

TIP OF THE QUILL

SOME TIPS FOR SETTING GOOD WRITING WORK HABITS

- 1. Examine your previous patterns: Think about why you started unfinished projects and why you stopped. Are there any patterns in your habits that are holding you back?
- 2. Differentiate between experiments and commitments: We need to differentiate between those tasks we want to finish and those we are just experimenting with. We



- 3. **Count the full cost:** Don't bite off more than you can chew. When you decide on a project, like a novel, understand the commitment you are making. You can then decide if you want to proceed.
- Don't get stuck on the big picture: With a big project, it is easy to be overwhelmed. Don't think about 80,000 words. Instead, just get started.
- 5. **Set exceptionally** *small* **daily goals**: The bigger the project, the smaller the daily goals; especially if this is your first attempt at a large undertaking. You put one foot in front of the other and soon you have walked a mile.
- 6. Find the pleasure in the work: Enjoy your writing for writing's sake. Take pride in your accomplishment no matter how small. This is supposed to be something you want and relish in doing.
- 7. **Track how you're doing**: Share your goals and work with others. You could join a writing group or pair up with another writer friend and discuss your project regularly.
- 8. **Stop fixating on the negative**: Things will go wrong. Handle them and go on. Focus on your successes no matter how small —
