





SECOND READING: Romans 3:19-28

¹⁹Now we know that whatever the law says, it speaks to those who are under the law, so that every mouth may be silenced, and the whole world may be held accountable to God. ²⁰For "no human being will be justified in his sight" by deeds prescribed by the law, for through the law comes the knowledge of sin.

²¹But now, apart from law, the righteousness of God has been disclosed,

and is attested by the law and the prophets, ²²the righteousness of God through faith in Jesus Christ for all who believe. For there is no distinction, ²³since all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God; ²⁴they are now justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, ²⁵whom God put forward as a sacrifice of atonement by his blood, effective through faith. 



October 30 - Tomorrow in Lund, Sweden, the Lutheran World Federation (LWF) and the Catholic Church will hold a joint ecumenical commemoration in anticipation of the 500th anniversary of the Reformation in 2017. This historic event, led by Pope Francis and LWF representatives, will highlight the solid ecumenical developments between our churches over the past 50 years.
