EVENTS LEADING UP TO THE CATHOLIC CHURCH IN SAINT GEORGE

Part II

One of the most important names in Utah Catholic history is that of Irish born Reverend Lawrence Scanlan. Father Scanlan, came to America as a missionary to the western United States and eventually arrived in Salt Lake City (SLC) on August 14, 1873. At the time SLC did not have a priest even though the parish was the largest in the country at that time encompassing 85,000 square miles. However, of the 800 Catholics in the parish only ninety lived in SLC.

In Fr. Scanlan's travels to reach members of the Catholic faith, he visited Silver Reef, a mining town founded in 1875 located near the Mormon town of Saint George. Finding a rich harvest for a new mission, he immediately set out building a church to serve the miners and other residents. As mining became more intense in the area, people of different nationalities flocked into the area. Silver Reef became a boomtown almost overnight and became the largest town in Washington County although very little of it remains today.

Eventually a question arose among many in the community, why shouldn't Silver Reef be designated as the county seat rather than the sleepy little hobble of Saint George? Silver Reef was predominately "Gentile" and could easily outvote the county's Mormon population.

However, Erastus Snow an early area settler and senior member of the LDS church changed the county line so that the center of county government would remain in Saint George.
