

A Praying Teen-Ager

Daniel was a praying teen-ager. It was his custom to pray three times a day. (Daniel 6:10) Prayer was the key to his victorious living.

In the last issue we thought upon Daniel's resolution. He "purposed" he would be true to his God. Many will be breaking their New Year's Resolutions for 1961 because they miss this important fact: Purpose without Prayer isPowerless! It is like trying to run a hot rod without gas. I once observed an advertisement for a certain brand of gasoline. It pictured the car being filled with gasoline and read: POWER FADE SHOWS HERE! And it does. Be prayerless and you'll be powerless—powerless to fulfill your Christian purpose.

A prayer-time of a morning is the best way to begin the day. The Psalmist said, "But I. O Lord, cry to thee; in the morning my prayer comes before thee." (Ps. 88:13, trans.) Then prayer will become the climate of the day. Then your heart will "pray without ceasing" (1 Thess. 5:17). Fill those idle and restless moments with prayer, and close your day with prayer.

John Bunyan said, "Prayer is a shield to the soul, a sacrifice to God, and a scourge for Satan." He also said, "Prayer will make a man cease from sin, or sin will make a man cease from prayer." And see if you don't agree with this bit of philosphy on prayer: "When it is hardest to pray, that is the time to pray hardest."

Because Daniel prayed to his God three times a day, he was thrown into a den of lions. Because Daniel prayed three times a day, he was delivered from the lions!

Prayer releases and strengthens faith. You have faith in God if you are a Christian, because you are saved "through faith" (Eph. 2:8.) But earnest, supplicating prayer will release and strengthen your Christian faith. Daniel "believed" in God (Dan. 6:23) because he was devoted in his prayer-life. Thus, the Bible says that "through faith" he "stopped the mouths of lions." (Heb. 11:33)

The devil is compared to a lion: "... your adversary, the devil, as a roaring lion, walketh about, seeking whom he may devour: whom resist steadfast in the faith ..." (I Pet. 5:8-9.)

You can't be delivered from this adversary without faith—and faith is inspired through prayer. The moments you spend in prayer are vital to your existence as a Christian. Pray! Then walk by faith!

Unless God delivers you, the devil will "tear (your) soul like a lion, rending it to pieces" (Ps. 7:2.) Oh, how you need to pray this prayer each day: "Save me from the lion's mouth" (Ps. 22:21).

Not only does "the devil, as a roaring lion, walk about, seeking whom he may devour," "but he lieth in wait secretly as a lion." (Ps. 10:9) He often prays upon your soul "secretly!" He is subtle in his efforts to slay you. That is why you are exhorted to be "vigilant" (cautious, alert, watchful); to "watch and pray."

"Above all things put on charity, which is the bond of perfectness." Col. 3:14.


"Above all things have fervent charity among yourselves, for charity shall cover the multitude of sins." I Pet. 4:8.


Tongues, prophecy, knowledge and faith become null and void without charity. Read I Cor. 13 if you are interested in this subject.

the Baptism with the Holy Ghost

"In the last days I will Pour Out My Spirit Upon All Flesh."

The three greatest events that ever took place in this world's history were the cruel curcifixion of Our Lord Jeses Christ, His glorious resurrection and His Baptizing of His followers with the Holy Ghost on that day of Pentecost. For said he, "It is expedient for you that I go away: for if I go not away the Comforter will not come to you; but if I depart I will send Him unto you."

"And I will pray the Father, and He shall send you another comforter, that He may abide with you for ever."

John the Baptist gave testimony, "I indeed baptise you with water unto repentance but He that comes after me—shall baptise you with the HOLY CHOST AND WITH FIRE" (Mat. 3:11, Mark 1:8, Luke 3:16, John 1:33).

These four gospels also show that multitudes out of all the land of Judea and of Jerusalem who went out to John beyond Jordan were converted in one of the world's greatest revivals, and were baptised in water. But the Baptism with the HOLY GHOST was to be Something absolutely defferent from this kind of baptism.

