situated in the Most Holy Place. The cherubim are made of gold and figuratively guard the ark (Exodus 25:18, 19)" (Ibid., pp. 164, 165). The ark's presence in the chamber "makes it the most sacred space in Israel...and it transforms this space into an earthly representation of God's heavenly throne room (Psalm 11:4). Only the great high priest can enter the Most Holy Place, once a year on the Day of Atonement (Leviticus 16)" (Ibid., p. 165).

1 Kings 8:8-12: At this time, the ark contains the two stone tablets of the law that God gave to Moses (Exodus 25:16, the presence of which represents the covenant relationship of God with Israel and the obligations Israel has as God's covenant people. During the Exodus, God's appearance to his people was regularly associated with a cloud (Exodus 13:21-22; 16:10; 19:9). The appearance of the cloud here (vv. 10-11) can be seen as a sign of God's blessings on the new worship arrangements. We see other instances of the overwhelming glory of the Lord (v. 11) rendering the Lord's ministers incapable of fulfilling their duties in Exodus 40:35 and Revelation 15:8. Solomon's reference to God dwelling in "thick darkness" links God with the God of the Exodus and Sinai (Exodus 20:21; Deuteronomy 4:11; 5:22).

ELEVATE

Realizing and recognizing the significance of the ark and the Temple in the religious experience of the Israelites, recall ways in which

God's Holy Presence manifests in churches and living experiences.

How do we celebrate the active presence of God in our lives through the work of the Holy Spirit?

Do we respond to the glory of God with awe and humility? How is this reflected in our appearances and actions?

In what ways may we grow through seeking God's presence in our lives both corporately and personally? How do we recognize such presence?

Different groups, churches, and denominations have a diversity of ways of inviting and celebrating the presence of God in their midst and of responding to that presence. What are some of the ways you have seen and experience such presence?

Some believers are moved toward extravagance in their celebration of the glory of God's presence. What benefits do they derive from such experiences? If you have witnessed such, how has it affected you and your living and worship practices?

I THINK:

1. Compare and contrast the construction of the Tabernacle with the Temple (consider using artists' renderings) and discuss how the construction of the Temple would have impacted the worship of the Israelites.

Carl was a quiet man. He didn't talk much. He would always greet you with a big smile and a firm handshake. Even after living in our neighborhood for over 50 years, no one could really say they knew him very well.

Before his retirement, he took the bus to work each morning. The lone sight of him walking down the street often worried us. He had a slight limp from a bullet wound received in W.W.II. Watching him, we worried that although he had survived W.W.II, he may not make it through our changing uptown neighborhood with its ever-increasing random violence, gangs, and drug activity.

When he saw the flyer at our local church asking for volunteers for caring for the gardens behind the minister's residence, he responded in his characteristically unassuming manner. Without fanfare, he just signed up. He was well into his 87th year when the very thing we had always feared finally happened.

He was just finishing his watering for the day when three gang members approached him. Ignoring their attempt to intimidate him, he simply asked, Would you like a drink from the hose? The tallest and toughest-looking of the three said, Yeah, sure, with a malevolent little smile. As Carl offered the hose to him, the other two grabbed Carl's arm, throwing him down. As the hose snaked crazily over the ground, dousing everything in its way, Carl's assailants stole his retirement watch and his wallet, and then fled.

Carl tried to get himself up, but he had been thrown down on his bad leg. He lay there trying to gather himself as the minister came running to help him. Although the minister had witnessed the attack from his window, he couldn't get there fast enough to stop it. Carl, are you okay? Are you hurt? The minister kept asking as he helped Carl to his feet.

Carl just passed a hand over his brow and sighed, shaking his head. Just some punk kids. I hope they'll wise-up someday. His wet clothes clung to his slight frame as he bent to pick up the hose. He adjusted the nozzle again and started to water. Confused and a little concerned, the minister asked, Carl, what are you doing? I've got to finish my watering. It's been very dry lately, came the calm reply. Satisfying himself that Carl really was all right, the minister could only marvel. Carl was a man from a different time and place.

A few weeks later the three returned. Just as before their threat was unchallenged. Carl again offered them a drink from his hose. This time they didn't rob him. They wrenched the hose from his hand and drenched him head to foot in the icy water. When they had finished their humiliation of him, they sauntered off down the street, throwing catcalls and curses, falling over one another laughing at the hilarity of what they had just done. Carl just watched them. Then he turned toward the warmth giving sun, picked up his hose, and went on with his watering.

