

**The Sagebrush Classic
All Breed Junior Show
July 19-21th, 2019
Connell, WA.**

Hosted by Hang'n A Cattle Co – Alan and Leslie Alexander, Pasco, WA.

General Entry Rules

1. Entry fees:
 - a. Showmanship Clinic \$20.00, includes Friday night dinner
 - b. Jackpot Steer \$50.00 per head (includes first bedding and complimentary meals for exhibitor and family)
 - c. Charolais Influence Steer – No entry fee if animal is entered in the Jackpot steer show -\$35.00 if not already entered
 - d. Washington Cattle Feeders Association Market Steer class – no entry fee, must be entered in the Jackpot show
 - e. Jackpot Heifer \$40.00 per head (includes first bedding and complimentary meals for exhibitor and family)
 - f. Charolais Influence Female – no entry fee if animal is entered in the Jackpot Heifer show - \$35.00 if not already entered
 - g. Showmanship - Pee Wee \$5.00, Super Pee Wee \$10, all other ages \$20.00

1. Entry deadline is July 15, 2019. Entries postmarked after that date will be considered late and a \$10.00 late fee (per exhibitor) will be due at time of check in.

2. Entry fees are non-refundable if you do not attend or leave an animal home.
 - a. Please submit your entries early so we can plan for additional stall space if needed.
 - b. If the barn limit has been reached at the time your entry is received, you will be contacted, and a full refund will be made or
 - c. You may stall and show out of your trailer at your own risk. (Please indicate on your entry).

3. No aid can be given in the show ring (one animal – one exhibitor) except for the Pee Wee class. Junior exhibitors may be assisted in steer classes if needed.
 - a. The management understands that this may be the first “time to town” for some steers / exhibitors but to make sure the show ring is safe, unruly animals and those not under control will be disqualified after the second foul and will be asked to leave the show ring. Nose rings are allowed in the show ring.

4. Use of alcohol is prohibited in the livestock areas. No smoking or dogs will be allowed in the barns. All dogs on the grounds must be under their owners control at all times.

5. Release time - Steer exhibitors are **strongly encouraged** to stay overnight and participate in Sunday’s activities but will be allowed to leave after the Charolais Influenced steer class has concluded Saturday.

6. Complimentary meals will be available for exhibitors and family members all weekend.

Showmanship Clinic

1. Instruction will be given on hair care and showmanship techniques
2. Live demo- You will use your animal at the end of the class to practice and receive individual feedback.

All Breed Jackpot Steer

1. Steer classes are open to exhibitors ages 8 through 19 (as of 1/1/2019).
One steer per exhibitor unless additional stall space is available
2. Steer check in – weigh in will be Saturday 7:00 – 10:00 am. No reweighs allowed
3. Steers must be targeted for a terminal 4H-FFA-state-county fair which will be held in 2019. Exhibitors are required to designate the target show on their entry blank.
 - a. A prospect steer class (animal not targeted for a fall terminal show) will be added if a minimum of two steers are entered. Prospect steers are not eligible for Champion and Reserve or the WCFA steer awards
4. Steers must be shown in the name of the individual exhibitor.
 - a. Family alternate steers may be exhibited by any youth from that family.
5. Classes will be determined after all steers are weighed in.
 - a. The top two steers from each class will return and compete for Champion and Reserve.

Charolais Influence Steer

1. Steers must exhibit physical characteristics of an animal with Charolais bloodlines in their background. (Colors include white, gold, grey, red, yellow, etc.).
 - a. Eligibility will be verified at check in.
 - b. Two places paid (Champion and Reserve)

Washington Cattle Feeders Association (WCFA) Market Steer Class

1. Steers showing in the Jackpot steer show are automatically considered for the Market class.
2. During the Jackpot show the WCFA judge will select steers that will return to show in the market class
3. You do not have to be pretty- judging will be based on a steer's current condition and its projected finished status at your county fair.

All Breed Jackpot Female

1. Check in is Saturday 7:00-10 am or Sunday 7:00-8:00 am. Heifers will not be weighed.
2. Heifers may be shown by exhibitors up to age 21 (as of 1/1/2019)
3. Open to registered or cross bred females born between Sept 1, 2017 and April 1, 2019 and must be weaned.
4. Heifers are not required to be owned by the exhibitor
5. Classes will be broken by age of heifer, based on entries.
 - a. Top two from each class will compete for Champion and Reserve.

Charolais Influence Heifer

6. Heifers must exhibit physical characteristics of an animal that has Charolais bloodlines in their background (Colors include white, gold, grey, red, yellow, etc.).
 - a. Eligibility will be verified at check in.
 - b. Two places paid (Champion and Reserve)

Showmanship

1. Showmanship classes are open to exhibitors up to age 21 (as of 1/1/2019)
2. Exhibitors may show a steer or heifer
3. Fitting of animals is encouraged but not required but must be done by the junior exhibitor. Parents and other adults may offer advice but are not allowed to assist.

4. Age divisions will be split into Pee Wee, Super Pee Wee, Junior, Intermediate and Senior
 - a. Pee Wee Classes are open to exhibitors 7 and under and assistance is allowed in the ring
 - b. Super Pee Wee Class is open to exhibitors 7 and under who need no assistance and who can control and show their animal by themselves.
 - c. First and second places from each class in the Junior, Intermediate and Senior divisions, including splits, will return to compete for Division Champion and Reserve awards.

Barn Rules

1. Barn space is limited, and stalls will be assigned based on the date your entry was postmarked.
 - a. If you wish to be stalled with a group or another exhibitor, please indicate this on your entry and we will do our best to accommodate everyone.
2. Animals shall be secured with both a halter and neck rope.
3. First bedding will be provided (shavings) for each animal entered. Additional shavings will be available for purchase. No straw allowed.
 - a. To preserve stall space, tack area and blocking chutes must be set up outside the barn area and in designated areas. Generators will not be allowed in the barn.
 - b. Exhibitors are required to strip all bedding from their stall area before leaving the grounds
4. **New in 2019- No Trailer or RV parking allowed on the grass, park in the gravel areas only. Dry camping only.** No electrical or water hook ups available. Generators allow in camping area, showers available on site, fresh water available to fill RV holding tanks.
