### **BROOME CUP 13 APRIL 2016**

For once we were blessed with a fine sunny evening, good conditions for runners and officials alike. 125 runners set off on the four lap course around the Moorways playing fields, and 120 of them managed to complete it. I'm pleased to report the finish was less chaotic than in some recent years, with just a couple of runners passing round the outside of the finish funnel and being missed off the recording sheets. All was sorted out in an email rally the next day, helped by photographic evidence. Having joined the finish recorders for the first time, I realised just how difficult the job is, with lap-counting an extra complication since we had to move away from our one-lap course on Sinfin Moor. So I'll repeat my thanks to the timekeeper, Mike Heffernan, and all the marshals, time recorders and course markers who ensured the event ran as smoothly as possible.

Winner for the second year was Jaimie Roden, nearly 2 minutes clear of Robin Carter and Kenny Malton, and nearly another minute ahead of the first vet, 4<sup>th</sup> placed Russell Parkin. Beth Pascall was first lady, 17<sup>th</sup> overall, and the winners of the Pearson Team Trophy were Trent 1000 A, Jaimie Roden, Andy Roulston, Guy Bamber and Graham Boyle. The vets team prize went to Dept 4067, Rich Blyth, Pat Kiernan and Karolina Kucharek, and the first ladies team was Trent XWB Ladies, Jessica Kennedy, Holly Farrer, Pauline Hilley and Michelle Tindall.

Main Race runners have to be 15 and over. There are also children's races of 1 mile for up to and including Year 6, and 2 miles for Year 7 and above.

Race entry fees £3 for all except Bradgate Park, where it will be £4 to include a fee for Parking. There may be a £2.50 car park charge at Bosworth Visitors Centre. Children's race entry fees £1.

Car sharing is essential. If you turn up in a car with less than 3 you won't be allowed in the car park (except for cars with tents in).

Age categories for individuals this year will be in 5 year bands starting at VM40 and VF40, then VM45 and VF45, etc.
