John 6:1-15



"Jesus went across the Sea of Galilee. A large crowd followed him, because they saw the signs he was performing on the sick. Jesus went up on the mountain, and there he sat down with his disciples. The Jewish feast of Passover was near. When Jesus raised his eyes and saw that a large crowd was coming to him, he said to Philip, "Where can we buy enough food for them to eat?" He said this to test him, because he himself knew what he was going to do. Philip answered him, "Two hundred days' wages worth of food would not be enough for each of them to have a little." One of his disciples, Andrew, the brother of Simon Peter, said to him, "There is a boy here who has five barley loaves and two fish; but what good are these for so many?" Jesus said, "Have the people recline." Now there was a great deal of grass in that place. So the men reclined, about five thousand in number. Then Jesus took the loaves, gave thanks, and distributed them to those who were reclining, and also as much of the fish as they wanted. When they had had their fill, he said to his disciples, "Gather the fragments left over, so that nothing will be wasted." So they collected them, and filled twelve wicker baskets with fragments from the five barley loaves that had been more than they could eat. When the people saw the sign he had done, they said, "This is truly the Prophet, the one who is to come into the world." Since Jesus knew that they were going to come and carry him off to make him king, he withdrew again to the mountain alone."

Pastor's Study **Desk Notes**



Dear St Anthony & St Pius Families,

17th Sunday Ordinary Year B

John? I thought we were in Year B, Year of Mark with our Sunday reading cycle in the Church? Yes, we are in Mark's year but this Sunday and the following next four, we supplement Mark's set of readings with the 'Bread of Life Discourses' from John's gospel! Why? Well, the short answer (really) is that since Mark's gospel is the shortest, he needs a little more material to get across the finish line of the full 34 weeks of Ordinary Time (the 34 weeks of ordinary time added to the 18 weeks of the seasons of Advent, Christmas, Lent & Easter add up to the full year's 52 weeks!) But isn't anytime, a good time to reflect upon what the Holy Eucharist means to us Catholics? Eucharistic teaching is always on time, because we always need to deepen our understanding of this central teaching of Jesus. We often hear how the Holy Eucharist is the 'Source and Summit' of our Faith: it is our 'Beginning and End' (Catechism #1324). So, this five-week meditation with John's Gospel is a timely gift to remind us of how God faithfully feeds us with Jesus as our soul's food and drink.

So, this Sunday and the next four, we will be reading continuously all the way through the sixth chapter of John's gospel: Jesus' Eucharistic Teaching of His Real Presence (Body & Blood) in the Mass. John 6 is Eucharistic through and through. What Jesus instituted ceremoniously at the Last Supper, He explains in thorough detail in John chapter 6. In those other gospel accounts of the Last Supper, (St Paul testifies to it also) Jesus commands us to follow His pattern of prayer. He clearly institutes the Holy Eucharist as the pre-eminent form of Christian Prayer when He says "Do this in memory of me" (Luke 22:19 & 1 Cor 11:24). There Jesus prays through a revelation of His 'actual presence' among us, when He Himself says, "This is My Body-given for you" He says "IS" (Lk 22:19, Mt 26:26, Mk 14:22 & 1 Cor 11:24)! And then in John 6:55 we find that Jesus repeats such teaching by affirming that "My flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink." Again, Jesus is so clear about His abiding presence among us as sacramental food and drink-the Holy Eucharist! We will focus more on 6:55 specifically in a couple weeks, but Jesus is assuring us that we experience 'communion' with Him by sharing in His Body and Blood.

Of course, who can explain it? We are not alone in asking such a question? Notice that in John 6:52, people right there with Him, quarreled with His words, asking, "How can this man give us [his] flesh to eat?" (& John 6:60 says they responded "Who can accept it?). So yes, there is an element of faith that predisposes us to accept Jesus words. While we may not be able to explain the mechanics of just how Jesus continues to feed us with His very Body and Blood, St Paul reminds us in 2 Corinthians 5:7 that "We walk by faith, not by sight." We may not 'see' this physically, but we know and experience this union with Him, through its fruits. Basically, many people respond, "Jesus said it, and I believe it!" Also, I remember that this is the same Jesus who could transform common water into exquisite wine, calm the seas and even resurrect the dead, so how can I question that HE could 'nourish my soul with His Body and Blood'? What is the greater miracle, that Jesus could 'make bread' (to feed 5,000) or that He could 'become bread' for us all? St Thomas Aguinas composed several Eucharistic Hymns (often used with Adoration) that best describe the act of faith that affirms Christ's Real Presence in the Eucharist. From his Latin Hymn, "Tantum Ergo" comes the lines, "Faith for all defects supplying, Where the feeble senses fail" which captures the sense of our hearts knowing what our outward senses cannot register. Or his Hymn "Adoro Te Devote", has even more descriptive lines, "Sight, touch, and taste in Thee are each deceived; The ear alone most safely is believed: I believe all the Son of God has spoken, Than Truth's own word there is no truer token". Again, basically St Thomas is saying, "We trust His Word -- Jesus said it ('IS my Body') and I believe it"! But we have these five weeks to listen to Jesus' words to have our Eucharistic belief strengthened!

I love how Jesus goes into depth about His Eucharistic Presence, on the occasion of His miraculous feeding of over 5,000 people (with 12 baskets of leftovers remaining!). Talk about a 'starter'! Jesus provides it with this miraculous multiplication of loaves and fishes. So, I look forward to us having our faith in His 'Presence' grow over the next few weeks! Peace. Fr Brian