The summer was quickly fading into fall. Carl was doing some tilling when he was startled by the sudden approach of someone behind him. He stumbled and fell into some evergreen branches. As he struggled to regain his footing, he turned to see the tall leader of his summer tormentors reaching down for him. He braced himself for the expected attack.

Don't worry old man, I'm not gonna hurt you this time. The young man spoke softly, still offering the tattooed and scarred hand to Carl. As he helped Carl get up, the man pulled a crumpled bag from his pocket and handed it to Carl. What's this? Carl asked. It's your stuff, the man explained. It's your stuff back. Even the money in your wallet. I don't understand, Carl said. Why would you help me now? The man shifted his feet, seeming embarrassed and ill at ease. I learned something from you, he said. I ran with that gang and hurt people like you. We picked you because you were old and we knew we could do it. But every time we came and did something to you, instead of yelling and fighting back, you tried to give us a drink. You didn't hate us for hating you. You kept showing love against our hate. He stopped for a moment. I couldn't sleep after we stole your stuff, so here it is back. He paused for another awkward moment, not knowing what more there was to say. That bag's my way of saying thanks for straightening me out, I guess. And with that, he walked off down the street. Carl looked down at the sack in his hands and gingerly opened it. He took out his retirement watch and

In particular the minister noticed a tall young man that he didn't know sitting quietly in a distant corner of the church. The minister spoke of Carl's garden as a lesson in life. In a voice made thick with unshed tears, he said, Do your best and make your garden as beautiful as you can. We will never forget Carl and his garden.

The flyer went unnoticed by the busy parishioners until one day when a knock was heard at the minister's office door. Well, congratulations! said the

minister, as he was handed the garden shed keys. That's wonderful! What's the baby's name? Carl, he replied.

consistently and sincerely has found that it really works.

Before you begin, look over these fundamental points. They are true and are based on the experience of thousands of people.

1. God is alive. He always has been and He always will be.
2. God knows everything.
3. God can do anything.
4. God can be everywhere--all at the same time. (These are the important differences between God and us human beings).
5. God is invisible-we can't see Him or touch Him-but, God is here. He is with you now. He is beside you. He surrounds you. He fills the room or the whole place where you are right now. He is in you now. He is in your heart.
6. God cares very much for you. He is interested in you. He has a plan for your life. He has an answer for every need and problem you face.
7. God will tell you all that you need to know. He will not always tell you all that you want to know.
8. God will help you do anything that He asks you to do.
9. Anyone can be in touch with God, anywhere and at any time, if the conditions are obeyed.

These are the conditions:

- To be quiet and still
- To listen
- To be honest about every thought that comes
- To test the thoughts to be sure that they come from God
- To obey

So, with these basic elements as a background, here are specific suggestions on How to Listen to God.

1. Take Time

Find some place and time where you can be alone, quiet and undisturbed. Most people have found that the early morning is the best time. Have with you some paper and pen or pencil.

2. Relax

Sit in a comfortable position.. Consciously relax all your muscles. Be loose. There is no hurry. There needs to be no strain during these minutes. God cannot get through to us if we are tense and anxious about later responsibilities.

3. Tune In

Open your heart to God. Either silently or aloud, just say to God in a natural way that you would like to find His plan for your life-you want His answer to the problem or situation that you are facing just now. Be definite and specific in your request.

4. Listen

Just be still, quiet, relaxed and open. Let your mind go "loose." Let God do the talking. Thoughts, ideas, and impressions will begin to come into your mind and heart. Be alert and aware and open to every one.

5. Write!

Here is the important key to the whole process. Write down everything that comes into your mind. Everything. Writing is simply a means of recording so that you can remember later. Don't sort out or edit your thoughts at this point.

Don't say to yourself:

- This thought isn't important,
- This is just an ordinary thought;
- This can't be guidance;
- This isn't nice;
- This can't be from God;
- This is just me thinking..., etc.

Write down everything that passes through our mind:

- Names of people;
- Things to do;
- Things to say;
- Things that are wrong and need to be made right.

Write down everything:

- Good thoughts - bad thoughts;
- Comfortable thoughts - uncomfortable thoughts; "Holy" thoughts - "unholy" thoughts;
- Sensible thoughts - "crazy" thoughts.

Be honest! Write down everything! A thought comes quickly, and it escapes even more quickly unless it is captured and put down.

6. Test

When the flow of thoughts slows down, stop. Take a good look at what you have written. Not every thought we have comes from God. So we need to test our thoughts. Here is where the written record helps us to be able to look at them.

- a. Are these thoughts completely honest, pure, unselfish and loving?
- b. Are these thoughts in line with our duties to our family-to our country?
- c. Are these thoughts in line with our understanding of the teachings found in our spiritual literature?

