



Taking Your Yearbook Photo

How to make your photo look it's absolute best!



Dress The Part

This IS YOUR SENIOR PORTRAIT. Dress as you would for a formal portrait. Make sure that you choose a dark color like black or dark blue. This will ensure that you stand out from your background and create uniformity among the senior class. Please avoid patterns or anything with writing-- it may interfere with the clarity of the upload.

This is a Two Person Job

This is NOT a selfie. Take your time, get all the details right and have someone else snap the photo. This enables them to frame the photo properly. Be sure to use the camera on the back of your phone (if you decide to use a phone camera)--it has higher quality than the selfie camera.



Choosing Your Background

If you are able to take your portrait in front of a green backdrop, that's excellent. If not, please try to find a light, solid-color wall to stand or sit in front of. Can't find a blank wall? Hang a sheet up in your temporary photo studio-- that works great too! We want to make certain that we have as much contrast as possible between you and your background.

Framing your shot

Make sure that the person taking your picture frames you so that we can see your entire head and your shoulders. Your face should take up the majority of the frame. Use this picture of Mr. Amari as a guide for how to frame the shot.



Have lots of light

Use a bright light source to make sure we can see your face clearly without too many shadows. Something as simple as a desk lamp turned toward your face can give just the right amount of light for your picture

Email the picture

Once you have taken a few pictures, select the one you like the best and email it to: teacheramari@gmail.com Make sure to put your full name in the subject of the email so we will know whose picture it is. Please check the spelling. The way you spell it in the email is how it will appear in the yearbook. Most likely your favorite photo will work. If we encounter a problem with a file however, we will contact you ASAP to find a solution. In addition to your senior portrait, please include 3 to 5 of your favorite photos from your years at Roy H. Mann that you would like to see in the yearbook. We will try our best to include those as well, though we cannot make a guarantee for any photo. Please remember photos with inappropriate slogans on clothing or hand signs cannot be considered.
