Dear Parents/Guardians,










Academics

• <u>Plan for Growth and Improvement - ACTION PLANS</u>: Once the objectives have been approved, the Action Plan Teams will actively begin creating the seven-year plans. In the meantime, they have already begun the discussion concerning the formation of the plans.

What we are in the process of completing. . .

- <u>Preparation of Supporting Documentation</u>: Now that the report has been finalized and sent to the members of the Middle States Visiting Team, we are collecting all of the supporting documentation for them to review during their time here next month.
- <u>Hospitality Preparations</u>: The Hospitality Committee has been formed and is meeting to arrange the opening reception and make sure that our guests are comfortable and well nourished during their time with us.
- <u>Schedules for the Visit</u>: The Visiting Team will be here from Tuesday, November 15th until Friday, November 18th. During this time, the Team members will hold interviews with students, teachers, parents, clergy, staff, and other school community members. They will also be visiting classrooms and engrossing themselves in the daily routine of our school. These schedules are in the process of being finalized.