7. Check

When in doubt and when it is important, what does another person, who is living two-way prayer think about this thought or action? More light comes in through two windows than one. Someone else who also wants God's plan for our lives may help us to see more clearly.

Talk over together what you have written, Many people do this. They tell each other what guidance has come. This is the secret of unity. There are always three sides to every question-your side, my side, and the right side. Guidance shows us which is the right side-not who is right, but what is right.

8. Obey

Carry out the thoughts that have come. You will only be sure of guidance as you go through with it. A rudder will not guide a boat until the

boat is moving. As you obey, very often the results will convince you that you are on the right track.

9. Blocks

What if I don't seem to get any definite thoughts? God's guidance is as freely available as the air we breathe. If I am not receiving thoughts when I listen, the fault is not God's.

Usually it is because there is something I will not do:

- something wrong in my life that I will not face and make right;
- a habit or indulgence I will not give up;
- a person I will not forgive;
- a wrong relationship in my life I will not give up;
- a restitution I will not make;
- something God has already told me to do that I will not obey.

Check these points and be honest. Then try listening again.

10. Mistakes

Suppose I make a mistake and do something in the name of God that

isn't right? Of course we make mistakes. We are humans with many faults. However, God will always honor our sincerity.

He will work around and through every honest mistake we make. He will help us make it right. But remember this! Sometimes when we do obey God, someone else may not like it or agree with it. So when there is opposition, it doesn't always mean you have made a mistake. It can mean that the other person doesn't want to know or to do what is right.

Suppose I fail to do something that I have been told and the opportunity to do it passes? There is only one thing to do. Put it right with God. Tell Him you're sorry. Ask Him to forgive you, then accept His forgiveness and begin again. God is our Father--He is not an impersonal calculator. He understands us far better than we do.

11. Results

We never know what swimming is like until we get down into the water and try. We will never know what this

is like until we sincerely try it.

Every person who has tried this honestly finds that a wisdom, not their own, comes into their minds and that a Power greater than human power begins to operate in their lives. It is an endless adventure.

There is a way of life, for everyone, everywhere. Anyone can be in touch with the living God, anywhere, anytime, if we fulfill His conditions:

***When man listens, God speaks.
When man obeys, God-acts.***

This is the law of prayer

God's plan for this world goes forward through the lives of ordinary people who are willing to be governed by Him.

washed us clean of sin in His own blood freeing us from the slavery of sin. Those who previously didn't believe in Jesus Christ and willfully accept Him as their personal God, Lord and Savior receive the gift of salvation. The Holy Spirit then empowers the new believer for holiness, worship and service of which they were incapable of prior to conversion.

When believers empty themselves of the encumbrances of this life, while resting totally on the daily workings of the Holy Spirit, they engage themselves in the holy things of God.

Believers are given an order by God to be filled with the Holy Spirit (Ephesians 5:18). The filling of the Holy Spirit is a continuous process that happens over time, as the believer fulfills the plan of God in their lives. The believer must confess

their sins to God and willfully choose with the help of the Holy Spirit to always turn away from sin. The believer is expected to consider it reasonable that they relinquish their time, work, talents and treasures giving them over to God and opening up themselves to His dominion (Romans 12:1,2).

The filling of the Holy Spirit involves frequent reading, listening, studying and most importantly obeying the living Word of God (Colossians 3:16). The purpose of God in the life of the believer is the building of a holy and eternal relationship.

The Apostle John wrote to the Churches of Asia Minor about the same spiritual challenges and doctrinal choices facing us today in the twenty-first century. It is from this perspective we will examine the church age.

Ephesus was praised for service

and patience. They didn't tolerate evil. They lived and taught sound doctrine but Ephesus's true motivation for worshipping Jesus Christ was lost. They labored out of duty not out of agape love for Jesus Christ and the brethren (Revelation 2:1-4).

The Church of Smyrna was a persecuted body of believers in Jesus Christ by Diocletian the Roman Emperor. Jesus Christ was also hated and persecuted. As a result of what Jesus Christ experienced, He is able to comfort those who faces persecution and death for their belief in Him. He knows their pain and suffering and encourages the believer to continue to listen to the Holy Spirit for the crown of life is their reward (Revelation 2:8-10). Today many are persecuted for their faith in Jesus Christ.

In Pergamos many Christian

Center's Dr. Joseph Kim. It was structured to present such abysmal statistics, as the heading, on Prostate Cancer and other men's health issues, for a reason.

