The End of an Era!

International Day

As you continue to read this edition of News and Views, you will see that Dorothy has been forced to resign as Federation Chair through ill health. She has struggled on for nearly a year after a nasty fall and without the support of her husband Mervyn to drive her around the county (often waiting outside in the car while she fulfilled her duties), she could not have continued in the role for so long. At our January Trustees meeting, the Board of Trustees thanked her for her years of service to SYFWI and presented her with a bouquet of flowers and a bottle of wine with our best wishes for the future.



As Vice-Chair, I have stepped into the role as an interim measure until we elect our new Federation Chair at the first Board of Trustees meeting after our Annual Meeting. Some of you may know me from when I was the Federation ACWW rep when the Federation supported this organisation (I may have come to talk to your WI!). Others will know me from Current Affairs & Resolutions events over the years as I have been a member of this team since 2014. Others again may know me from the WI Officer training that the Federation has organised over recent years. I am one of the founding members of Bawtry WI, after the old Austerfield WI was suspended in 2012. I joined the WI in 2002 as a middle-aged woman moving "up north" from Coventry looking for friendship and fun! The Federation Chair is elected from members of the Board of Trustees. This is different to what happens at local WI level, where the President is elected by the members. However, the Federation members elect the Board of Trustees. Your WI Secretary is due to be sent a Board of Trustees Nomination Form for you to nominate people for the Board – please consider this. The present Board of Trustees are "ordinary" WI members, we don't have specialist skills, only a belief in the WI's work and influence as an organisation and a desire for the Federation to continue its work. We *cannot* do this without new members joining us. If you would like further information about the responsibilities of the Board and what is involved, please contact me on my email address above. The Board of Trustees are considering new ways of working to make it easier for women to join in and contribute. We realise that different lifestyles and societal changes have made an impact on womens' lives and we have to change how we work to move forward. We



need your support for this. If joining the Board of Trustees is a step too far, please consider joining one of our sub-teams (Current Affairs & Resolutions or Activities & Leisure). You really would be welcomed!

Dear WI Ladies.

It is with sorrow and regret that I am standing down from the Board of Trustees and from two of the Federation Sub-Teams.

I joined Penistone WI in June 2005 when we moved to South Yorkshire. I became a Committee member in November 2005 and Secretary in November of 2006. My fellow WI member, Irene Adamson encouraged me to join the Public Affairs Sub Committee and the Combined Arts Sub Committee in November 2007.



By March of 2008 I was elected onto the Board of Trustees and President of Penistone WI in November 2008. In March 2010 I was elected as Senior Vice Chairman of the Board of Trustees and Chairman in March of 2012. I have been re-elected as Federation Chairman every two years since 2012. I was also interested to know what the other Federation Sub Committees were up to so I joined the Home Economics Sub Committee and the Leisure Activities Sub Committees as well as the Office and Finance Sub Committee in March 2012.

I have always been interested to find out what other roles and responsibilities involved so in November 2015 I began training as a WI Adviser a role I thoroughly enjoy and will continue to do. In August 2016 I went to Denman to find out more about the role of the Federation Archivist keeping records and the history of WIs is another interest of mine.

In March of 2024 I took a tumble down a few stairs whilst visiting another Federations Headquarters and must have landed awkwardly and therefore spent a few hours in A&E in Barnsley the following day. The MRI scan showed that I had a small bleed on my brain as well as damaging 4 vertebrae (2 in my neck and 2 in the small of my back). This has resulted in making walking difficult at times and less mobility in my neck. I have not driven since then and have relied on my husband to do all the driving but I cannot let this situation continue forever.

I have at long last accepted that I will not make a full recovery and life has to change.

I thank everyone of you for the friendship and support that has been given to me over the years and hope to be able to attend some of the WI events that I am able to.

Hopefully 2025 has started positively for all members, the dreadful cold spell notwithstanding. Fingers crossed that everyone has managed to submit their vote for their preferred Resolution for the coming year, although it seems hardly any time at all since we were heralding the start of last year's campaign: Dental Health Matters.

As has been reiterated on several occasions, the campaigns are not just for one year. The very fact that so many of them include the aim of "raising awareness" necessitates that they are seen, heard, acted upon or discussed time and again. Currently the WI is teamed up with the British Dental Association, 38 Degrees and the Mirror to call on the Prime Minister to save NHS dentistry. The aim was to gather 250,000 signatures for a petition which will be taken to parliament early this year. At the time of writing this article (9 January) I have been able to sign the petition via a link from My WI, and I am sure many members will have done so well before me. The target number of signatures appears to have been exceeded according to the petition page which would seem to indicate that it will soon be time for the next step.

Whatever the outcome of South Yorkshire Federation's vote** on the 2025 Resolutions' Shortlist, the most popular choice, should it be adopted at the National Annual Meeting, will be taken up by Public Affairs at national level with materials and ideas disseminated to individual WIs, thus allowing for another year of successful campaigning.




Winning the WI Lottery

Show The Love

Every year, in February, the WI takes part in Show The Love in order to raise awareness for protecting people, climate and nature.

The green heart is a powerful symbol that can be used to get your message across. It lends itself to a form of activism called craftivism. This means using craft as a 'gentle protest', a way of starting conversations and engaging with people which fits very well with the WI. We can use our craftivism to show our politicians that people want to see action for climate and nature. You could make a green heart (out of paper, wool, felt, material) and send it to your MP, telling them what you love and why you want it to be protected. Another way to use green hearts is to create a display in your community, try some yarn bombing or make letter box toppers! If you're not into sewing or knitting, perhaps you could nake green heart cakes or biscuits for your WI meeting and use that as a way to get people thinking about the 6 environment and having discussions.
