

Sandy's political career included serving as Mayor of Farmington, Oakland County Commissioner and finally, serving the 64th District as State Representative from 1975-1988. He was an active member of Our Lady of Sorrows in Farmington, was a member of Groves-Walker American Legion Post 346 in Farmington and the Farmington VFW.

Private funeral services will be held with a public memorial service taking place on July 6th 2021, which would have been Sandy's 99th birthday. #### More COVID-19 Scams!

As public health officials, scientists, and shippers work around the clock to get the new coronavirus vaccine into arms, scammers are also working 24/7 to figure out how to profit. Here are some potential ways scammers may try to use the COVID-19 vaccine rollout to try to steal your money or identity.

#### Scam No. 1 - The "Vaccine List" Scam

Did you get a call, email, or text message asking if you want to add your name to a waiting list for the vaccine *for a fee*? It's a scam. You will never have to pay to get on a vaccine waitlist. While there is no master waiting list, some public health organizations are allowing residents to pre-register for the vaccine.

**Tip for avoiding Scam No. 1**: Never pay anyone to get on a waiting list for the vaccine. Only register with a legitimate public health organization and contact the entity directly.

#### Scam No. 2 - The "Jump the Line" Scam

All Americans will have to wait their turn to get the vaccine. Anyone who offers you a chance to move to the front of the line is a scammer. All legitimate health organizations will follow CDC guidance on who should get the vaccine first.

**Tip for avoiding Scam No. 2:** Follow legitimate news sources and stay in touch with your local health officials to find out when you can expect to get the vaccine. And be aware that scammers might use caller ID spoofing to make it look like they're calling from a legitimate health organization.

#### Scam No. 3 - The "Info Collection" Scam

Be on the lookout for emails, texts, or other messages seeking your personal information to make an appointment for the vaccine.

**Tip for avoiding Scam No. 3:** Be wary of anyone who contacts you to request your personal information. If you get an email or text message that seems to come from your health insurer or another reputable organization, look up their information and contact them directly rather than responding to links within the message.

#### Scam No. 4 - The "Vaccine Copay" Scam

A scammer might ask for money for a copay or other outof-pocket expense for the vaccine. No one should contact you to ask for a payment related to the vaccine. The federal government is working to make the vaccine free to all Americans, according to the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services.

**Tip for avoiding Scam No. 4:** Find out in advance if you'll have to pay an out-of-pocket cost when you get vaccinated, and only pay at the point of service or when you get a bill afterward. Vaccines purchased with U.S. taxpayer dollars will be free, but patients may have to pay an administration fee, according to the CDC.

#### Scam No. 5 - The "Alternative Cure" Scam

While Americans anxiously await a vaccine, scammers hope they'll fall for false promises of coronavirus preventive measures and so-called miracle cures.

**Tip for avoiding Scam No. 5:** Vet all your sources of information about the coronavirus, and don't trust anyone claiming to have a cure or surefire preventative. Until you can get vaccinated, stick to the basics: distancing, masks, handwashing, and avoiding gatherings.

Did you fall victim to a COVID vaccine scammer? You can contact the FTC to report the fraud. Here's what to expect with the coronavirus vaccine rollout. The CDC has made recommendations that these Americans should get the vaccine first: health care workers and long-term care facility residents and staff. Others who are likely to get priority include workers in essential and critical industries, adults with underlying conditions that put them at greater risk, and older adults. Health experts estimate that the vaccine may not be widely available to the healthy general population until around June 2021 or later. In the meantime, stay safe and watch out for scammers.

#### Membership Eligibilty







Legion membership eligibility. Veterans or active duty military who have served at least one day of active duty in the US Armed Forces since December 7, 1941 and have been honorably discharged or are still serving.

Auxilairy membership eligibility. 1) Relationship to veteran: Mother, daughter, sister, grandmother, granddaughter, male or female spouse, self (for female

2) Potential member must be related to a living veteran by one of the relationships stated AND veteran is a current member of the American Legion. OR, Potential member is related to a deceased veteran who served at least one day of active service during eligible time periods (Apr. 6, 1917 to Nov. 11, 1918 and any time after Dec. 7, 1941) and was honorably discharged. Deceased veteran does not have to have been a member of the American Legion.

**SAL** membership eligibility. 1) All male descendants adopted sons, and stepsons. 2) Potential member must be related to a living veteran by one of the relationships stated AND veteran is a current member of the American Legion. OR, Potential member is related to a deceased veteran who served at least one day of active service during eligible time periods (Apr. 6, 1917 to Nov. 11, 1918 and any time after Dec. 7, 1941) and was honorably discharged. Deceased veteran does not have to have been a member of the American Legion.

Ensure our American flags are properly disposed of with dignity, patriotism and honor when they reach the end of their serviceable career.




