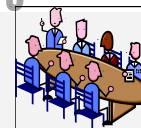

Mission Message

PEACEFUL COEXISTENCE

In the East African country of Tanzania, 61% of the population is Christian. But the offshore island of Zanzibar is almost entirely Muslim. Nevertheless, there is a Lutheran church there. Anglicans, Catholics and Lutherans work on the island in the mainly tourist economy. Sectarian violence is not unknown, but the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Tanzania plays a large role in maintaining harmony. One ministry on Zanzibar sews apparel with Christian and Muslim women working side by side; the Zanzibar Interfaith Centre offers workshops in interfaith dialogue; an interfaith soccer team begins each game with both Christian and Muslim prayers. Local peace committees bolster amicable relations at times of stress or transition, such as during elections, by offering seminars, and by communicating with candidates, police officers and government officials.

The Tanzanian tradition of tolerance emphasizes taking time to understand the "other." It is a lesson that Christians on Zanzibar, who are a very small minority, can share with Muslims in the US and Europe, where they are the minority.



Pastor's message..

What does freedom look like?

If you were to ask yourself, “*What does freedom look like?*”, what would your answer be? If we were to ask all the members of Tree of Life Lutheran Church, “*What does freedom for TOL look like?*” What would we say?

For Jesus, freedom looked like: proclaiming of good news to the poor, people released from what holds them captive, healing the sick, and forgiving people from the debts that oppress.

So what does freedom look like?

A short time ago, I came across an old journal entry written days after the terrorist attacks of Sept. 11, 2001. I had written:

“The unstable state of the world seems to have invaded the psyche of everyone around me, including myself. Ever since Sept. 11, we collectively seem to be waiting for something terrible to happen. This after all is the goal of becoming captive to terrorism – the perpetuation of

fear and anxiety. I recall a Bible verse I learned in Sunday School from John 10:10, “The

thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy; I came that they may have life and have it in abundance.” In response to this text, I ask myself this question, “*What am I allowing to be destroyed or stolen – to diminish the fullness of life that Jesus gives generously?*”



What does freedom look like?

Because, if freedom looks like Jesus: *good news, released oppression, healing and forgiveness*, am I living in the freedom of Christ? This is a deep question to all to ponder.

Because, when people like Jesus talk about true freedom for all, it can make us nervous. We wonder what all this freedom will mean.

- **Who is in charge, if Jesus calls us to live in freedom and forgiveness?**
- **What does living in freedom truly look like?**

1st Corinthians 12 tells us about the interdependent relationship we have as the Church: one that calls us to freedom from sin and engagement with people.

“There are many parts, but one body in Christ and... If one member suffers, all suffer together with it; if one member is honored, all rejoice together with it.”

The church functions in an interconnected relationship of people, working together in partnership with God. Each member having a role and responsibility in the overall work of the church. The world pressures people to be independent from others – to accomplish all the goals of life, pay all our debts and look good while doing it all perfectly. **This is lie.**

The freedom that Jesus gives, isn't freedom to isolate and turn in towards ourselves. The freedom of Jesus moves us from the oppressed state of being curved in on oneself that Martin Luther

explains as the root of sin. Sin is defined as “living inward for self rather than “outward” for God and others.”

In the body of Christ, “we” are brought from isolation of living for self, to being united with Christ. Jesus Christ not only unites us to himself, but he unites us to one another. Our ties and connections with people, with community, can be a place of struggle, but they can also be a means of grace.

The freedom Jesus gives, is release from pain, shame, sin, and un-forgiveness. Jesus, who took the cross upon himself, releases us from turning inward and loosen us from blindness and hatred. The Spirit of God, turns us outward to be nourished and enlivened to live fully in relationship with God and people.

Our ties and connections with people, with community, can be a place of struggle, but they also are a means of grace.

God calls us into relationship with God – and into relationship with each other. The letter to the people of Corinth remind us that we NEED the action of the Spirit

2019 Honduras Mission Trip

The Honduras Promise Children Mission Project is planning their Mission Trip for 2019, and we are looking for new team members. This is an ecumenical group, although St. Timothy Lutheran Church is the sponsoring organization. We have been involved in Honduras for about 25 years.

We plan to fly on Saturday April 19th and return on Saturday April 27th. These dates are in the school vacation of some schools.

We will be traveling to our on-going project in the small village of la Villa de San Francisco. We sponsor 31 children in this village, and support a staff of 3 for their weekly program of education, spiritual learning, recreation, social/psychological guidance.

During the trip, we will meet with the children and staff daily, and also with their families. We will bring activities as a group, plus work with the on-going projects that our staff leads throughout the year.

We welcome all team members- men, women and teens. We will fly from Toronto, staying overnight before and after the trip. The total cost for everything will be about \$1000.
