Holy Communion

Holy Communion will be celebrated: Sunday, October 2, at 10:45 and on November 6, at 10:45 in the sanctuary. The Consistory is recommending two changes to The CONSTITUTION and BY-LAWS of ZION REFORMED CHURCH.

1ST is in ARTICLE V-Officers (a change would be made reducing the Elders from 5 to 4 and reducing the Deacons from 9 to 6. We just don't have the membership to support this large of consistory.

ARTICLE V-Officers

Sec. 1. The officers of the association shall consist of a Pastor, a President, a Vice President, a Secretary, one or more Financial Secretaries, a Treasurer, Assistant Treasurer, five (**reduce to 4**), nine Deacons (**reduce to 6**), which Elders and Deacons shall also be a Board of Trustees, and such other officers as the Consistory may appoint.

The second is an addition of a Bookkeeper listed under 18c. We have had one for years but never put it in the BY-LAWS

18 c Bookkeeper

The Consistory shall approve a professional Bookkeeper and review funding for the position annually. The Consistory will have the total charge of hiring and firing the person or agency used.

The Bookkeeper's duties will include:

Reviewing and calculating the church secretary's timesheet, printing out all bank statements, reviewing calculations and entering deposits from weekly deposit report sheets into QuickBooks for General Checking, Improvement checking, and Improvement Checking from check register spreadsheets provided by the church secretary.

Page 2 of the Constitution and Bi-Laws

They will also reconcile all bank statements including entering monthly interest received for all savings accounts, prepare payroll for all church staff, and make monthly electronic payment for PA State employee withholding.

Creating account reports for the monthly Consistory meeting.

Updating the Budget Report for the monthly Consistory meeting.

Completing the Year End Audit for the Harford Insurance.

Preparing and submit Quarterly Payroll Taxes. (Federal, State and Local)

Prepare and submit Year End Payroll Taxes. (Federal, State, and Local)

Prepare and submit 1099s for contract work completed by vendors and worship substitutes.

Read and review all payroll updates in QuickBooks for any impacts to church employees.