The event, started promptly at 9:00 am, after the men had treated themselves to a typical Cross Street breakfast of eggs, bacon and sausages and grits and pastry with coffee and tea. The doctor in the house did not disappoint. He did not mince words either. Dr Kim laid out the bare truth about prostate cancer. Who is destined to have it; when can it be expected; who is most vulnerable; what are the usual symptoms; what happens when one is confronted with the diagnoses for the first time; what to expect when one gets the bad news; what not to do; and what exactly can one depend on when the unfortunate really did happen.

To begin with, Dr. Kim introduced himself to the men, quite an attendance that morning; approximately forty men in all. The esteemed doctor is an Assistant Professor of Medicine in Medical Oncology – that is the care, treatment and coordination of treatment for people who have had the unfortunate incidence of various forms of cancer. Early on in his career Dr Kim had been fascinated by medical oncology. In his personal bio he reveals the he has successfully **'formed a team of scientists from Yale and researchers from other academic institutions, and leads several National Cancer Institute-sponsored multi-institutional clinical trials for patients with prostate, bladder, testicular and penile cancers at the Yale Cancer Center'**. In effect, he knows a thing or two about men's health as it relates to urological issues.

He reiterated the theme of the event, which was to urge the men to **'learn about risk factors, symptoms, and new cutting-edge therapies in the treatment of prostate cancer.'** His entire speech

echoed and highlighted the drumbeat of getting his listeners to **take ownership of their health, since their lives depended on it.**

Then followed the long list of uncomfortable realities. That prostate cancer is very, very common. In various surveys it's been established that most men, all over, will develop some kind of prostate issue after the age of forty. Half the men over seventy years will have some level of prostate cancer. Most of all, the condition is most prevalent in males of African American decent. Symptoms may not be apparent for years, so the best approach is to be proactive and to talk to one's healthcare provider about ways to be aware of one's health status. Dr Kim said that the PSA screening is the starting point, and all men, especially African American men, should endeavor to have the test done, as soon as possible. That combined with a simple digital rectal examination are good ways to stay ahead of the game. In general, he stated that all men over fifty should request a colon screening whether by colonoscopy or simple stool testing. And for prostate issues, the age is fifty-five, or sooner, if a male family member; father, brother, uncle, etc. had had a history of prostate issue.

Not everything was dire and gloomy, though. Dr Kim made it abundantly clear that not all people diagnosed with prostate cancer die from it. In fact, it is a common medical knowledge that various autopsies reveal that almost every male had some stage of prostate cancer at the time of death. Yet, they may have died from some other causes. The leading cause of death, he said, was various forms of heart diseases. The second leading cause of death for men over seventy, he informed us, was from all manner of cancers and unfortunately, the trend of dying from all kinds of cancers has been going up and up.

On the primary topic of prostate health, Dr Kim listed the common symptoms as; the urgency to urinate, the constant and repeated urge to

urinate, the burning sensation at time of urination, the feeling of some level of retention even after urination. Not to forget the unpleasant feeling of repeatedly having to wake up at night to urinate. The constant occurrences of any these symptoms are clear indication of some level of issue with one's prostate. So, he reiterated, for everyone to take control of their health and to talk to their doctors about it. Unfortunately, the usual symptoms may not even be present. Which is why the blood test of PSA (prostate specific antigen) is the best approach at detecting the presence of prostate cancer.

In responding to a variety of questions, Dr Joseph Kim provided more details. For example, he pointed out that different PSA levels may shed light on the stage of one's cancer diagnosis. He pointed out that PSA tests most often lead the way to early detection. And that PSA numbers of 4 and higher are a starting point for awareness. Numbers of 4 and lower are OK, but to continue to monitoring as necessary. At certain points, when a PSA is high enough, targeted biopsies would be done to determine the level of the disease. Physical biopsy of a cancerous gland would lead the attending doctor to determine the level and intensity of the growth. Here too, he provided details as to scoring and staging of the cancer. That is done through a Gleason Score. He pointed out that scores of 6 or lower were of low risk, even if cancer was present. The Gleason Score is calculated by one's doctor to help in choosing the appropriate treatment plan such as making the decision for immediate treatment or to take the approach of active surveillance. When cancer is detected, and Gleason Score indicates a particular treatment plan, Dr Kim listed a number of options available. These may include surgery, prostatectomy, chemotherapy, immunotherapy, radiation and even actively watching and monitoring. He reassured all, that many men diagnosed with prostate cancer have gone on to live

long, quality lives and many have been cured and eventually, have become cancer-free. When speaking about prostate cancer treatment, one cannot ignore the varieties of side effects, the doctor pointed out. And these include possible erectile dysfunction, reduction or loss of libido and urinary incontinence.

