





THE SAMI

October the 10th marks 25 years since the Sami, the indigenous people of Norway, established their own national assembly, Samediggi (Sametinget). The 39 representatives to the Sami Parliament represent Sami across the nation. The Sami also have their own official flag. As an indigenous people, the Sami have the right to be consulted in matters that may affect them directly. In order to ensure that work on matters that may directly affect the Sami is carried out in a satisfactory manner, the Government and the Sami Parliament agree that consultations between State authorities and the Sami Parliament shall be con-



ducted in accordance to the annexed procedural guidelines. The Ministry of local government and modernization has the overall responsibility for the coordination of the State's Sami policy. The Ministry of Culture has the responsibility for the implementation of the gov -ernment's Sami policy relevant to their sectors.

Colors used are Prussian Blue, Yellow Ochre, English Red and green with details/ teardrops provided in white, red, yellow or green. Another signature of the style shows many ferns/leaves/petals painted with lots of teardrops along the vines.

Each ornament shows off the beauty of Norwegian heritage with a hand-created design by Shirley Evenstad, a Vesterheim Gold Medal winner, and is sure to be a welcome addition to your tree this Christmas.






