Eastlake Project Update

1. Stevens Boulevard - SR-91 to the Willoughby Border

The project was bid and let during the summer with expectation that work would begin early in the fall and be concluded this month. The project got underway as anticipated and the Contractor removed and replaced the entrance to Valley Parkway. Additionally, they installed new underdrains along the full length of Stevens within the project limits. At that time, it was anticipated that the Dominion East Ohio Gas Company would have completed work on their lines along Stevens, but that did not and still has not happened. Unfortunately, the previous precludes the roadway work from proceeding this year and it is now scheduled to resume next spring with a finish in early to mid-summer.

The schedule for resumption of work will depend on the weather, but based upon past years, a restart sometime in April is likely.

2. Stevens Boulevard - SR-91 to Lakeshore Boulevard

this year with an anticipated completion later this month. Circumstances occurring at the beginning of the project and throughout the construction put the work behind. Presently all work on the road from SR-91 to Willowick Drive will be completed in the next couple of weeks. As we are about to move into winter it was determined that for your safety and convenience and to assure quality construction that rebuilding the section of the road from Willowick Drive to Lakeshore Boulevard, should be postponed until the Spring of next year.

The schedule for resumption of work will depends on the weather, but based upon past years, a restart sometime in April is likely with a completion in early summer.

3. Green Drive

The County has let a contract to install a new waterline and appurtenances along the entire length of the road. Work is expected to begin in early January and take 1 to 1.5 months. Restoration will be done in the spring when weather permits. Typically, suitable restoration weather arrives sometime in May.

4. Galalina Phase 2

This project to install new storm sewers throughout the Galalina area recently got underway. The first stage of the project was to install piping to lower the ground water. The dewatering piping is currently in place along the entire length of Galalina, and also along portions of Forest, Wacoka, and River Drives. At such time as the water is lowered sufficiently, the excavation work can begin. Presently it is expected that such will occur sometime between next week and the beginning of December. The excavation and sewer work will first proceed along Galalina from Wacoka to River, then along Galalina from Wacoka to Forest. Once those areas are complete, work on the remainder streets will be undertaken. The sewer work is expected to continue into early summer followed by restoration of the roadways and then grass and landscaping. Work is expected to be fully complete in late August.

Weather has a significant impact on construction work and schedules and it can either help or hinder progress. Should anticipated schedules improve or slip significantly, further notices will be provided.

5. Site (1) Plymouth and Site

(7) Quentin - Storm Outfall and Revetment Work

The work on this contract is underway. Site 7 is substantially complete with the exception of final grading and restoration. Site 1 is nearing substantial completion with final earthwork and grading currently pending. Both sites will be completed by early December but final seeding and restoration work will be done next year, likely starting and concluding in May.

Willoway Beach Revetment and Galalina Dike Repair

Work on this contract to install a stone revetment and do grading at Willoway park is expected to start in the next few days, and with the exception of final restoration, will be done by the end of the year. Final restoration is anticipated to be completed in May of next year.

Similarly work to repair approximately 130' of failing dike section on Galalina just east of Wacoka is expected to begin shortly and be completed before years end.







Keep, Change, or Update Your Marketplace Plan

Time is running out for those with 2020 ACA Marketplace health insurance to renew, change, or update their plans for 2021. The Marketplace Open Enrollment Period ends Tuesday, December 15, 2020.

If you have a Marketplace plan, you should have already received two letters: one from your current insurance company and one from the Marketplace. Together they

- Your 2021 coverage status
- Which plan (if any) you will be enrolled in or matched with if you do not act by December 15,

- Any changes in your coverage and financial help
- Directions if you need to send the Marketplace any documents

If you have not received your insurance letter, contact your insurance company. If you have not received your Marketplace letter, contact the Marketplace Call Center.

No matter what plan you choose to enroll in, we urge you to update your Marketplace application with your expected income and household information and compare your current plan to

what is available for 2021.

We encourage you to do this comparison because new affordable plans may be available this year. Plans and prices change every year. Your situation may have changed too. You may find 2021 plans with coverage and features that better meet your needs, especially if you have had or expect income or household changes.

By updating your application, you are helping to make sure your 2021 financial help will be correct. Financial help is based on your expected income for 2021

(not 2020). If you do not update your income and household information, you could wind up paying more than you need to. If you do not renew or enroll in a plan by December 15, 2020, you may be automatically enrolled in the same or a similar plan, so you are covered on January 1, 2021.

Audubon Christmas Counters for Census

Blackbrook Audubon Society invites everyone to add to a century of science during the 121st annual Christmas Bird Count Saturday, December 26.

Blackbrook encourages anyone interested in birding to join the CBC in one of two ways: in the field or from the comfort of your own home. Everyone will bird safely following the current Covid-19 guidelines.

The object of the CBC is to count all the bird species and number of birds in a 15-mile diameter circle in one 24-hour period between December 14 and January 5. Anyone living within the circle can also report birds at their feeder.

To be assigned to a team covering a specific area on foot or in a vehicle, or to report backyard feeder counts, contact Dan Donaldson, the compiler for Blackbrook's circle, at danook057@yahoo. com. He will provide a data form for participants' checklists and details on how to join the virtual gathering later in the day, rather than the traditional lunch

at noon, where everyone can share stories of the day's census. Birders of all skill levels are welcome and no fee is required.