In summary, Dr. Kim extolled the men to follow certain guidelines that may help forestall the occurrence of

prostate cancer. While no one has yet definitively pointed to the real causes of prostate cancer, he stated that certain lifestyle changes and approaches may help to stay cancer-free as long as possible. He pointed out that living actively healthy, enjoying life, loving family, resorting to a balanced diet, minimizing the intake of sodium and generally looking out for one's own health needs can be combined in total to promote a cancer-free life. For an African American male, request

testing once a year if over fifty-five. If any stage of cancer has been diagnosed, he suggests testing every six months. In step with the age-old adage of prevention being better than cure, Dr. Kim stressed the wisdom in continuous intervention rather than surveillance. In other words, men, especially African American men, are advised to be more vigilant about their health needs and to be actively proactive in everything relating to their health issues.

people tolerated pagan, cultic, idolatrous, sexually immoral practices. Pergamos was home to many people who were Christian in name and title only. They allowed doctrinal compromise, ecumenicalism along with the practice and teachings of evil doctrine. This is going on today everywhere. In spite of the spiritual problems that permeated Pergamos, Jesus Christ calls the overcomer to obedience to His Word (Revelation 2:12-17).

The church of Thyatira was good in its works, love, service and faith. The problem facing the church was that they taught and allowed the practice of immorality and idolatry (Revelation 2:20). As a result of their unwillingness to repent, God brought reproof and judgment their way. Those who were faithful were told to hold fast to the truth until Jesus Christ returns (Revelation 2:24-25). Believers are to this day are called to adhere to the truth of Jesus Christ.

Sardis was a lifeless church lacking spirit, interest, energy and power of the Holy Spirit. The church practiced traditional, formal routine

rituals. Their ministries were man centered lacking the presence of the Holy Spirit (Revelation 3:1). In Sardis there were very few spirit filled believers. Jesus Christ calls the body of Christ Jesus to receive and be lead by the Holy Spirit.

The church of Philadelphia was faithful to Jesus Christ. They acknowledged the divinity of Jesus Christ, His lordship and called on His name. The Philadelphians lived in obedience to God and their love for Him fueled their desire for outreach, evangelism and eternal security.

The church of Laodicea was sickening to God because it was lukewarm, prideful and apathetic (Revelation 3:15-16). Laodiceans thought that they could buy spiritual divine righteousness. Jesus Christ called them to repent.

Clearly we see that today's Christianity mirrors the same spiritual challenges and doctrinal choices. It is imperative that we live in obedience to our Lord Jesus Christ during any age. The return of Jesus Christ is at hand and the Church Age is coming to a close. The unbeliever must ask Jesus Christ for forgiveness of sins

and ask to become an adopted child of God. Secondly, the unbeliever must be willing to receive God's free gift of salvation through belief in Him.

As believers we must acknowledge the fact that grace does not give us a license to sin and commit trespasses against God. Believers must love the Lord God with all their heart, soul and mind and love their neighbor as themselves. God must be the believer's first love. Believers must hunger and thirst for the Word of God the Bible, so that sound doctrine will resonate within you. Believers must stop picking, choosing and rationalizing how they will surrender their lives to Jesus Christ. Just submit to Him in the fullness of the entire canon. Believers must be willing to suffer pain, be tormented, be persecuted, and put to death for the love and name of Jesus Christ if those circumstances arise. Why Do We Go To Church?

Use Of Spiritual Gifts

1 Corinthians 12 makes it clear that God has given spiritual gifts to every Christian. Verse 7 states that these abilities are not provided to make you feel good; they are abilities to minister that should be used for the common good! 1 Peter 4:10 commands us to use spiritual gifts to help each other. The same passage makes it clear that we meet with other Christians so they can use their gifts to strengthen us. God's gift of a preacher or teacher is wasted if no one comes to hear him or her speak.

Mutual Ministry

The church is pictured as a body and in 1 Corinthians 12, Paul explains that each part of the body exists to meet the needs of other body parts. In the same way, God intends each of us to meet the needs of other believers, using our strengths to help in their areas of weakness. 1 Corinthians 12:21 expresses it this way: "The eye cannot say to the hand, I have no need of you". Neither can a Christian claim to be self-sufficient. The New Testament is full of "**one another**" commands. We are to comfort **one another** (1Thessalonians 4:18), build up **one another** (1Thessalonians 5:11), confess our sins to **one another** (James 5:16), pray for **one another** (James 5:16), and many more. How can we obey these directives if we stay away from the gathering of believers?

