Marine Week Detroit Fact Sheet

Marine Week Detroit is taking place from Sept. 6-10, 2017 featuring more than 80 community outreach activities throughout metro Detroit and free events open to the public across downtown Detroit.

The goal of Marine Week is to showcase the pride and professionalism of the Marine Corps through a weeklong series of events designed to honor the service and sacrifice of our Marines and their families, as well as generate awareness of the USMC programs, mission and capabilities to a wide audience.

Approximately 700 Marines will participate in Marine Week Detroit with a majority of individuals traveling from San Diego County and Washington, D.C. to provide support for this premier community engagement event.

Marine Week Detroit will also include Marines from I_{st} Battalion, 24_{th} Marines, a Marine reserve unit located in Selfridge, Michigan.

Marine Week Detroit will have a positive economic impact on the city – approximately \$7 million will be reinvested into Detroit during the weeklong event.

Marine Week is not a recruiting effort. It's designed to directly connect Americans with their Marine Corps, as well as recognize the contributions of the United States Marine Corps.

Marine Week was created and introduced in 2009 as a celebration of Community, Country and Corps.

This is the 8_{th} annual Marine week which is held in a different city that does not have a significant Marine Corps presence.

MARINES OF OUR PAST

Oscar P. Austin

Rank: Private First Class

Organization: U.S. Marine Corps

CITATION

For conspicuous gallantry and intrepidity at the risk of his life above and beyond the call of duty while serving as an assistant machine gunner with Company E, in connection with operations against enemy forces. During the early morning hours Pfc. Austin's observation post was subjected to a fierce ground attack by a large North Vietnamese Army force supported by a heavy volume of hand grenades, satchel charges, and small arms fire. Observing that 1 of his wounded companions had fallen unconscious in a position dangerously exposed to the hostile fire, Pfc. Austin unhesitatingly left the relative security of his fighting hole and, with complete disregard for his safety, raced across the fire-swept terrain to assist the marine to a covered location. As he neared the

casualty, he observed an enemy grenade land nearby and, reacting instantly, leaped between the injured marine and the lethal object, absorbing the effects of its detonation. As he ignored his painful injuries and turned to examine the wounded man, he saw a North Vietnamese Army soldier aiming a weapon at his unconscious companion. With full knowledge of the probable consequences and thinking only to protect the marine, Pfc. Austin resolutely threw himself between the casualty and the hostile soldier, and, in doing, was mortally wounded. Pfc. Austin's indomitable courage, inspiring initiative and selfless devotion to duty upheld the highest traditions of the Marine Corps and the U.S. Naval Service. He gallantly gave his life for his country.

DJD YOU KNOW?.....

The USMC did not exist between 1783 and 1794.

October 4, 1783. Treaty of Paris (1783) / Marines disbanded

The 1783 Treaty of Paris ended the War for Independence, and as the last of the Navy's ships were sold, the Continental Navy and Marines were disbanded.

March 27, 1794 Naval Act of 1794

The Naval Act of 1794 re-established the US Navy and the USMC. The Constitution had 55 Marines assigned as part of its 450-man crew. The first detachment arrived at Edmond Hart's Shipyard in Boston.


