Pastor's Corner

Advent is in the air (yes, Advent – we're in the time of preparation). So, I wanted to share the story behind two Advent carols (both appearing in our worship for the 1st Sunday of the season – including on the new Christmas banner donated by Char McKay in memory of Cliff and his love for singing the classic carols) – *O Come, O Come Emmanuel* and *Once in Royal David's City*. Though the origins of *O Come, O Come Emmanuel* are much older – Latin portions dating back to medieval times around 1100 AD, it was put into its common form in the mid-1800s – around the same time as *Once in Royal David's City*. The authors of both carols (John Mason Neale and Cecil Frances Alexander, respectively) were born in the same year – 1818 – Neale in London and Alexander in a small Irish village called Redcross. They were very different from each other – Neale a staunch and old school traditionalist, and Alexander was down to earth, with a love for children and contemporary education. Though Neale is perhaps the more well known writer (*Good Christian Men Rejoice, Good King Wenceslaus*, etc.), I want to highlight Cecil Alexander's contribution.

Alexander devoted much time to teaching Sunday School. One of her pupils – a little boy – was struggling to understand the Apostles Creed and certain portions of the catechism. [Maybe I should remember this next part when I start teaching the Confirmation Class in January!] So, Mrs. Alexander began to mull the possibility of

converting the Apostles Creed into songs for children. The Creed begins: "I believe in God the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth, and in Jesus Christ his only Son our Lord." She references this in the 2nd verse of her hymn (OIRDC): "He came down to earth from heaven, Who is God and Lord of all." The Creed goes on to say (about Jesus specifically): "who was conceived of the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin, Mary." This was actually the part that inspired the hymn to begin with, and several of the stanzas ("Mary was that mother mild" ... etc.). The Creed goes on to speak of the second coming of Christ, prompting Mrs. Alexander to write a different hymn, but you can also hear an echo of the creed in the last verse of *Once in Royal David's City*: "And our eyes at last shall see Him / Through His own redeeming love / For that child so dear and gentle / Will come again from heav'n above / And He leads His children on / To the place where He is gone."

A fitting refrain, as the *first Sunday of Advent* is set aside to focus not on Christ's first humble coming, but his *triumphant second coming*. Alexander's works were published in a book, "Hymns for Little Children," which would become one of the most successful hymn publishing projects in history, going through more than 100 editions, and telling children for generations what happened 'once in royal David's city.' As children of the Lord, let's keep learning more about our heavenly Father, and keep rehearsing our story so we can sing it out to the world.

Devotional -

I am preaching this sermon the first Sunday of Advent (12/1), so you've likely already heard a little and hopefully understand why I chose to end the series with it as we begin the pre-Christmas season. This passage has LONG captured my imagination – because it's essentially a "peek behind the veil" of what was going on in "the heavenly realm" with the birth of Christ, for this account is clearly about the birth of the Messiah. And God, the most masterful writer of his *Sacred Drama*, has both of these happening at the same time: a carpenter and teenage girl giving birth to a baby boy in the humblest of places and circumstances, accompanied by physical pain and risk ... AND a cosmic battle between protective angelic forces and demonic antagonists trying to ruin and ravage the birth of the Messiah.

Max Lucado depicts the story in fictional form in one of his books, *Cosmic Christmas*. Before taking the form of a dragon, Satan is found in the throne room of heaven (kind of like the early scene in the book of Job) ... "Lucifer lurked around the throne room and said, 'Show me O King of Light, show me one person on the Earth who always does right and obeys your will.' The King replied, 'You know there need be only one; one perfect, sinless one to die for the others.' The Serpent retorted, 'I know your plans – and You have *failed*! No Messiah will come from your people. There is none who is sinless. Not one.' ... The King walked over and reached for a book. He turned it toward Lucifer and commanded, 'Come, Deceiver, read the name of the One who will call your bluff. Read the name of the One who will storm your gates.' Satan slithered toward the desk, and hovered over the volume and read the word: *Immanuel*. 'Immanuel?' he muttered to himself ... 'God with us?!' For the first time the hooded head turned toward the face of the Father – 'NO. Not even You would do that. Not even You would go so far!' The King replied, 'I will reclaim what is mine. I will become flesh. I will bring mercy. I will give life." Later in the book there's a conflict between Satan and Michael, and simultaneously (*unbeknownst to the carpenter and full-term mother*) the time for the child to be born comes, accompanied by *roadblocks* and *rejections* and many things that *seem mundane* – greatly challenging but not extraordinary. And yet, God was acting to protect and vouchsafe his plan for our redemption ... through *Immanuel*.