Accountability

God designed the church as a place where spiritual leaders could watch out for our welfare, as a shepherd guards the sheep (1 Peter 5:1-4; Hebrews 13:17). A Christian who answers only to himself can easily rationalize sinful attitudes or actions: regular contact with other Christians can keep us sharp.

lest I dash my foot against a stone, as declared in Psalm 91.

1 Peter 2:9 establishes I am a chosen generation, a royal priesthood, a holy nation.

I am a peculiar person called out of darkness into His marvelous light.

1 Peter 2:24 states, I have been healed by the stripes of Jesus.

***Cancer, sugar diabetes, heart disease, sickness, afflictions, infections,
or any other disease cannot enter my body.***

I am without spot or blemish, an intercessor,

the righteousness of God, saved, and washed in the Blood of Jesus.

“No weapon formed against me shall prosper, and every tongue which rise against me in judgement You shall condemn.

This is the heritage of the servants of the LORD,

and their righteousness is from Me,” Says the LORD.

I am saved from wrath by Him and justified by the blood of the Lamb.

***Lord I pray that those may prosper that love Jerusalem and that peace will be within them
and prosperity in their houses according to Psalms 122:6-9.***

Clean Mind and High Spirits

You are already clean because of the word which I have spoken to you. John 15:3

This Spirit Lifter tells us that the word of Jesus Christ, when recorded in consciousness and held there, can make you clean of all guilt. How? The answer is by forgiveness from wrong thoughts and actions, by changing thoughts from impure to wholesome thinking, by filling the mind with faith so you experience a truly marvelous brain-and-soul-washing.

The ugliness of hate is washed from the mind; all sin are forgiven. The inner cleanness thus gained is an amazing source of high spirits.

Receive God's Blessing

Our spirits rise when we learn how to receive the abundance of good things God wants to give to us. The secret is in two verses:

So I say to you, ask, and it will be given to you; seek, and you will find; knock, and it will be open to you. For everyone who ask receives, and he who seeks finds, and to him who knocks it will be opened. Luke 11:9-10

Note that the word ask is immediately followed by the word will be given; that directly after the word seek are the words you will find; and that quickly after the word knock is assurance that it will be opened. It is to emphasize that everyone who seek finds, and to all who knock the storehouse is opened.

Therefore, confidently ask. Then visualize yourself as now receiving; seek, then affirm that you have found; knock, then believe that God's storehouse is opened.

Practice receiving. Believe that you have been given. Then feel your spirits lift as you realize that God's blessings are actually showered upon you.

Refreshment of Spirit

Repent therefore and be converted, that your sins may be blotted out, so that times of refreshing may come from the presence of the Lord. Acts 3:19

When the rain bring the miracle of earth's renewal, it is, indeed, a "time of refreshing." a similar process occurs in human life. By wrong thinking and misdeeds, the freshness of mind and soul fades. If we are spiritually changed, "times of refreshing" come from the presence of the Lord. How clean, fresh and delightful life then becomes!

Cast Your Care on God

In maintaining a high spirit, it is important to cultivate the attitude of spiritual surrender. Place yourself, your interests, hopes and purposes completely in God's hands.

Therefore humble yourself under the mighty hand of God, that He may exalt you in due time, casting all your care upon Him, for He cares for you. 1 Peter 5:6-7

If we surrender our selves to the direction of God, being guided by His hand, He will exalt us —He will help us attain our purposes and rise above all defeats. Cast all your care upon God; He cares for you. This is a supreme Spirit Lifter!

Faith, Hope and Love

The best three-point formula for living is in this immortal statement:

And now abide faith, hope, love, these three; but the greatest of these is love. 1 Corinthians 13:13

Worry is Selfishness in Disguise

And he that doubteth is damned if he eat, because he eateth not of faith: for whatsoever is not of faith is sin.
Romans 14:23 KJV

Too often, people give in to worry without realizing how deadly it is. When you get to the root of it, worry is a sin. Worry certainly doesn't come out of faith, and Romans 14:23 (AMP) states that "whatever does not originate and proceed from faith is sin."

Most of the time, worry is based on

one sin in particular: selfishness. Usually when we worry, we're concerned about how our selfish desires are not being fulfilled. The more selfish desires you have, the more you have to worry about, and the more complicated your life becomes.

God wants us to simply focus on serving Him.

It is God's will that we live our lives free from all anxiety and distressing care. He wants us to be free to serve Him without being 'drawn in diverging directions' (1 Corinthians 7:34 AMP). We

must not allow the worries of this world to divert us from His purpose for our lives.