THE HOLY GHOST IS FOR ALL BELIEVERS

When was this baptism? Even when Jesus had given power to His disciples over all devils and to cure diseases and heal the sick, they had not yet received this BAPTISM, for Jesus himself, just previous to his betrayal, " . . . stood and cried, saying. He That Believeth On Me, as the Scriptrue hath said, out of his belly shall flow rivers of LIVING Water. But this He spake of the SPIRIT which they that believe on Him should receive; for the Holy Ghost was not yet given because Jesus was not yet glorified," (John 7:38,39) Readers, please notice that this Living Water, the Spirit, is for everyone. "He That Believeth" and "They That Believe On Him." This shows that this Baptism was for all and decidedly different and far beyond anything which they had already received.

And Jesus promises again at His Last Supper "If you love me, keep my commandments and I will pray the Father, and He shall give you another Comforter, that He may abide with you forever; Even the Spirit of Truth; whom the world cannot receive, because it seeth Him not-for He dwelleth with you and Shall Be In You." (John 14:15-17) "It is expedient for you that I go away; for if I go not away, the Comforter Will Not Come Unto You; but if I depart, I Will Send Him unto you. And when He is come, He will reprove the world of sin, and of righteousness and of judgment. How beit when He, the Spirit of Truth is Come, He will guide you in all truth. He will show you things to come. . . He shall glorify me; . . . He shall take of mine and show it unto you." John 16:7 to 15 and 14:26.

And after His glorious resurrection He declared "These SIGNS shall follow THEM THAT BELIEVE, in my Name shall they cast out devils; they shall SPEAK WITH NEW TONGUES: They shall take up serpents; and if they drink any deadly thing, it shall not hurt them; they shall lay hands on the sick and they shall recover." Mark 16:17-18.

Reader please notice that the above SIGNS shall not only follow the twelve disciples but THEM THAT BELIEVE.

WAIT FOR POWER FROM ON HIGH

Jesus had been betrayed, crucified and had risen from the dead and forty days later, just before His ascension, He told His disciples to wait for the PROMISE of the FATHER... "for John truly baptised with water, but ye Shall be baptised with the HOLY GHOST not many days hence... Ye shall receive power after the Holy Ghost is come upon you, and ye shall be witnesses unto Me...unto the uttermost part of the earth." Acts 1:1-8.

THE GREAT OUTPOURING

"And when the Day of Pentecost was fully come, they were all with one accord in one place. . . " (The number being 120 according to Acts 1:15) "And suddenly there came a sound from heaven AS of a rushing mighty wind, and it filled All the house where they were sitting. And there appeared unto them cloven tongues like as of fire, and it sat upon each of them. (No mention is made however of any noise or fire in succeeding baptisms) and they were all filled with the Holy Ghost, and began to speak with other Tongues as the Spirit gave them utterance.

And there were dwelling at Jerusalem, Jews, devout men, out of every nation under Heaven. Now when this was noised abroad, the multitude came together, and were confounded. because every man heard them speak in his own language . . . Wherein we were born Jews and proselytes" (who were celebrating the Jewish Pentecost, the fiftieth day after passover, and they all understood Peter, the unlearned Galilean, when he talked to them, calling them "Ye men of Israel" in verse 22.) It must have made a great noise when every man heard them speak in his own particular language, and the blessed Holy Ghost Himself was the worker of it. Neither Peter nor any of the apostles tried to hush that Spiritfilled crowd, for the apostles themselves were no doubt loud in their praises and glorifying God, as the Spirit gave them utterance.

"And they were all amazed and marvelled, saying one to another, Behold are not all these which speak Galileans? And how hear we every man in our own tongue wherein we were born? . . . Others mocking said, These men are full of new wine. But Peter, standing up with the eleven, lifted up his voice, and said, unto them . . .

