April 21, 2019 Easter Sunday of the Resurrection of the Lord Jn 20:1-9

Dear St Pius X and St Anthony Church,

Happy Easter! Jesus is alive! Considering Friday's terrible events leading to Jesus' brutal death, we may have questioned what would become of His teaching and life-example. But, come Easter morning, we know: 'He Lives'! His resurrection vindicates the 1) power of love overcoming violence, 2) grace overcoming sin, and 3) life overcoming death. Many detractors had sowed doubt and opposed His graceful manner and gospel manifesto. Leading up to the cross, and even while he hung upon the cross, people had mocked him saying, "Let him save himself if he is the chosen one, the Messiah of God" (Luke 23:35) and "Are you not the Messiah? Save yourself and us."(Luke 23:39). Yet, Jesus' peaceful and patient trust in the Father's Plan carried Him through the walk up Calvary Hill. Jesus did not force his vindication, he did not flaunt his 'messiah role', nor did He parade the divine justice coming. With no bitter vengeance in Him, he loved to the end, trusting the result of salvation. Luke 23:34 even had Jesus suffering on the cross, and speaking conciliatory words of peace, "Father, forgive them, they know not what they do." That is the seed of resurrection. The grace of Divine Forgiveness that so enters the person receiving it, that it touches the hardest and darkest places of the heart, enlightening and softening the heart to start over, completely reorienting its outlook. Consider the centurion at the cross, who had seen been part of the inhumane, barbaric cruelty against Jesus, who is so touched by Jesus' loving response that Luke 23:47 says he-the centurion-"glorified God and said, "This man was innocent beyond doubt." Does he believe, now? God seeks everyone's redemption. It is all new!

What about that seemingly irrelevant detail about the burial cloths? Interestingly, they are mentioned two times in this Easter morning reading? First John 21:5 "he (the beloved disciple) bent down and <u>saw the burial cloths there</u>, but did not go in the tomb. And then they are mentioned in the next two verses 6-7, "When Simon Peter arrived after him, he went into the tomb and <u>saw the</u> <u>burial cloths</u> there, <u>and the cloth that had covered his head</u>, not with the burial cloths but rolled up in a separate place." The Beloved Disciple and Peter had raced to the tomb after having been told by Mary Magdalene that the tomb was empty. The beloved disciple noticed the 'burial cloths remaining behind', but Peter then took special note of two cloths, the body <u>and</u> head pieces, and that the head piece was set apart separately and rolled up. Why the special note of the head cloth carefully folded up by itself?

Jesus took the time to make up His bed after resurrecting! I like the story of the child (?) who was told by his mother to make his bed, and he replied, "Do I have to?" So, the mother said back, "If taking time to straighten the sheets was important to Jesus after rising from the dead, then you are definitely going to make up your bed, too!" I have to admit that as a kid, my favorite excuse for not making up the bed was "But I don't know how", to which my mom said, "Then <u>Today is the day</u> you learn. Make it up!"

So what about that detail? Some suggest that since Peter is the One who notices the head cloth folded up, that it signifies Peter's role as head of the apostles. Peter certainly served that leading role, as his name is always first in listings of the apostles given by the gospel writers. Jesus did say, "You are Peter and on such 'Rock' I will build my church" (Matthew 16:18). Such a detail does show Peter's insightful leadership, but the detail's more likely significance on Resurrection morning is that it serves as significant proof and validation of what really happened to Jesus' body. He rose from the dead! What I mean is that the Roman and Sanhedrin Detractors used the gossip mill like web trolls, to deny/dispute Jesus' resurrection by claiming the apostles had stolen Jesus' body. But for any burial cloths to be found at all testifies to the presence of a body. And most convincing of all, if such a body was stolen, who would take the time to fold up the cloths properly. If you are a body thief, you grab the goods and run. And who would leave the tomb with an exposed body, and Jesus' body is so easily identifiable with distinctive torture marks and wounds? So the fact of the 1) cloths remaining behind, and 2) the head cloth all meticulously folded up and set aside, demonstrates that Jesus had a leisurely awakening from the dead. He wants to be discovered, and takes his time like any other Sunday Driver! We will hear about him being out on the road, alive and well, in the coming weeks as He appears in different places and to different people, especially the two disciples on the Road to Emmaus (Luke 24)! He is Alive!