Seek to rid yourself of selfish desires. This will keep your life simple and give you less to worry about. Then you can wholeheartedly pursue God's great plan for your life.

Prayer Starter: Father God, thank You for showing me that worry is a sin. Help me to get rid of my selfish, ungodly desires so that I can simply pursue Your density for me.

Understanding Grace, Walking In Faith

"For by grace are ye saved through faith and that not of yourselves; it is the gift of God:" *Ephesians 2:8 KJV*

Most of us are aware that it is by grace that we are saved, but I wonder how many people truly understand the power of God's grace.

Everything we receive from God must come by grace through faith. But all knowledge of faith must be built on a clear understanding of grace, because even faith

comes to us by grace, as a gift.

When you understand grace, you can walk in faith and receive God's blessings.

God's grace isn't complicated or confusing. It is simple, and that's why many people miss it. There is nothing more powerful than grace. Everything in the Bible, salvation, the infilling of the Holy Spirit, fellowship with God and victory in our daily lives, is based on it. Without grace, we are nothing, we have nothing, we can do nothing.

Today, don't just hear about grace, but understand that everything in our lives depends not on our merits or abilities or works, but on God's willingness to use His infinite power to meet our needs. This is grace.

Focus on that truth today, and watch your faith grow.

Prayer Starter: God, I don't just want to hear about Your grace without grasping its real power. Help me to understand how wonderful Your grace is so that my faith in You can grow.

Getting What You Don't Deserve

For innumerable evils have compassed me about: mine iniquities have taken hold upon me, so that I am not able to look up; they are more than the hairs of mine head: therefore my heart faileth me. *Psalms 40:12 KJV*

The vast majority of people allow God to help them only when they think they deserve it. At one time in my life I was that way. For years I allowed God to help me only when I thought I had earned it, when I thought I had done enough good deeds to deserve His help.

That kind of thinking doesn't produce an attitude of gratitude and thanksgiving. If we think we deserve what we receive, then it is no longer a gift but a reward or "payment for services rendered." The difference between receiving what we do not deserve and receiving what we do deserve is the difference between grace and works.

I encourage you to open your heart and allow God's grace to come into your life to help you in your everyday walk. Always remember that when you feel frustrated, it is because you are living by

your own effort and need to get back into God's grace by allowing Him to work through you.

Learn to let God do you a favor. Give up trying to deserve God's help, and let Him supply your every need.

Prayer Starter: I realize the foolishness of only accepting Your help when I feel like I deserve it. I give up on my own works and receive Your grace. Thank You for helping me in every situation, even when I don't deserve it.

Take Off The Mask

"But we all, with open face beholding as in a glass the glory, even as by the Spirit of the Lord."
2 Corinthians 3:18

So many times we act one way on the outside, but we're actually different on the inside. Because we have weaknesses, faults and fears, things that we think make us less likeable or desirable, we'd rather hide them from other people. So we wear masks.

The danger of wearing a mask is that it misrepresents us. What other people see is a lie. It's not who we are or who we were born to be. We can change the outside, but we can't change who we really are deep down inside.

We need to realize that God loves us just the way we are right now, and His love for us will never diminish.

And there's more good news. Second Corinthians 3:18 says that God

is changing us and making us more like Himself and fixing the flaws we want to cover up.

Trust Him enough to take off the mask. You will find, as I have, that you are being changed, little by little, into the very image of your Lord.

Prayer Starter: Lord, I realize that I often try to wear a mask in order to fit in and find acceptance. Today, I make a decision to find my acceptance in You. As You overwhelm me with Your love, continue to change me into Your great image.

A Bird's Eye View Of The Bible

Old Testament

There are 39 books in the Old Testament library.
There are four types of writing in the Old Testament:
Law, History, Poetry, Prophecy.

It is helpful to know which kind of literature you are reading before you start: is it poetry, or is it history?

LAW

Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers, Deuteronomy.

The first five books of the Bible are sometimes called the Law of Moses. They give many of God's laws about how to live.

HISTORY

Joshua, Judges, Ruth, 1&2 Samuel, 1&2 Kings, 1&2 Chronicles, Ezra, Nehemiah, Esther.

These 12 historical books cover the occupation of the Promised Land, the time of the Judges, Israel's kings, the fall of the two kingdoms and a return to Jerusalem.

POETRY

Job, Psalms, Proverbs, Ecclesiastes, Song of Songs.

Nearly one third of the Old Testament is written in poetry. These five poetical books ask profound questions about evil, pain, love, wisdom and God.

