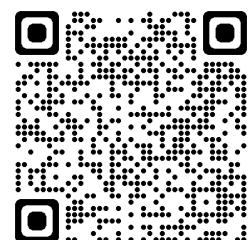


## Bylaw Changes

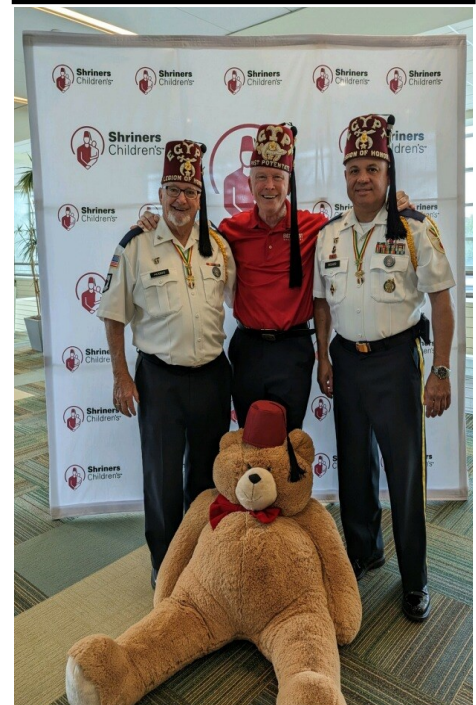

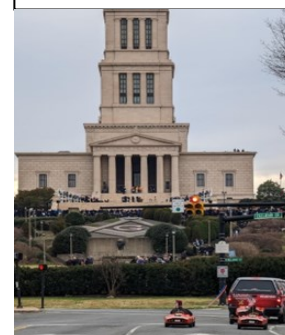

Al Amin LOH has been very active attending parades in the Rio Grande Valley. I had the privilege of participating in the Charro Days Parade in Brownsville TX.

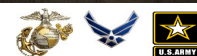

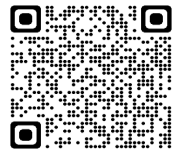

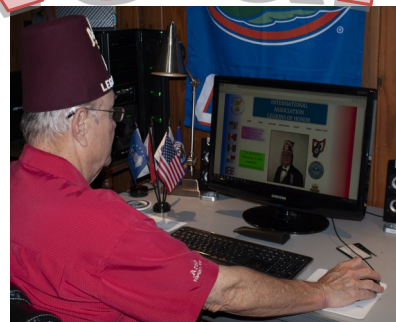
