Have you taken a look at the calendar for November yet? Post 132 is hopping! We will be celebrating the birthday of the US Marine Corps. I believe that is 248 years as a powerful force for our national peace and security. I salute every Marine and thank each of you for your service to our great nation.

Immediately following is Veterans Day. We will support the City Veteran's Day event at Depot Park then all are invited to the Post for the pot luck and social time (details on flyer, Page 21). Speaking of 11/11, wrestling is back! Naturally, at the end of the month, we have Thanksgiving and an opportunity to reflect on our families, our freedom and those who protect us every day. In the middle there will be football, Tuesday and Friday nights and lots of other events. Come on down to the Post!

Membership renewals are off to a great start but we are not done yet. If you have not renewed, your membership expires on 12/31/2023. Don't let your membership lapse and lose your many benefits of membership. You can renew your membership at the Post. Just see any officer or the clubroom staff. You can renew online and even print your own membership card by navigating to <https://www.legion.org/renew>. You can also mail in your renewal with the invoice that will show up in your mailbox soon. Let's hit 100% before the end of the year! It is absolutely within our reach, with your help.

You may have heard that National will be raising their portion of the annual dues by \$5 starting in July, 2024. It is very likely that the Department of California will follow suit in the near future. Only a small portion of your annual \$50 dues actually go to the Post. We send \$18.50 to National, \$15.00 to the Department of California, and \$1 to District 29. This equates to \$34.50 out of every renewal that does not stay at the Post. In the new Legion year, if we don't act, our income from dues will reduce by 1/3.

We increased dues for the first time in several years only to have that increase absorbed by National starting next Legion year. Just your dues do not pay for our building upkeep, utilities, insurance, etc. All of our events really keep us thriving, but it is time to look at the dues again, unfortunately. We will be discussing this at the next several meetings so it is important for you to come down on the second Thursday at 7pm and get the facts. We need your input and support.

Comrades and Friends!

POST ACTIVITIES. Your Post 132 staff and officers are working diligently and creatively to make available to you a wide range of activities unlike almost any other Legion or VFW post I am aware of. Be sure to review this and every Bugle thoroughly to see the many, many activities taking place and take advantage of them. A lot of imagination, planning and effort are invested in making Post 132 an interesting place for everyone.

DD214 ORDERS. As your Post and District 29 Judge Advocate, one of the most common inquiries I get is: "How do I get a copy of a DD214,?" either from a Veteran who lost his/hers or from a family member of a now deceased Veteran needed for Auxiliary or Sons of the American Legion membership. So, here are some alternatives:

Commercial Services. There are many businesses that assist in getting DD-214s quickly but they charge a fee for their help. A seemingly reasonable provider is "dd214direct.com" whose basic fee is \$79. Expedited service apparently costs \$99. They can be reached at 877/901-7948 or by going to their internet site: dd214direct.com. THERE ARE MANY OTHERS AND YOU WILL FIND THEM ONLINE BY JUST TYPING IN THE WORDS "DD214" IN YOUR BROWSER SEARCH BAR. I assume no responsibility for any of them.

Free Government Services. The National Personnel Records Center ("NPRC") will process your request online or by mail. You complete and submit government form SF-180 online (archives.gov/personnel-records-center/dd-214), or download the form from that site and mail it to "National Personnel Records Center, 1 Archives Dr., St. Louis, MO 63138". There is typically no fee.

The other free services are by contacting the local office of your US Congressperson, or a local Veteran Service Office, or me (I have limited copies of SF-180 for your completion and mailing to the NPRC).

Remember our mutual commitment to the Preamble to the American Legion Constitution and the Legion's Four Pillars (Veterans Affairs & Rehabilitation; National Security; Americanism; Children & Youth); and most of all remember our commitment to our National Constitution and Country though if you are a veteran, that reminder is normally not necessary.

Post 132 continues to operate ever mindful of any and all legalities. Should you become aware of some potential legal problem for the Post, please inform me at your earliest opportunity so it can be addressed. If I can be of any help to you, feel free to contact me 24/7/365.

STORIES FROM THE 1917 WALL



George Henry Juenke entered the world on October 19, 1888. He was the 4th of 10 children born to German immigrants and Minnesota farmers Henry Frederick Juenke and Susanna Kraushaar Juenke.

George lived in various Minnesota towns, including Shaokatan, Lincoln and Hendricks. His life took on a new chapter in 1917 when he moved to Orange, known at the time as the “Citrus Capital of the World,” where he ran a 10-acre citrus ranch off Batavia.

It was around this time that he served in the U.S. Army. While we weren’t able to locate specific enlistment and discharge dates, it’s highly probable that he enlisted after the U.S. entered the war in April 1917, and was discharged after the end of the war in November 1918.

In the midst of World War I, George Henry Juenke found love. On September 26, 1918, he married Clara E. Gackstetter in Orange (before departing again for his military service). Although George got through World War I unscathed, his brother Bernard was not so lucky. In October 1918, Bernard Juenke served in the 161st Infantry Regiment during the Spanish Flu pandemic of the time. He contracted the virus one month after entering service and died at age 28.

In 1920 the Juenkes were blessed with a daughter, Florence Marie, born on March 14. Census records in 1920 indicate that George was working again as a fruit farmer.

In the years that followed, George witnessed both personal joys and sorrows. His father passed away in 1928 when George was 39 years old. By 1930, George’s mother and two adult sisters were living with George and Clara in Orange. Eleven years later his mother left the world when George was 52.

In 1950, George, then 62, was still working as a citrus rancher. We don’t know when he retired, but we know that in 1969, after 51 years of marriage, George’s wife Clara passed away in 1969, when George was 80. Tragedy struck again when his daughter, librarian Florence Marie Juenke, passed away in 1979, at the age of 59.

Despite these losses, George lived a remarkable life, bearing witness to truly transformative years in our country. On February 5, 1985, at the age of 96, George passed away in Orange. He is interred at Fairhaven Memorial Park in Santa Ana next to his wife Clara and their daughter.

Though records do not indicate the presence of grandchildren, George’s life story stands as a testament to hard work and dedication to his country. We thank you George Henry Juenke for your service in the U.S. Army.