It is strange though that the story in Rev. 12, with the child being born and then "snatched up to heaven" feels like it takes Jesus' story and goes straight from his birth to the Ascension - "snatching up" is very similar language to the verse 1:9 - he "was taken up." John isn't afraid to talk about the crucifixion - it's not that he's shy to mention it because it might seem like the Dragon wins on Calvary. No, just read John's Gospel and you'll see he ties crucifixion and resurrection inextricably together as Christ's victory. John knows most of his readers are defined by the resurrection. Here in Revelation, John is emphasizing the spiritual (behind the veil) part we don't see, opening the curtain so we see that reality that Jesus was delivered from the hostile powers which continually attacked him (Herod with slaughter of the innocents, the Tempter in the wilderness, the garden of Gethsemane) - he was delivered from them all by the direct action, love, and power of God. Here is the application - the "so what?" you may be wondering about to help you properly celebrate Christmas this year ... John is showing us reality ... Yes, he's using symbols to do it (including the color **RED**), but he is showing us the *real*, *exalted Christ*, who now can do for us what the Father did for him – that is, to rescue and save His people in the time of their distresses, and ultimately from all evil, no matter how "big" and "bad" – Satan (literally, the "Accuser") has nothing to accuse us with anymore if we are in Christ. That is the beauty of Immanuel. As the glorious verses say, we have "overcome by the blood of the Lamb and by the word of our testimony." Amen - Pastor Brian

CAPITAL CAMPAIGN UPDATE!



[Drumroll Please!]

The Capital Campaign Committee, in conjunction with the Puckety Session, is pleased to announce that we have not only completed all three of our Capital Campaign projects - resurfacing the parking lot, replacing the church roof, and installing a digital sign but that we have reached our fundraising goal! We raised a total of \$132,000, which fully covered the cost of the three projects. We applied for and received a \$70,000 loan in June of this year. On November 12, Session approved and submitted the final payment of \$25,870.15. The original terms of the loan included repayment over 5 years, but with the generous donations of our members, friends & family we were able to pay it off in 5 months from time of loan's approval! All that remains is to pay back the Cemetery Fund, which was borrowed against to make a needed

power supply upgrade after the projects. So, any continued gifts / contributions to the Capital Campaign will be applied to this amount *(currently \$9,836.06)*, directly related to the C.C. work. We *praise and thank God* for his hand in guiding us in this amazing accomplishment. We extend our gratitude to the *Capital Campaign Committee*, the *Fundraising Committee*, the *Upkeep Team*, and *all who helped -* through fundraising, faithfully pledging, or offering support in other ways. This was truly an *entire congregation* effort. The Campaign began as a proposal in January (though wasn't officially launched till February) and ended in November. This means <u>a proposed 5-year project was completed in 11 months</u>! Again, thanks to you, and especially to God's Spirit who we have seen move greatly this year. God is good, all the time! Help us spread the praise of his Name.

CONFIRMATION CLASS - Pastor Brian plans to offer a confirmation class for any youth (6th to 12th grade) who would like to go learn more about the Christian faith with the intention of making it personal, becoming ready to affirm it in worship, and become a member of Puckety Church. The class is tentatively scheduled to start on *Sunday, January 12th* (meeting *weekly from 8:30 AM to 9:30 AM*) and last for 13 Sundays. *Please note that to complete the requirements of the class* and become a member, every student would need to attend & participate in at least 10 of the classes (no more than 3 absences). Please contact Pastor Brian by December 1st to sign up for the class so materials can be acquired.


