Importance of Social Interaction:

Reflecting on the importance of social interaction, it is apparent that maintaining the foundation upon which social interaction was established is essential to the continued growth of the interaction.

When individuals enter the halls of public education, they may spend nine out of every twelve months, five days a week, for twelve years, in the company of one another: friendships are developed. Then comes graduation day: After a period of years passes by, so do those friendships. There are exceptions to the rule, but the rule is, nevertheless, true.

The writer of the Hebrew letter made two statements that relate:

- 1. "Take heed, brethren, lest haply there shall be in any one of you an evil heart of unbelief, in falling away from the living God: but exhort one another day by day, so long as it is called To-day; lest any one of you be hardened by the deceitfulness of sin" (3:12-13).
- 2. "Let us hold fast the confession of our hope that it waver not; for he is faithful that promised: and let us consider one another to provoke unto love and good works; not forsaking our own assembling together, as the custom of some is, but exhorting one another; and so much the more, as ye see the day drawing nigh" (10:23-25).

Be not surprised when the faith of many begins to waver due to a lack of the social interaction and exhortation accomplished in the assembly. ret
