WORSHIP AND PRAYER

Everyday Stewardship: Recognize God in Moments

If you had \$100 to give away, to whom would you give it? Let's say you have narrowed it down to two different people. You know both of these people, and you suspect each person would be equally grateful. Does it make a difference who you give the money to in the end? What if I told you that one of the individuals just got a big raise at work, and the other person is at risk of having their water turned off because they have been late paying their bill. Does it make a difference now?

Discernment should always be an important part of any good steward's way of life. If we give simply for the sake of giving, that may not always be the best use of our gifts. In order to gain the most fruit from the seeds we plant, we must plant wisely. All we have been given has value, and we need be good caretakers of it all. If you ever do find yourself with \$100 to spare, be sure to carefully consider all the options and make the wiser choice. In the meantime, pray for wisdom and reflect on how to best use all you have been given for the sake of the Kingdom of God.

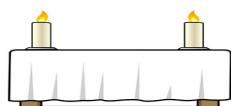

We are now in the second season of Ordinary Time on the Church Calendar. The first season extends from the feast of the Baptism of Our Lord until Ash Wednesday. This second season starts the Monday after Pentecost and runs to the first Sunday of Advent, making it the longest season of the liturgical year. We notice that the color of the priest's vestments change to green, and our music perhaps becomes more familiar and maybe even repetitive. Green is the color of hope and growth. Diocesan Bite: “The seventy-two returned, rejoicing, and said, ‘Lord, even demons are subject to us because of your name.’
