pastor's letter from pastor paul

“Then Jesus said to His disciples, “Whoever wants to be My disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross and follow Me.” Matthew 22:6

It's May! There are always events that are lifted up... Mother's Day and Memorial Day. Many schools celebrate graduation ceremonies. Along with graduations, Hope will recognize graduating seniors on May 21st at the 9:30 Service, and that evening the Ministerial will provide a Baccalaureate Service at the School.

Celebration, transitions and milestones are themes for graduating seniors.

As graduations approach, have you ever thought about a 'graduation ceremony' for the Christian? Without writing a major theological paper, it would certainly be appropriate that our graduation ceremony would be heaven... the ultimate celebration, the ultimate transition and the ultimate milestone.

BUT... let's back up for a moment. Are there graduating moments for the Christian? Are we to graduate from Sunday School, or Friday School, or Confirmation classes, or a Bible Study class? And of course we would say we have completed 'the course'. We may 'graduate' from classes, but we never graduate from discipleship. In other words, we do not graduate from the Christian life.

Since we are to take Jesus' Word for daily living... do we ever graduate? The above verse says deny yourself, take up your cross, and follow Jesus. Does that mean for a day, a week, a year or all your life? I think we would all agree that this verse and these words are for a lifetime! There is never a graduation. Just think, for a lifetime, we are to...

Deny yourself- We are to forget one's self, lose sight of one's self and one's own interests. It's about Jesus.

Take up your cross- We raise up or elevate the cross above our own desires.

Follow Jesus- We are not to back out, turn around, or lay down the cross. We are to follow Jesus at all costs.

The old Hymn, **“WHEN I SURVEY THE WONDROUS CROSS”**, says it well in all four verses. The fourth verse, the last line interprets discipleship clearly:

**Love so amazing, so divine,
Demands my soul, my life, my all!**

We are called to go after Jesus... to be like Jesus... Every day!

Youth Stewardship

You've probably been involved in planting a vegetable or flower garden, and you've realized that the more seeds you plant, the more plants you get. The Apostle Paul used the analogy of sowing and reaping (planting and harvesting) in relation to money. He wrote, *"Whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly and whoever sows generously will also reap generously"* (2 Corinthians 9:6).

You know that, if you plant a seed here and there, you'll get a plant here and there, and the result will not be especially pleasing. Sowing sparingly yields sparse results. So it is with money. If you give generously, you will reap for yourself and others great benefits. Paul went on to say, *"Each man should give what he has decided in his heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver"* (vs. 7). In other words, you should give willingly, not because it is a duty or because your parents make you give. Of course, the church can use money given under duress just as well as that given freely!

Unfortunately, you will not be blessed because, as Paul wrote, *"God loves a cheerful giver,"* not the reluctant giver. Giving because you're forced to is actually sowing sparingly, even if you give a large amount.

Giving and expecting rewards for giving is not really giving; it's trading. Yet God longs to give us blessings, and those blessings just seem to follow when we carry out His will. *"God is able to make all grace abound to you, so that in all things at all times, having all that you need, you will abound in every good work"* (vs. 8). Look at all these blessings poured on the cheerful giver!

All grace will **abound** to you! There will be no end to the grace God will give you in your life.

In **all** things, at **all** times, you'll have **all** you need!

You will **abound** in **every** good work! God will continue to use you in building up His kingdom.

What are you waiting for? *Go* do some sowing!

Think about it:

Read 2 Corinthians 8 and 9.

Memorize 2 Corinthians 9:6-8.

Start putting aside some of your money for the offering on Sunday morning.

Let's pray: Dear Father in heaven, thank You for calling me to be a cheerful giver. Thank You for Your promise to provide for all my needs, and even beyond, so that I will always have the means to give. Forgive me when I hold on too tightly to "my" money and clear my vision so I can see the needs of others as more important than my own wants. In Jesus' name. Amen.


