

# 5<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year C) Sunday 9 February 2025 Put Out Into the Deep

Luke's gospel today opens with Jesus, standing on the shore of the Lake of Gennesaret looking for a little breathing space having experienced crowds of people pressing round him listening to the Word He proclaims and witnessing the healings He brought to many. Jesus spots two empty boats, gets into the one belonging to Simon the fisherman. Simon's boat then becomes His teaching platform and Jesus resumes teaching the people. Simon, fed up after an unsuccessful night's fishing is ready to pack up and head for home. It's at this moment that Jesus asks him to set sail again and cast his nets into the deep waters of the lake. This wasn't what Simon (Peter) had hoped for but he responds to Jesus' direction. The rest becomes a parable of Jesus' mission with the commissioning of Peter and his companions. The dramatic result of the unexpected 'catch' brings Peter to his knees. He acknowledges his scepticism and sinfulness having experienced the power and presence of God in the person of Jesus. This experience nurturing at the same time a sense of awe in God's presence and deep humility will change the rest of his life.

As Sr Veronica Lawson RSM describes it in her reflection on today's readings, "Jesus then commissions Peter to engage fearlessly and with Faith in a new mission of reaching out beyond his present enterprise to 'catch people'. This commission is not a recruitment drive for the reign of God movement. As Luke's Gospel unfolds, we discover that it is, rather, a mission to bring the vulnerable to shore where they can know the compassion, justice and the 'hospitality' of God." By re-centering their lives on following Jesus, the disciples are not being asked to separate themselves from life but to be instruments of God's action in the midst of the concerns of human life.

Two weeks ago (3rd Sunday Ordinary time) we were given a glimpse of what Jesus understood His mission to be as it was written in the book of Isaiah: "to bring good news to the poor, to proclaim liberty to captives, to give new sight to the blind, heal the sick, set the downtrodden free" ... (Isaiah 1) in other words to draw the broken and the isolated into the community of God which is not some exclusive state but open to all. And, Jesus proclaims later in Luke's Gospel, "The kingdom of God is among you".

In the readings today, Isaiah, St Paul and Peter a fisherman, are driven by life changing encounters with the divine presence and power in their lives. Today's first reading, describing the awe—inspiring call of Isaiah, is an invitation to take time to reflect deeply upon our life as a journey of discipleship, and as pilgrims of hope may we also

respond as did the prophet: "Here I am, send me."

We continue to speak of Peter's leadership and influence in the Church today when we call the Pope the "successor of Peter." We participate in the mission of the Church which IS Jesus' mission when, hearing Jesus' invitation anew through the voice of Pope Francis inviting us to be Pilgrims of Hope, we become bearers of God's mercy and love to others in our daily lives and interractions.

## Characteristics of the Jubilee Opening of the Holy Doors

The Holy Door has a special symbolic significance: it is the most powerful sign of the Jubilee, since the pilgrim ultimately aims to pass through it. The opening of the door by the Pope constitutes the official beginning of the Hoy Year. Originally there was only one door at the Basilica of St John Lateran which is the cathedral of the Bishop of Rome. Later, to allow as many pilgrims as possible to take part in the Jubilee experience, the other Roman Basilicas also opened their own holy doors.

Pope Francis opened the following 5 Holy Doors in this Year of Jubilee:

- 1. 24 December 2024 St Peter's Basilica, Rome
- 2. 26 December 2024 Doors at Rebibbia prison in Rome for the first time ever
- 3. 29 December 2024 St John Lateran (San Giovanni Laterano). On this day Most Reverend Peter Comensoli, Archbishop of Melbourne formally declared the Jubilee Year open in Melbourne, at the 11 am Mass at St Patrick's Cathedral
- 4. 1 January 2025 Papal Basilica of Saint Mary Major (Santa Maria Maggiore) on the Solemnity of Mary Mother of God
- 5. 5 January 2025 Papal Basilica of Saint Paul Outside the Walls

In crossing the threshold of the Holy Door, the pilgrim is reminded of the passage from Chapter 10 of the gospel according to St John: "I am the door. If anyone enters by me, he will be saved and will go in and out and find pasture."

### SECOND READING

1 Corinthians 15:1-11

Brothers, I want to remind you of the gospel I preached to you, the gospel that you received and in which you are firmly established; because the gospel will save you only if you keep believing exactly what I preached to you – believing anything else will not lead to anything.

Well then, in the first place, I taught you what I had been taught myself, namely that Christ died for our sins, in accordance with the scriptures; that he was buried; and that he was raised to life on the third day, in accordance with the scriptures; that he appeared first to Cephas and secondly to the Twelve. Next he appeared to more than five hundred of the brothers at the same time, most of whom are still alive, though some have died; then he appeared to James, and then to all the apostles; and last of all he appeared to me too; it was as though I was born when no one expected it.

I am the least of the apostles; in fact, since I persecuted the Church of God, I hardly deserve the name apostle; but by God's grace that is what I am, and the grace that he gave me has not been fruitless. On the contrary, I, or rather the grace of God that is with me, have worked harder than any of the others; but what matters is that I preach what they preach, and this is what you all believed.

#### GOSPEL

Luke 5:1-11

Jesus was standing one day by the Lake of Gennesaret, with the crowd pressing round him listening to the word of God, when he caught sight of two boats close to the bank. The fishermen had gone out of them and were washing their nets. He got into one of the boats – it was Simon's – and asked him to put out a little from the shore. Then he sat down and taught the crowds from the boat

When he had finished speaking he said to Simon, 'Put out into deep water and pay out your nets for a catch.' 'Master,' Simon replied, 'we worked hard all night long and caught nothing, but if you say so, I will pay out the nets.' And when they had done this they netted such a huge number of fish that their nets began to tear, so they signalled to their companions in the other boat to come and help them; when these came, they filled the two boats to sinking point.

When Simon Peter saw this he fell at the knees of Jesus saying, 'Leave me, Lord; I am a sinful man.' For he and all his companions were completely overcome by the catch they had made; so also were James and John, sons of Zebedee, who were Simon's partners. But Jesus said to Simon, 'Do not be afraid; from now on it is men you will catch.' Then, bringing their boats back to land, they left everything and followed him.
