#### Location

Armonk, a hamlet in the town of North Castle, is located 28 miles northeast of Manhattan and 8 miles north of White Plains. The 27 square mile area is bordered by Mount Pleasant, Mount Kisco, Banksville and North White Plains.

#### **Government**

Town offices are located at Town Hall, 15 Bedford Road, (914) 273-3321. The Town is governed by a Town Board comprised of four Council Members selected for four-year terms and a supervisor who serves for two years. There are two Town Justices elected every four years.

#### **Public Transportation**

Residents are within minutes of the Metro North train stations in both North White Plains and White Plains. The commuting time to NYC is 38 minutes. In addition, there is the Westchester County Bee-line (682-2020) to provide bus service. Nearby is access to the Saw Mill River Parkway and Route 684.