PROPHECY

Isaiah, Jeremiah, Lamentations, Ezekiel, Daniel, Hosea, Joel, Amos, Obadiah, Jonah, Micah, Nahum, Habakkuk, Zephaniah, Haggai, Zechariah, Malachi.

The 17 prophetic books account for almost a quarter of the Bible. They are divided into "Major Prophets" (the first five books) and "Minor Prophets" (the last 12). The "Minor" ones are shorter, not less important.

New Testament

There are 27 books in the New Testament library.
There are three types of writing in the New Testament:
History, Letters, Prophecy.

Before you study a New Testament book it helps to consider what kind of literature you are reading: is it a letter or is it history?

HISTORY

Matthew, Mark, Luke, John, Acts

The first four books, called gospels, are not like our modern biographies. But they do give four portraits of Jesus. Acts is part two of Luke, about the early church.

LETTERS

PAUL'S LETTERS

Romans, 1 Corinthians, 2 Corinthians, Galatians, Ephesians, Philippians, Colossians, 1 Thessalonians, 2 Thessalonians, 1 Timothy, 2 Timothy, Titus, Philemon.

We have 13 of Paul's letters. Except for one personal one, Philemon, they were all written to groups of Christians.

OTHER LETTERS

Hebrews, James, 1 Peter, 2 Peter, 1 John, 2 John, 3 John, Jude.

We don't know who wrote Hebrews. Tradition states that all the writers of the New Testament, except for John, were martyred.

PROPHECY

Revelation

Written by the apostle John, this book has seven letters to churches and numerous visions about God.

PROMPTED TO PRAY

I constantly remember you in my prayers. 2 Timothy 1:3

Several years ago I was prompted to pray for you often, and I wonder why.”

That text message from an old friend came with a photo of a note she'd kept in her Bible: "Pray for James. Cover mind, thoughts, words." beside my name she'd recorded three separate years.

I looked at the years and caught my breath. I wrote back and asked what month she began to pray. She responded, "Sometime around July."

That was the month I was preparing to leave home for extended study aboard. I would be facing an unfamiliar culture and language and have my faith challenged like never before. As I looked at the note, I realized I'd received the precious gift of generous prayer.

My friend's kindness reminded me of another "prompting" to pray, Paul's instruction to his young missionary friend Timothy: "I urge, then, first of all, that petitions, prayers, intercession and thanksgiving be made for all people" (1 Timothy 2:1). The phrase "first of all" indicates highest priority. Our prayers matter, Paul explains, because God "wants all people to be saved and to come to a knowledge of the truth" about Jesus (V.4).

God moves through faithful prayer in countless ways to encourage others and draw them near to Himself. We may not know someone's circumstances when they come to mind, but God does. And He'll help that person as we pray!

Who comes to mind that needs your prayers in this new year?
How can you remind yourself to pray for them often?

Loving God, please help me to pray often and make a lasting difference in other's lives through my intercession for them.

Bible Reading: 1 Timothy 2:1-8
¹ I urge, then, first of all, that petitions, prayers, intercession and thanksgiving be made for all people—² for kings and all those in authority, that we may live peaceful and quiet lives in all godliness and holiness. ³ this is good, and pleases God our Savior, ⁴ who wants all people to be saved and to come to a knowledge of the truth. ⁵ For there is one God and one mediator between God and mankind, the man Christ Jesus, ⁶ who gave himself as a ransom for all people. This has now been witnessed to at the proper time. ⁷ And for this purpose I was appointed a herald and an apostle—I am telling the truth, I am not lying—and a true and faith teacher of the Gentiles.

⁸ Therefore I want the men everywhere to pray, lifting up holy hands without anger or disputing.

Insight

One of the ways we pray for all people is by praying for authorities (1 Timothy 2:1-2). Such praying contributes to "all people" being able to "live peaceful and quiet lives in all godliness and holiness" under leaders who take their responsibilities seriously. Notice the two pairs of ideas Paul is presenting as the goal of these prayers. The first pair, "peaceful and quiet," refers to a dual focus of calm. Vincent's Word Studies tells us that "peaceful" speaks of a lack of outward disturbance and "quiet" refers to "tranquility arising from within." The second pair of ideas, "godliness and holiness," speak to how we live out our faith. "Godliness" refers to a life that flows out of a right belief in God, while "holiness" speaks of respectful behavior. To pray for "all those in authority" (v.2) would have been difficult for Timothy, given the political upheaval and generally anti-Christian sentiment in the Roman Empire at that time. Bill Crowder
