Summer Reading 2017 Program


This summer we had another successful Summer Reading Program at the library. We want to send a huge THANK YOU to the Friends of the Library for their support with this program. We couldn't have done it without you! You may know that this summer we used a new program called Beanstack that allowed patrons to register, log reading, create book reviews, earn points and badges, and get book recommendations online and on the library computers. This change meant that the summer was a lot easier for staff and that patrons had more flexibility in logging for the program. We reduced our prize store and awarded prizes at milestones instead, and added in the raffle for four Kindle Fires that you purchased, as well as passes and prizes donated by local businesses and prganizations.

We got great feedback on these changes, and almost everyone loved using Beanstack and earning the badges. We had 1,105 children register and 633 of them earned their free book to complete the program. We held 22 events for kids this summer including four amazing performers, Tech Tuesdays, Lego Club, and Maker Thursdays. These were attended by over 1,000 people. The summer program allowed kids to log learning activities as well as reading for points. Additionally we added a fun challenge of locating our summer mascot, Gear the polar bear, at various locations downtown. Gear had a secret code that was entered on Beanstack and kids were entered into a raffle to win the stuffed animal and a book. This was a very popular program and one we will repeat throughout the school year. Altogether kids read for 1,745 hours and finished 10,552 books!

Our rate of completion went up this year by a little, but biggest rise was in the free summer lunch program we offer through the school district. They served 1,743 lunches this year, which was about 500 more than last year. We had popsicles for readers, and pushed the lunches a little later and the afternoon programs earlier to try to encourage families to do both.

We have lots of fun planned for the fall ahead. We will continue our Very Ready Reader Storytimes but are trying something new with the evening. Since attendance is irregular and low for our storytimes at night, we will try offering a single, special storytime monthly. September features a Pajama Storytime with a Stuffed Animal Sleepover, and we have other fun ideas ready for the following months. We will use Beanstack for a fall reading challenge as well as beginning 1,000 Books Before Kindergarten. The Afterschool Program with board games, arts and craft days, and Lego Club restarts in September and we hope to encourage kids to learn chess and try out the Tuesday night, all ages, Chess Club. Minecraft Club returns later in September, and our coding classes in partnership with UC Davis will resume in October. We have the Pet Show, Halloween, and a Harry Potter Yule Ball to look forward to as well. That should keep us busy!

Thanks again for all that you do to make these programs possible!



We are starting to organize for this year's fundraiser. If you are interested in helping us with this very fun (and largest fundraising) event, please email us.



~National Friends of Libraries Week ~ 12th Annual October 15-21, 2017

The Friends of the Woodland Public Library (FOL) will be spending the week of October 15-21, 2017, celebrating the 12th annual celebration of National Friends of Libraries Week with some exciting events planned this month at our library.

Local author Kris Calvin will speak at the Friends of the Library's Author Event on Thursday, October 19th at 6:00pm in the Leake Room at the Woodland Public Library, 250 First Street. Her talk is titled "Advocacy & Creativity: 2 Pillars of a Meaningful Life."

This event is free and open to the public. There will be a members-only "meet and greet" reception with the author at 5:30pm, followed by the public presentation at 6:00pm. Friends of the Library (FOL) membership applications and renewals will be available at the door.

Kris Calvin is a past local elected official who knows politics from the inside out. She has been honored by the California State Assembly and the California Governor's Office for her advocacy on behalf of children.

Kris' education includes degrees from Stanford and UC Berkeley, with training in economics and forensic psychology. More than a decade of work with state legislators and bureaucrats provides Kris with ample fodder for murder and mayhem in her debut Sacramento-based mystery series, which features lobbyist Maren Kane as an amateur sleuth.

When she's not writing, you're likely to find Kris at mystery writer conferences, in the halls of the Capitol in Sacramento, or cheering on her teams at Warriors basketball and SF Giants baseball games.

Kris Calvin's debut novel, a Sacramento-based thriller/mystery called One Murder More, was awarded the 2016 Silver Falchion national literary award in three categories: Best First Novel, Best Political Thriller, and Best Female PI/Sleuth.

745.5 Square One

Square One has been open for 6 weeks, and the community has been very enthusiastic about the space. We are opening new equipment weekly and offering nearly daily Basic Use and Safety (BUS) classes and workshops. A few hundred people have come by for tours, and we've held classes for over 100 people to learn how to safely operate the laser cutter, sewing machines, and soldering stations. Once a patron has taken the BUS class, they can return to Square One during open shop hours to use the equipment. Other equipment (small CNC router, dye cutters, button makers, laminators) simply requires a demo and checkoff by a staff member for a patron to use. At this time, all the materials in Square One are being offered at no charge to encourage patrons to come learn how to use the equipment. The only cost that will ever be in Square One is for materials at our cost. In the coming weeks and months, we'll be adding classes on photo editing, video production, mini computer building, tote bag sewing, making fidget spinners with pre-teens, and more. We'll also be adding BUS classes for the woodshop and classes on the various software offered in the space. Volunteers have come by to help with equipment, offer classes and workshops, and assist other patrons with projects. Anyone interested in teaching a workshop is encouraged to stop by Square One and talk to staff.
