Ordinance O-2015-34

**AN ORDINANCE AFFIRMING THE APPOINTMENT OF
CHARLES A. SAYLOR AS A FULL-TIME POLICE OFFICER AND
DECLARING AN EMERGENCY**

WHEREAS, on January 13, 2015, the Amelia Village Council enacted Ordinance No. O-2015-06, appointing Charles A. Saylor to the position of probationary full-time police officer; and

WHEREAS, the Council of Amelia Village acknowledges the successful completion of the probationary period required by Ohio Revised Code Section 737.17 by Officer Charles A. Saylor, the transmittal by the Mayor of a record of Officer Saylor's service during the probationary period and the Mayor's recommendation to affirm the appointment of Charles A. Saylor as a full-time police officer,

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Council of Amelia Village, Ohio, that:

SECTION I. Council hereby concurs with the recommendation by the Mayor to affirm the appointment of Charles A. Saylor as a full-time police officer for Amelia Village.

SECTION II. Charles A. Saylor is hereby employed as a permanent full-time police officer of Amelia Village at a starting salary of \$17.54 per hour effective Monday, July 13, 2015.

SECTION III. All prior Resolutions or Ordinances or any part thereof, which are inconsistent with this Ordinance are hereby repealed as to the inconsistent part(s) thereof and the remainder of said Resolutions or Ordinances not inconsistent with this Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION IV. Council hereby finds and determines that all formal actions relative to the passage of this ordinance were taken in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of its committees, if any, which resulted in formal action, were taken in meetings open to the public, in full compliance with applicable legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION V. This ordinance is hereby declared an emergency which is necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety, and general welfare. The reason for such necessity is that the immediate need to provide the necessary police protection to the citizens of the Village. Therefore, provided this emergency clause receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all members elected to Council, this ordinance shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

MA. Campbell moved to suspend the rules requiring three readings on three separate dates;
