

## World Conference 2019




From the first day when we celebrated the anniversary of the Temple to the closing Worship service, World Conference was a wonderful experience.

This year's conference was unique because it began with a celebration of the 25<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the dedication of the Temple. We were led in worship by the First Presidency to commemorate the Temple and what it means for us to become people of the Temple. President Emeritus Wallace B. Smith offered a prayer for peace that was based on the first prayer for peace offered in the Temple in 1993.

We moved from the Temple Sanctuary to the World Plaza to watch the Flag Ceremony that typically starts World Conference. A new Peace Pillar on the Plaza was dedicated by the Council of Twelve Apostles as they read to the assembly the word for peace in each

language where the church has a presence in the world. Peace is inscribed on the pillar in these 90 plus languages. This was a wonderful celebration and it was just the first afternoon of conference.



Through the week we shared together in worship, in spiritual formation, in fellowship and in the business of the church.



I will share some highlights for me.

The Communion Service on Sunday: Being in the Auditorium Conference Chambers sharing with so many people in communion is a spirit filled experience. What particularly struck me this year was watching the servers descending the stairs from the rostrum with the emblems as they were preparing to serve us. There was such great diversity in the servers – women and men, young and old, from many different cultures, some dressed in the garb from their native country. It impressed upon me that we truly are a World church.

The music: I am always particularly touched by music and this week was no different. From the beautiful organs in both facilities to the international choirs to the conference body singing together in rich harmony, the music during the week filled my soul.

The legislative sessions: Many people may find these sessions long and boring (I suppose I did on some days) but I always find it very interesting to be part of the decision making and business of the church. 

## Beyond Resistance

Book Recommendation by Brad A. Martell



*Beyond Resistance: The Institutional Church Meets the Postmodern World.*  
By John Dorhauer. Chicago, IL: Exploration Press, 2015. 158 pp.

*Beyond Resistance* reminds us that “the church was birthed for mission.” However, living out mission in today’s context has many challenges. The Rev. Dr. John C. Dorhauer, currently serving as ninth General Minister and President of the United Church of Christ, shares his observations and experiences to address some of the realities facing the institutional church today for living out mission.

In chapter one “Death and Dignity” Dorhauer considers three important realities: 1) declining birthrates in the United States has found us with an oversupply of churches and too few people to fill them; 2) related to birthrates is the growing expense of maintaining our aging properties (i.e., church buildings and campgrounds) and the critical question if our properties are truly serving missional purposes; and 3) the cultural changes related to postmodernity – specifically people’s rejection of universal truth, how people are learning differently, and distrust of institutional authority. Chapter 2 “Mission Resources” explores how the church is birth for mission, how mission requires discernment and trust in the Spirit, and discovering new missional partners. Chapter 3 “Grieving, Believing, Perceiving” highlights the process of grieving the loss of declining membership and ending ministries; the difficult decisions in the face of change, and perceiving or seeing the vision of hope beyond the time of grief and pain.

Chapter four “2.0 and 3.0” Dorhauer, admitting to an oversimplification of Christian history and the radical changes Christianity has experienced, divides church history into three periods: before the Reformation he refers to as the church 1.0, after the Reformation as the church 2.0, and whatever is emerging now as church 3.0. The next chapters “Postmodernity and Authority,” “New Metrics,” and “A Growing Multiplicity focus on aspects of church 1.0, 2.0, and how 3.0 is emerging. The ending chapters “Reimagine,” “The Mount,” and “The Emergent Desert,” offer examples of emerging 3.0 missional expressions. The concluding chapter “What, Then, Are We to Say about These Things?” offers a good summary of the whole book that is intended to start conversations about mission.

*Beyond Resistance* is a good resource for congregations. Although not a comprehensive analysis of the complex realities facing the church as we engage in mission, it offers thoughtful large brushstrokes of information, questions, and examples. I highly recommend this missional resource.

# News Around the Mission Center

The Whitehall, MT congregation has long supported the Butte Rescue Mission which is a homeless shelter in Butte, MT. This past year the mission lost its facilities when they didn't meet with the fire standards and safety codes. They have spent over a year finding and funding a new site for the Rescue Mission. We were asked to help make and provide new blankets for the new facilities which due to several delays will not open until March or later this year. ## Spiritual Formation and Companionship Program

This is a three-year formation and training program for spiritual seekers, companions and leaders. Let's hear from one of the participants.

Walking onto the Happy Valley Campground I sensed a spirit of love and welcoming from each of those who were called to serve us and who had been praying for us. Terry and I remarked that we felt as one with the group from the beginning. All nervousness about this program fell away. I think all those who came were just hungry for connection with God from the start.

When the first class by Laurie Gordon ended, I felt like dancing before God! Laurie, a retired Research Biologist, Spiritual Director and Evangelist in Community of Christ, showed us how God is always beyond our understanding of God. I was filled with humility and joy. Her classes were only part of the experience of worship I was blessed to enjoy.

When around 100 voices joined together to sing, I wondered if people were chosen because of their ability to sing. The worship leader was Katie Harmon-Mclaughlin, a Spiritual Formation Specialist. I came so needy and I was not let down. The Spiritual Formation Team taught us many ways to connect with God: Holy Attention, Lectio Divina, Centering Prayer, Contemplative Prayer, Dwelling in the Word, Prayer of Examen and more.

We walked among the redwoods; hiked the mountain behind us; ate delicious, nutritious food; and visited with old and new friends. In small covenant discipleship groups, we shared stories of our own journeys and learned how to listen to others.

I came to this experience feeling so flat and in need of uplift. I'm now so excited to continue on this journey with others and with God. I believe God has brought me to this place and I feel thankful that God has never let me down on my journey.
