PASTOR'S MESSAGE...

"Now the Lord is the Spirit, and where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is freedom. And all of us, with unveiled faces, seeing the glory of the Lord as though reflected in a mirror, are being transformed into the same image from one degree of glory to another; for this comes from the Lord, the Spirit."

(2 Corinthians 3:17-18)



So..."What's Next?' is a question that the Session has been discussing for a number of months, and in a variety of ways. It began in 2015 when I arrived as your designated pastor, because: a) it's a most natural question to wonder for anyone who cares about First Presbyterian Church and its future; and also b) such a discussion was a specific expectation of the presbytery for a designated pastor and congregation relationship.

Of course, "what's next?" is always what we all wonder—it doesn't have to be an assignment or anyone's expectation of us. You as a congregation were wondering that months before I ever showed up on the scene—and I know you are more-than-curious about "what's next?" as the Session (acting as the search committee) is actively involved at present in discerning who among this search's candidates will give you pastoral leadership next.

Continue to pray for the Session in their efforts. Engage yourself in the updated information they provide to the congregation as they know more. And prepare yourself to be a receptive, supportive, and adaptive member of the church family when that transition takes place however many months out in the church's future that will be.

That—is a glimpse of the "what's next?" discussion for the church as a whole. But what about *for you*—personally and spiritually? What do you look forward to? What do you wonder about? What are you uncertain or anxious—or even worried about? What are you hopeful and encouraged about? "What's next?" for you?

In my remaining time with you as pastor—the rest of the 2017 year—let me offer to you two things—an *open invitation* and a strong *word of encouragement*...as you prepare personally for "What's next?".

First, is an open invitation for you to feel free to call upon me to talk together about anything that is on your mind: any topic, question, concern, venting—anything for which you would like a listening ear, or any answers, encouragement, or direction I can give. I would like to be as available and helpful to you personally as you would like...over this next half-year or so, before we complete our pastor-congregation relationship at my retirement.

I believe most of us have developed a relationship with one another that is familiar, trusting, and comfortable. Are there any questions or topics that you would like to visit about, regarding, as examples: personal faith; church life or issues; ways God may be calling you to serve or volunteer; spiritual or theological topics; salvation and eternity; faith issues and contemporary issues, or just about anything else. The resident pastor (me) is here and available, and willing to try to be helpful and useful with your topics.

A phone call, an email, catching me after worship—whatever works best for you to then arrange an opportunity for us over topics—is the invitation I would like to offer.

Second, my word of encouragement to you all—as a congregation who clearly loves your church—is: Do your best to prepare and position yourself to adapt to "what's next?". And "what's next?" will not be just a new pastor (to listen to) - but a new partner in ministry with whom to merge your faith journey and calling with hers or his—for united direction together as First Presbyterian Church of Bismarck.

I know—it is way easier said than done (especially by some almost ex-pastor who will be "riding off into the sunset of retirement.") But consider the following realities:

- 1– Change will be happening.
- 2– Change is inevitable in the church, always (and in every single aspect of life).
- 3– How can I ready myself for a new beginning, taking responsibility for myself?
- 4— How can I contribute positively to the church being ready for a new beginning?

5– How can I, and we, be as accepting and welcoming, adaptable and assertive as possible for the new pastor who eventually will partner with us?

6– Pray: "Lord, make me an instrument of your peace" in this congregation.

My late father-in-law gave the following advice to me when I was in seminary, offered to this pastor-in-training. As a life-long Presbyterian, who served maybe a half-dozen terms on his Session, he said: "David, pastors come and go—but the church belongs to the members!" I never have forgotten it.

Sure, the transition I am referring to is still months away—and yet, it also is taking place now. In fact, "what's next?" is always happening—it's never *not* happening, in our lives and our faith—and in the church.

Let me know if I can be helpful to you.

FINE ARTS FESTIVAL OFFERS NEW LOOK

Special donations were made to three Bismarck arts groups by the Fine Arts Festival steering committee at a recent meeting. Liliana Norby of Theo Art School, Teri Storhaug of Central Dakota Children's Choir and Alicia McNeil representing Capital Shakespeare Traveling Troupe. Each received \$500.00 to promote their programs. This reflects the committee's mission of promoting youth artists.

Teri Fay, Artistic Director of Central Dakota Children's Choir, in a letter of gratitude stated, "Every year we have children/families who find it impossible, for whatever reason, to be able to afford tuition for CDCC. We do everything we can to hold the cost down, but even then there are still circumstances when some are not able to pay. Thanks to you, some families will be able to see that their child, who loves to sing, is able to follow that path with CDCC."

In other FAF news, the 2017 Festival has been set for Friday and Saturday, October 27 and 28 at the church according to Festival co-chairs Gaylene Massey and Jan Schultz. The Prairie Plein Art Artists' group will be this year's featured artists and will present their own exhibit as well as their own contest as part of the show. Plein Art comes from the French and refers to artists working in nature to produce artwork. If weather permits the group will paint on-site at the church, which will be called urban scenes because, although they will be working outdoors, they will not be working in nature. They will also stage an on-site evening of painting outdoors August 2nd at the church. Larry Maslowski is chair of this group. Deadline for all artwork is October 6.

This year's Festival will offer a coffee house instead of the traditional high tea. The Westminster Chimes will participate the morning of October 28th with caramel rolls and coffee. The Festival Committee will continue in the afternoon with coffee and treats. The shortened Festival will open with the Preview Party Friday evening, October 27th in Ramstad Hall and will be open to the public.