Hearken to my words. For these men aren ot drunken as ye suppose BUT THIS IS THAT which was (Continued on Page 12)

(Continued from Page 11) spoken by the prophet Joel: 'And it shall come to pass in the LAST DAYS saith God, I will pour out of MY SPIRIT UPON ALL FLESH . . . Jesus . . . Ye have taken and by wicked hands, have crucified and slain-This Jesus hath God raised up, whereof we all are witnesses. Therefore being by the right hand God exalted, and having received of the Father the promise of the Holy Ghost He hath shed forth THIS which ye now see and HEAR . . . Repent and be baptised every one of YOU in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins and ye shall receive the gift OF THE HOLY GHOST. For the promise is unto you and to your children and to ALL THAT ARE AFAR OFF, even as many as the Lord our God shall call. Acts 2:1-39.

Was that the complete fulfillment?
No, For we read in

THE PROPHECY OF JOEL

Joel 2:27-32, "And ye shall know that I am in the midst of Israel, and that I am the Lord your God, and none else: and my people shall never be ashamed. And it shall come to pass afterward, that I will pour out my Spirit upon all flesh; and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, your old men shall dream dreams, your young men shall see visions and also upon the servants and upon the hand maids in those days will I pour out My Spirit. And I will show wonders in the heavens and in earth, blood, and fire, and pillars of smoke. The sun shall be turned to darkness and the moon into blood, before the great and the terrible day of the Lord come. And it shall come to pass, that whosoever shall call on the name of the Lord shall be delivered: for in Mount Zion and in Jerusalem shall be deliverance, as the Lord hath said, and in the remnant whom the Lord Shall call."

ON GENTILES 10 YEARS LATER
TEN YEARS after the Day of
Pentecost, we read of where the
Holy Spirit fell "As it did at the beginning" on the Romans and they

"spoke with tongues." Cornelius, a Roman Centurian," . . . saw in a vision evidently about the ninth hour of the day, an angel of God coming in to him, and saying unto him 'Cornelius' and when he looked on him, he was afraid, and said, What is it Lord? And he said unto him, Thy prayers and thy alms are come up for a memorial before God. Now send men to Joppa and call for one Simon, whose surname is Peter." Peter with other Jews as companions arrived on the third day while Cornelius, who had gathered together his kinsmen and near friends was waiting with great anticipation to receive him. Acts 10.

"Then Peter opened his mouth and said, Of a truth I perceive that God is no respector of .persons; .But in every nation he that worketh righteousness is accepted of Him." Peter told them of righteous Jesus whom God had anointed with the Holy Ghost and with power: who had gone about healing the sick and casting our demons; how He had been crucified, had risen from the dead, and that He was ordained of God to be the Judge of quick and dead. While Peter yet spake these words the Holy Ghost fell on all them that heard the word. And they of the Circumcion (Jews) which believed were astonished, as many as came with Peter, because that on the Gentiles also was poured out the gift of the Holy Ghost. FOR they heard them speak WITH TONGUES and magnify God. Then answered Peter,

can any man forbid water, that these should not be baptised which have received the Holy Ghost as well as we?

Acts 10:44-47.

It was unnecessary for anyone to speak with tongues neither with this 'baptism' nor the next one herein given as there were no strangers nor unbelievers present and they understood Peter except that Peter did not expect to see them baptised with the Holy Ghost for Peter later testifies "As I began to speak the Holy Ghost fell on them AS ON US at the beginning. Then remembered I the word of the Lord, how that He said, John indeed baptised with water: but ye shall be baptised with the Holy Ghost. Forasmuch then as God gave them the like GIFT as He did unto us, who believed on the Lord Jesus Christ; what was I that I could withstand God? Acts 11:15-17

Such very actions of these Romans, ten years after that particular Pentecost, are now considered very improper, not being "done decently and in order" For we read," as Peter yet spake the Holy Ghost fell on them as it did at the beginning" and that Peter and his comrades knew that the gift of the Holy Ghost was given "for they heard them speak with TONGUES AND MAGNIFY GOD."

Peter was overjoyed at being interrupted in his discourse. But is it any wonder that the MOVING of the Holy Spirit is not recognizable in many churches of today?
