DROP OFF/PICK-UP & CARPOOL

When you drop off your child for class, you are welcome to park in the garage behind the Theatre. All parking is validated at the Box Office Window. Please do not leave your car unattended in the circle drive. We encourage parents to drop their student off under the awning where an Instructor will be waiting to direct children to their classrooms.

At the point of dismissal, an Instructor will walk the students to the RED CARPET in the Lobby by the front doors. As a safety precaution, we ask that all students wait INSIDE THE BUILDING until their name is called by the Instructor leading Carpool. The Instructor will only call the name of the student with the waiting car under the awning. This is to prevent students walking in between cars.

WHAT TO BRING TO CLASS:

Please bring the following with you to class everyday:

<u>A Water Bottle</u> – we have water available, but will no longer have plastic cups, so please bring a refillable bottle!

<u>A Notebook, Binder & Pencil</u> – most classes will be giving you instruction, choreography, blocking notes.. please bring something that you can record all of this in, or to write down any ideas you may have during the course of class.

All students must wear their proper uniform to dance class and have their hair pulled back to help teachers provide the highest level of observation and correction.

Students are also HIGHLY encouraged to bring a water bottle to class, as we will no longer have plastic cups available. Students are welcome to fill their water bottle before class at the water filter.

Students should try to avoid wearing their dance shoes outside, as it brings dirt into the studio. We encourage students to wear slip on shoes to the theater and change into dance shoes in the studio before class begins.

Please write your student's name on EVERYTHING! Tribble does have a "Lost & Found". This is cleaned out at the end of each semester. Leftover things are donated.



FOOD

Food and drinks (other than water bottles) aren't allowed in the Main Stage Theater.

All snacks and dinner, during Tech week, will be eaten in the Lobby ONLY. Please help us to instill cleaning up after oneself!

<u>PEANUT FREE SCHOOL!</u> We have students with allergies, and want to keep everyone safe. <u>K-3rd Grade Students</u>- Please have a snack before or after your class! We won't take a snack break since our class is only an hour and a half long.

<u>4-8th Grade Students</u>- You may bring one snack..since our classes are 2+ hours, we'll give you breaks in the Lobby from time to time. Please bring things that are not messy or sticky.

SAFETY

There is always a CPR certified staff member on duty. First-Aid kits are regularly stocked and are in or near every work environment. We have fire and lockdown procedures in place. If ever an emergency should arise, each lead teacher has a class roster and contact information on them at all times. Parents have filled out medical release forms on line, as a part of their enrollment process. However, if there is any relevant information that you think your child's instructor should be aware of, please make us aware!

In case of an **EMERGENCY** outside of QT during class hours, and a guardian needs to get ahold of their child immediately, please call or text Ashley Peters at 832-719-7957.

ETIQUETTE

Our goal, as a school, is to teach students skills in their various artistic disciplines on stage and, at the same time, to encourage students to cultivate their own individualized sense of self off stage as well. Our Core Values include:

Self Confidence
Team Work & Respect for Others
Discipline & Dedication
Empathy & Open Mindedness

In order to instill these values, we will ask that students participate in class within the guidelines we will lay out for them in the first weeks of the semester. We have a wonderful student body, and only rarely have any sort of behavioral/disciplinary concerns, however, we believe in open lines of communication.

If your student has any problem during the course of the semester, we will be open with you as parents, always with the goal of creating the best environment and experience for all of our students while they are working with us! We ask that you feel free to do the same – if you have any concerns during the course of the semester, please let us know. We are open to your thoughts and feedback at all times!

FYI

MUSICAL THEATRE ATTIRE

Musical theatre is an active process! Please come prepared to have fun and MOVE!! Your student should come dressed in:

- -Anything they would wear to school and in which they are comfortable, ideally no short dresses or skirts.
- -Closed Toe Shoes!!! This is SO important. We don't want stubbed toes, or accidents due to flip flops or bare feet.
- -6-12th Grade Female Students I would recommend looking into a pair of Character Shoes in nude or black. These will come in handy many times across the course of your performances.

DANCE ATTIRE

DANCE CLASS UNIFORMS

We highly recommend students order all dance attire needs through *DISCOUNT DANCE SUPPLY.* They have very reasonable prices, ship quickly, and support our school by giving money back!

Go to their website, <u>www.discountdance.com</u>, click on Dance Teacher Program, and enter my name, Bethany White, and/or my Teacher ID number, 60085. It should indicate Tribble School for Performing Arts, and you can click on Dress Codes. Select your class to see our uniform recommendations:

BALLET I, II, III:

Pink tights with CONVERTIBLE footing, black leotard, split sole leather or canvas ballet shoes, hair in a neat bun.

COMBO I, II:

Tan tights with CONVERTIBLE footing, black leotard, TAN jazz shoes, optional black dance shorts or leggings, hair in a tight ponytail or bun.

JUNIOR and SENIOR Companies:

CONVERTIBLE tights, leotard, half soles (shoes for contemporary work), tan jazz shoes, hair in a tight bun.

Putting It Together

MUSICAL THEATRE COSTUMES

All fees and measurements should have been completed on RegPack when you registered your child for the semester. Please remember that if you have not completed theses sections and paid the Production Fee for the semester, you will be responsible for your student's costume.

It is highly encouraged that all students have a "base layer" of clothing on underneath their costume, ie.. a changing leotard or camisole & boy/dance shorts, or undershirt & shorts for boys.. for Production classes and Dance classes. This helps keep your student covered during quick changes.

All ladies in the Dance Department are encouraged to purchase a NUDE CAMISOLE changing leotard to wear during the Dance Concert. This is a great way to remain "covered" when changing costumes in the dressing room, and it barely shows under a costume. It is a staple to have in performances. These can be purchased through discountdance.com by visiting the website and clicking on UNDERGARMENTS.

HEADSHOTS

We will be scheduling a photographer to come to the theatre and take photos of each student (for musical theatre classes) and each class section (for dance classes) during their class time. These photos are offered at no charge and will be in their production programs. We will let you know ASAP the date of your student's photo session!

Please have them come ready for their photos. They will take these photos against a white wall so we recommend that they:

- Come in a solid color top (not white, and preferably not black)
- -Hair out of their faces, please!
- -The photos are cropped from the shoulders up.. so don't worry about anything below that. That is to say.. students should still wear clothing below that (please), but it doesn't have to be their Sunday finest.
- -Their head shot should look like them! Don't worry about a ton of makeup or styling hair in a new or fancy way.
- -Dance Students should come in their recommended Dance Attire & Shoes with hair pulled back.

VOICE LESSONS

Many of you have asked about the next step for your students as musical theatre actors, and one of the most valuable steps you can take is finding a great voice teacher!

This year, the Tribble School is excited to introduce our Resident Voice Teacher, Katharine Randolph. Beginning this Fall 2017, Katharine will be on site at Queensbury Theatre 3 days a week, and available for students who are interested in pursuing vocal instruction. 

Katharine works with her students not only on vocal technique, but on performance, helping them prepare for auditions, school musicals, college auditions, juries, recitals, and local performances. While Katharine was trained as a classical singer, her specialty is teaching CCM which includes musical theatre, pop, rock, and folk.
