

REGULAR MEETING
TOWN OF DELCAMBRE
MARCH 11, 2019

Town of Delcambre regular session convened at 6:00 p.m. on MARCH 11, 2019, at the City Hall, with Mayor Pam Blakely, presiding.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

MEMBERS PRESENT: Members present: Alderman Bryan Glatter, Alderman Donald Martin, Alderwoman Madison Saunier and Alderwoman Sarah Trahan.

MEMBERS ABSENT: Alderman Timothy Derise

ALSO, PRESENT: Town Clerk Shirley Wyles, Town Attorney Ted Ayo, Fire Chief Brock Benoit, Police Street Commissioner Homer Stelly, Sellers & Associates representative Stephanie Briggs, Pelican Waste representative Tommy Thibodeaux, Wright, Moore, DeHart, Dupuis & Hutchinson, LLC representative Christie Dunn and 3 guests.

MOTION: Introduced by Alderwoman Madison Saunier and seconded by Alderwoman Sarah Trahan "moved to accept and dispense the minutes of the regular meeting of MARCH 2019 as reviewed." Motion Carried:

MOTION: Introduced by Alderwoman Madison Saunier and seconded by Alderwoman Sarah Trahan "moved to authorize payment of monthly bills as reviewed." Motion Carried:

DISCUSSION: Stephanie Briggs, Engineer, reports the Water Meter construction is going as slightly ahead of schedule with no major complications found per. Project is at 40% of completion with water lines at 75% completion.

MOTION: Introduced by Alderman Bryan Glatter and seconded by Alderwoman Madison Saunier "moved to table discussion and change of Ordinance for regulations regarding Recreation Vehicles within incorporated limits of Delcambre". Motion Carried.


MOTION: Introduced by Alderman Bryan Glatter and seconded by Alderman Donald Martin "moved to table discussion and approval of the roof repairs of fire department building. Chief Benoit is still soliciting for three (3) bids for repair and will bring to April's meeting for review and approval". Motion Carried.

MOTION: Introduced by Alderman Bryan Glatter and seconded by Alderwoman Madison Saunier "moved to table approval of credit or selling of old maintenance parts currently stored at the City Barn which have been deemed obsolete until further information is received from Winwater and/or possibly Salvage.


MOTION: Introduced by Alderman Donald Martin and seconded by Alderwoman Sarah Trahan "moved to amend the previously approved 4feet property variance on the front set-back to total 6 feet as requested by Bonnie Latiolais and daughter, Jessica Latiolais to bring them to code for Iberia Parish permitting". Motion Carried.

- MOTION: Introduced by Alderman Donald Martin and seconded by Alderwoman Madison Saunier "moved to approve Section A "Subdivisions" Section 5. Design Standards (B) (5) Blocks and lots Code of Ordinances of the Town of Delcambre, Louisiana, amended to change the Set-back Line for buildings from the street right-of-way line from twenty-five (25) Feet to Twenty (20) Feet to be in conformity with the Iberia Parish Permit Office, which is to read as follows: **SECTION (B) 5, BUILDING LINES SHALL NOT BE LESS THAN TWENTY (20) FEET FROM THE STREET RIGHT-OF-WAY LINE, AND NOT LESS THAN TEN (1) FEE FROM ADJOINING PROPERTY SIDE LINES.**" Public Hearing to be held on April 8, 2019 Motion Carried.
- MOTON: Introduced by Alderman Bryan Glatter and seconded by Alderwoman Madison Saunier "moved to approve the donation of a Fire Truck from Vermilion Parish Police Jury upon validation of true donation". Motion Carried.
- MOTON: Introduced by Alderman Bryan Glatter and seconded by Alderwoman Madison Saunier "moved to approve entering into an agreement with LAMATS Surplus Property Program, LPS-EASi Municipal Surplus Property Program to allow for the internet auction of surplus moveable property (LA Revised Statute 33:4711.1) at no direct cost to members and affiliates of the Louisiana Municipal Association". Motion Carried.
- MOTON: Introduced by Alderman Bryan Glatter and seconded by Alderwoman Sarah Trahan "moved to amend the intergovernmental agreement between Town of Delcambre Police Department and Bayou Carlin Cove increasing the amount of monthly payment from \$800 to \$950. In addition to the agreed upon patrolling the \$950 is to add the responsibility of permit issuance for Bayou Carlin Cove". Motion Carried.
- DISCUSSION: Ted Ayo, Town's Attorney, brought forth the change of laws referring to minors being of the age of 18 and should the curfew for Delcambre be changed to reflect the same. All members present deemed to leave the Curfew Ordinance as-is.
- MOTION: Introduced by Alderwoman Madison Saunier and seconded by Alderwoman Sarah Trahan "moved to **not amend** the Town's Ordinance **SEC. 8-24 CURFEW FOR MINORS; RESPONSIBILITY OF PARENTS; AND PENALTY FOR VIOLATION.**" Motion Carried
- DISCUSSION: Mayor Blakely took this time to introduce to the members of the Council, CPA consultant, Christie Dunn of Wright, Moore, DeHart, Dupuis & Hutchinson, LLC as approved in February's meeting. Ms. Dunn spoke briefly with words of encouragement for the Town's position and moving forward. Motion Carried.
- MOTION: Introduced by Alderman Donald Martin and seconded by Alderwoman Madison Saunier "Moved to Adjourn." Motion Carried.
