
# June Meeting Schoolhouse workshops

Ginger Wanserski will be demonstrating how to make her beautiful coiled bowls










Vicki Madsen will be bringing us "Yikes! Stripes!"

Mary Wolter is training to become a certified quilt show judge which involves taking a training class, observing the judging at several local and regional shows, performing the judging at a show, taking a written exam, and completing a mock judging before a panel of other certified judges. In order to fulfill the requirement of judging a show, LHQ is providing the venue and asking some of our enthusiastic quilters to be contestants.



Please consider entering some quilts into this special quilt show. There is a category for first time show entrants – so this is an opportunity for those who have never entered in a show before to give it a try! Don't be shy! Mary will be performing the judging at the July meeting/rummage sale, so you may observe the judging and you can take your items home the same day. There will be ribbons for the winners! No prize money, but you will have bragging rights!

Please note that there is a separate class for charity quilts. Hopefully you have worked on a few during the quarantine and our in-person meeting hiatus and would consider entering one in this class for some special recognition. We hope to see lots of entries in this special category.

# **Lighthouse Quilters Summer Quilt Show**

# July 25, 2022 Rules

- 1. Any member attending the July 2022 LHQ meeting may enter quilts in this show. Limited to the first 40 entries.
- 2. No special entry form is needed. Simply include the following information in an email to Mary at qltrwolter@gmail.com by midnight Friday, July 22.
  - Name and phone number
  - Name of each quilt entry
  - The class for each quilt entry
- 3. You may enter only 1 item per class, for a maximum of 5 entries per member. Classes are as follows:
  - Class 1: Lap quilts and crib/toddler quilts (limit to 280" perimeter)
  - Class 2: Charity quilts
  - Class 3: Wall hangings
  - Class 4: Tablerunners & Tabletoppers
  - Class 5: First judged entry
- 4. There is no entry fee. No hanging sleeves are required.
- 5. No class distinctions shall be made for construction technique (eg: applique or pieced) or what manner of quilting was used (eg: hand, machine, self or professional). Classes are simply defined by the size of the quilt and/or its purpose.
- 6. Items must be quilted and must include 3 layers--(top, batting, and backing)
- 7. No cheater cloth quilts or framed items, please

# **Entries MUST:**

- 1. Be clean and odor free.
- 2. Have been completed within the last 5 years. Note: Any item that you enter into this guild show will NOT be prohibited from being entered into the 2023 Lighthouse Legacies show.

#### Additional information:

- 1. Lighthouse Quilters Guild, Inc. provides a secure location. However, items are entered at your own risk.
- 2. The judge reserves the right to reclassify entries if needed.
- 3. Ribbons will be awarded at the judges' discretion. If entered items do not meet the judge's criteria, ribbons may not be awarded in all classes.
- 4. Judging will be completed by Mary Wolter.
- 5. Quilts must be dropped off at the judging entry table the day of the meeting between 5 6 pm. Quilts must be picked up the same day, after the conclusion of the judging presentation, but no later than 9:30 pm.
- 6. Photographs of you and/or your entry may be taken and may be used for guild promotional purposes.