July 25th, 2017

CLERK'S REPORT

Membership is 507. Several deaths which had been missed were recorded: Carl Fink, 12/6/2016; James Steinert, 9/2/2016; Harold Van Heuvelen, 4/26/2017; Robert Wahl, 4/17/2015. Janet Smaltz passed away on July 14th; her funeral service at the church was July 22nd.

Session approved the baptism request of Leah and Ryan Mowan for the baptism of Jameson Arley Mowan on September 3rd. Great grandparents are Arley and Ann Gallup and grandmother is Tammy Lelm.

A thank you letter from Rev. Sarah Bigwood of Valley Community Presbyterian Church was read.

It was noted that the per capita received in July showed a substantial increase and will be reflected in the August report.

PASTOR'S REPORT

Pastor Reiter will offer to meet with any congregation member who may have questions or who want to share ideas. "What's Next" Parts 2 and 3 from the Designated Pastor Call and Covenant will be discussed by Session, looking at current issues which should lead to a vision as best we can view the future. Pastor David will be on vacation August 11-16 and will be in MN the week of August 28.

COMMITTEE REPORTS (from minutes and meetings)

Outreach—Gladys Cairns asked FPC to be a collaborative group for Youth Works. In order for Youth Works to apply for a federal grant, they need several groups to "sign". This is not a request for financial aid and FPC has supported Youth Works in the past. Session approved having the church be a supportive group.

David Massey has agreed to serve as Co-Chair of Outreach. He will continue to serve on Administrative and Personnel. Session also agreed that if the chair is not available to sign vouchers, the co-chair can.

Administrative and Personnel—Session approved using \$6,000 from Endowments/Memorials to fund most of the Wi-Fi installation throughout the church. Administrative/Personnel committee budget will cover the remaining \$1,224.

SESSION HIGHLIGHTS

Stewardship—Steve Adair is the chair of the fall campaign. All congregation members will have a personal visit/conversation either the week of October 8 or 15. Pledge cards and information will be delivered at that time. Theme of the sermon on October 22 will be "Joyful Generosity" and congregation members will be invited to share blessings. October 29 the sermon topic will be "Catch the Giving Spirit"; a luncheon will follow the service. 30-40 people will be needed as visitors and will have a training session. There will be an opportunity for congregation members to join the special stewardship campaign committee which will work for three months, August-October.

Property and Equipment—Session approved the use of \$8,990 from Endowments/Memorials to pay Myhre Concrete Design for work on the area in front of the Child Care Center doors. A letter from Bismarck Engineering requested the church have a plan to replace the uneven sidewalks on the south side of the church. Trees may have to be removed. Property and Equipment members will meet with the city to discuss the sidewalk/tree issues.

Membership—Back to Church Sunday will be September 10th with a light breakfast. Papa's Pumpkin Patch picnic will be September 16.

Child Care Center Board—A banner to advertise the fundraising for the outdoor classroom has been completed for a cost less than \$100. The center is close to the goal for this year.

OPERATIONS MANUAL

Session agreed that the insurance policies would continue to be maintained by Property and Equipment. Business and Finance and Administrative and Personnel Committees would be consulted if there are questions relating to their areas.

BACK TO SCHOOL TIPS FOR PARENTS

With a well-rounded summer vacation ending, parents spend a lot of time getting their kids ready for school. New school supplies, haircuts, and special end-of summer outings all play into the back-to-school routine. There are some other things that parents can do for themselves and their kids to ensure a smooth transition into the school year, too. Take a look below at a few ways to get this year off to a great start in your house.



- ◆ Set up a bedtime and wake-up routine in advance. If possible, it is best to establish bedtimes and wake-up times two weeks in advance of the start of the school. By the time the first bell rings, kids will already be on the right sleep schedule and it will be one less worry for your family.
- Get to know the teachers. There will be open houses, orientations, and other meet & greet options at the beginning of the school year for you to attend and get to know your kids' teachers. If you are unable to attend any of these, try to find a few minutes before or after school to connect with the teachers, or at the very least, send an introductory email that includes how you can help during the school year, however big or small.
- Plan healthy lunches and snacks. The better you plan out the meals in your home, the healthier choices you will make for your kids. When you pack protein-rich snacks and lunches, balanced with fruits, and vegetables, and other wholesome items, you ensure that your children will have energy and brainpower to make it through their school days.
- ♦ Organize clothing. Of course you will need to donate or otherwise get rid of the clothing that your kids have outgrown, but you should also take the time to carefully organize what is left. From there, decide what items you may need more of before school begins.
- Set up a staging area. Find a central spot to store everything related to school, including backpacks, upcoming outfits, and a dry-erase calendar with family schedules. Try to keep this area free of clutter and other non-school items so that you can find what you need, when you need it—and quickly. Have the kids help you stock it with school-related items and keep it clean and functional. Find some inspiration here.
- ◆ Update medical records. Most schools will let you know if your shot records are out of date, but why not go beyond that? Make sure teachers and administrators have a complete list of any medical concerns regarding your kids, including allergies. You will also want to be sure that all emergency contacts are up to date.
- Talk to your kids about bullying. Research shows that one in three kids experience bullying at some point in their school career—and in the increasingly digital world, the consequences can be extreme. Make sure your kids understand the right way to treat their peers, and when to speak up if they see someone else being bullied. Also make sure they know when to come to you if they feel they are being bullied.
- ◆ Ask your kids about their concerns. The start of school is exciting, but can also bring some anxiety—especially when it comes to the unknown. Take a few minutes to ask your kids what they are most looking forward to during the school year, and what things may worry them. By giving them a forum to express their concerns, you can help them work through any worries in advance of school starting and clear up any issues that could lead to a bumpy start to the year.