Blackbrook's CBC circle covers from Lost Nation Airport to Western Perry, Lake Erie down to Holden Arboretum and Big Creek Park in Geauga County.

Blackbrook Audubon's territory covers Ashtabula, Geauga and Lake counties. The Ashtabula CBC circle is centered east of Kingsville. Marc Hanneman compiles that count, which will be Saturday, January 2, 2021. Contact Marc at marchanneman@embarqmail. com to help with that count.

The CBC circle for Geauga County is centered west of Burton. Their count will also be January 2 and is compiled by Linda Gilbert, a naturalist with Geauga Park District. She can be reached at lgilbert@ geaugaparkdistrict.org.

Circles for the count stretch from Arctic Bay, Baffin Island in Canada to a NOAA research vessel in the Drake Passage at the southern-most tip of South America; as far west as Guam in the Pacific to the eastern tip of Brazil. Census takers in the NEO circles share the same mission and may count on the same day as birders in some of these far-off places.

The Christmas Bird Count is the longest-running community science project in North America and helps biologists monitor bird population trends. To me, it is like seeing a wild animal in a television documentary that loses its life innocently or driving by the remains of a dog that has been run over. It is not a part of my personal world yet it touches my heart with a very heavy sadness. We are conditioned as humans to associate the end of relationships and life as negative. I think it is partly because people fear change. When a situation changes the future appears uncertain; but the future is always uncertain. It is our illusion that it is not.

The real question is if there is really any difference between the beginning or the end other than one's perspective. Every beginning is the end of something and every end is the beginning of something. So which one is divorce? It's whatever the person going through it decides. So why does it matter what we think? It hurts. I'm angry. I hate. I'm alone. I'm afraid. I didn't do anything. It's not fair. He's evil. She's a He's a drunk. She won't stop using drugs. I hate my

(fill in the blank) life. What is the GD point. The point is when do you want to KNOW peace. Know as in "feel" as in "not to be in a constant state of turmoil and suffering." That is the whole point of this periodic 24 hour trek down the road of existence.

People do things that hurt other people. This is a fact of life. In this regard, if you believe in Karma things will work out. If you believe in justice they won't. If you believe that the system or the court will fix it-you will be disappointed. That is why negotiation and compromise between the divorcing parties is ALWAYS the best and least expensive way to resolve these situations. That is the process of dissolution and we will talk about that in another article. If you believe in revenge- you and your children will be hurt seriously. This is a guarantee. Your anguish will not be felt or considered by the object of your anger. That is a metaphysical reality. He or she is not thinking about you or the kids when their with the new squeeze in Aruba. They are not wallowing in remorse. Not then anyway. Trust me on this one.

Good and bad are equally useless concepts when it comes to evaluation of a person, place, situation or thing. I got the job (the girl, the guy, the promotion, the last one, the only one- fill in the blank.) You didn't. It is a "good" day for me. It is a "bad" day for you. The mouse ate the

spider who ate the fly. Their all hungry. They all want to survive. Which one is good? Which one is bad? It's the same with people. All reality is based upon perception.

I practice family law because I believe that divorce is the beginning of freedom AND the end of pain. To get to the point of seeking divorce either one or both people are usually in substantial pain. The purpose of an effective divorce attorney is to dissolve the marriage as painlessly, quickly and inexpensively as possible. It is also to help the client to learn how to develop tools (such as establishing credit, learning a vocation or career, obtaining child care and developing parenting skills) so that they will be able to live independently and successfully after the divorce is final. Some clients have been put down or abused for so long that they need to develop a sense of self worth and emotional and psychological stability and self confidence before they will know peace. The divorce attorney should be willing to assist these clients in finding affordable appropriate professional providers to help them achieve this. In many cases, the children need the same professional help. Sometimes the parties in a divorce become so embittered toward each other that they act in ways which are detrimental to the best interests of their children. Mostly, they have no idea that they may be causing unnecessary distress to their children. The attorney should be willing to help the parent identify and correct this type of behavior. He or she should be willing (even though it may invite hostility on the part of the client) to instruct the parent how to act appropriately and in the best interest of the children throughout the divorce process. In cases involving children the protection and fostering of their emotional and psychological development must be the primary focus. These are the ways by which an effective divorce attorney helps the client and the children to know peace.

Divorce is essentially a new beginning of life and the end of pain. The divorce attorney is the guide that moves the client down the path that leads to knowing peace of mind through independence and self sufficiency. The attorney is the mother bear who keeps the cubs safe and prepares them for life on their own.

Lake County Launches "Connections" to Combat Senior Loneliness

Lake County General Health District (LCGHD), in partnership with the Painesville Senior Center and We Thrive Together, both Lake County nonprofit organizations, is launching "Connections" as part of the Motivate Lake County (MLC) wellness initiative. A virtual senior engagement platform consisting of free online events, including discussion groups, classes, games, exercise relaxation virtual sessions, trips, presentations, and support

groups, "Connections" can be accessed by any internet-ready device or telephone, and aims to keep seniors engaged with their peers during a time with limited social engagement, as prompted the current COVID-19 pandemic.

"While LCGHD stands by our recommendation that Lake County senior centers remain closed until January 1, 2021 due to the spread of COVID-19, we can't stand by without addressing the escalation in social isolation and loneliness among seniors' stated Health Commissioner Ron Graham. "Fortunately, we already had the MLC platform in place, and were able to leverage this technology to meet the needs of our senior residents". 
