We sing the standard hymns, and they join in. You should see the smiles on their faces. In fact, you should. Right now, we have seven (7) faithful. Has the Lord been tugging at your heart? If so, you should obey now. You are always welcome to join us at the corner of 69th & Wentworth. You can make a difference, too.
