 Equally owned by Orillia Power Corporation and Shaman Power Corporation

- Team members of Orillia Power and Shaman Power have worked together for many years and have developed similar projects
- Bawitik is presently involved in consultations with First Nations







• Originally formed over 100 years ago as Orillia Water, Light and Power Commission

- Orillia Power Corporation and two subsidiaries (generation & distribution) formed in 2000 as a result of the Ontario Electricity Act
- 100% Owned by the City of Orillia
- Operating Generation Assets:
 - Swift Rapids GS, 8 MW
 - Minden GS, 4 MW
 - Matthias GS, 3 MW
 - 4 Solar Rooftop sites, 1 MW





Shaman Power Corporation

• Private power producer operating in Southern Ontario

- Operating generating assets:
 - Fenelon Falls GS, 2.6 MW
 - Marmara GS, 1.0 MW
 - Currently developing Elora GS, 1.0 MW





Large Renewable Procurement


- Directive from Minister of Energy to IESO to obtain 75 MW of green energy from water power
- LRP is an IESO Process responding to this Directive resulting in the award of Power Purchase Agreements
- Competitive in nature:
 - First round, Prequalification (Bawitik 1 of 6)
 - Second Round site specific Sept 1 submission
- Water rights for Trent-Severn Waterway secured through Parks Canada under the Dominion Waterpower Act.
 - Bawitik has secured required Survey Permits for both sites from Parks Canada.





Locks 25 Generating Station

- Project located within Selwyn Township
- 3 MW (enough power for about 1,000 to 1,200 homes)
- Intake above dam at Lock 25
- Powerhouse and bypass gate in line with dam,
- Tailrace directs flow back into the Otonabee River directly below the dam







Locks 24 Generating Station

- Project located within Selwyn and Douro-Dummer Townships
- 3.5 MW (enough power for about 1,200 to 1,500 homes)
- Intake above dam at Lock 24
- Powerhouse and bypass gate in line with dam,
- Tailrace directs flow back into the Otonabee River directly below the dam
- Access will be either to the west through private property to Sixth Line, if a deal can be reached, or to the east, connecting to County Road 32 (Water Street).







Benefits to the Community

- Water rentals to Parks Canada
- Part of Gross Revenue Charge is returned to communities in form of payments in lieu of taxes
- 50 construction jobs for each project over a duration of 1 to 1.5 years
- One full time operator for two plants
- On-going use of local trades and suppliers for plant maintenance
- Municipal Agreement proposed providing on-going cash flow to Selwyn Township



Public Consultation

- Notification to land owners close to project
- Meetings with abutting land owners where available
- Public Meeting July 29th First of many public meeting required through several processes
- Meeting very well received 50 attendees majority felt that their questions were answered
- Consultation with local community will be on-going if successful

Environmental Assessments

- Class Environmental Assessment for Waterpower:
 - To commence after receipt of Power Purchase Agreement
 - Rigorous process under Ministry of Environment & Climate Change, and Environmental Assessment Act

- Typically a 2 year process
- Detailed agency, public and aboriginal consultations
- Scientific and cultural heritage studies to determine potential effects
- Detailed Project Approvals
