2. If yes, what policy or budget item that supports people with disabilities who are employed or seeking employment are you most proud of advancing during your tenure?

I am one of two people in the House Democratic Caucus responsible for K-12 funding. My Masters degree is in Special Education; I taught special ed, supervised special ed personnel, and later supervised the special education program for the Spokane Public Schools. I was also an adjunct professor in the Special Education program at Gonzaga University during the time my children were being born and supervised special education student teachers for the University. This experience and training has been invaluable in helping to craft special education legislation.

3. If you are not an incumbent, what will you do to support individuals with disabilities find and keep jobs and contribute to our economy?

I am an incumbent.

4. Do you personally know anyone with an intellectual/developmental disability? I/DD includes people who have cognitive disabilities such as Down syndrome, Autism, Cerebral Palsy, etcetera.

I know hundreds of people (and their parents). A very close friend of mine was a DD student in Spokane, and we have stayed in touch for at least 20 years.

- **5.** Have you ever worked alongside anyone with a developmental or intellectual disability? Many times in classrooms and during campaigns. My friend (mentioned above) door belled with me often. She knew to look at the age of the next person we would talk to, and she would then advise me on what topic to bring up.
- 6. Nearly 80% of people with a developmental disability are not employed or are underemployed. What can you do in your role to address this issue?

We need more funding to extend the great programs already in place to find suitable employment and supervise the work closely enough to promote success. Organizations such Rotary can also help by providing DD people an internship so that business leaders can get to know them and offer them employment.

7. Many people with developmental and intellectual disabilities who do work are worried about losing critical lifeline benefits such as medical care and social security because of earnings. Will you commit to working with CEA and other stakeholders to bridge this gap in coverage for people who want to work?

8. It is estimated that 12,560 people with developmental disabilities receive NO paid services

from the Developmental Disabilities Administration. If you are elected, what will you do to ensure services for all?

Most of these questions center around more funding. One of the main reasons I ran for public office was to create sustainable progressive funding for state revenue. I serve on the Finance Committee where we continue to promote a capital gains tax.
